Over the past century, the following symbols have become an integral part of our national identity through common use and collective pride, with most having been formally adopted by the Government of Canada as official symbols of our country.

#### 50th Anniversary of the Beaver as a Canadian Symbol

The beaver is a herbivorous mammal that makes its home in semi-aquatic environments throughout every region in Canada, especially near waterways, lakes, and ponds. It became an official symbol of Canada on March 24, 1975, when the National Symbol Canada Act received royal assent. This law aimed to showcase the beaver (castor canadensis) as one of the symbols of Canadian sovereignty.

The beaver had already been a part of Canadian identity before the Act was adopted. For example, in 1851 the beaver was featured prominently on Canada's first postage stamp. It was also seen on the totem poles of First Nations on the Pacific



coast. In fact, the beaver was the first universally popular symbol of Canada, even before the maple leaf.

Long before the arrival of European settlers, Indigenous peoples recognized the importance and value of the beaver. Its fur was used to make clothing and its bones were used to make a variety of tools. Its nutritious meat also made it a valuable food source. Furthermore, a substance secreted by its glands served as excellent bait for other carnivorous species.

Despite these qualities, the reason the beaver became an official symbol of Canada is first and foremost the central role it played in the fur trade that stretched from the 17th to the middle of the 19th century. This period saw a heavy demand for beaver pelts, which were especially important in the manufacture of the waterproof felt hats that were very popular in Europe at the time. The beaver's presence in North America represented a substantial commercial opportunity for Europeans and motivated the exploration and colonization that marked the history of Canada.

While the fur trade played an important role in Canada's history, it was also responsible for the near extinction of the beaver as a species. Towards the middle of the 19th century, the beaver had almost disappeared from the Canadian landscape. Measures were put in place to protect it and, consequently, its populations have recovered throughout the country.

# Ontario Supporting Cultural Tourism in The Blue Mountains

## Know Where You Are: Respect the Rules Regarding Illegal Motorized Vehicle Use On Conservation and County Lands











Imagine asking your neighbour if you can ride your ATV across their property and then ignoring their answer. Would you? Most people wouldn't. So why is it different when it comes to County and Conservation Authority land?

Bruce County, Grey County, Grey Sauble Conservation Authority, and Saugeen Valley Conservation Authority are coming together to call for greater respect for trails, beaches, forests, and conservation lands. Illegal motorized vehicle use continues to cause damage, disrupt natural habitats, and divert critical funding away from recreational improvements.

Unauthorized use of ATVs, dirt bikes, trucks, and even golf carts is creating lasting damage on County and Conservation Authority lands. Deep ruts, eroded slopes, and crushed vegetation are not just unsightly, they impact ecosystems, destroy habitats, spread invasive species, and jeopardize the future of our natural spaces.

#### Every Dollar Spent on Repairs is a Dollar Not Spent on Recreation

Funds meant for trail maintenance, accessibility improvements, and new recreational opportunities are being swallowed up by costly repairs. When riders damage these lands, the cost of restoring them is left to municipalities, counties and conservation authorities, pulling resources away from enhancements that benefit all users.

#### **Respecting Land, Respecting Community**

Before hitting the trails, riders must "Know Where You Are." Counties and Conservation Authorities have clear rules to protect these spaces. If an area is not explicitly designated for motorized vehicle use, it is off-limits. No county or conservation lands allow for unauthorized offroad motorized vehicles.

"Most people would never assume they have the right to drive through a neighbour's yard without permission. That same courtesy needs to extend to the shared lands we all enjoy. Respect these unique and beautiful spaces; stay out." Donna Lacey, Manager of Forestry and Lands, Saugeen Valley Conservation Authority

#### **Enforcement is Increasing**

To protect public lands, enforcement efforts are ramping up in 2025. Riders caught operating motorized vehicles illegally may face fines, impoundment, or charges under municipal bylaws and provincial regulations.

By working together, Bruce County, Grey County, Grey Sauble Conservation Authority, and Saugeen Valley Conservation Authority are committed to keeping lands safe and open for all. But it starts with respect. Know where you are. Respect the land. Ride responsibly.

## GBPH Advising Public of Possible Measles Exposure Location in Grey-Bruce

Grey Bruce Public Health is advising the community of a potential measles exposure location, identified during a contact-tracing investigation into a laboratory-confirmed case of measles in a Grey-Bruce resident.

The case, whose vaccination status is unknown, attended the emergency department at Brightshores Health System's Owen Sound Hospital at 9:30 p.m. on Wed., April 2, 2025. The case remained at the hospital until about 6:30 a.m. on Thurs., April 3, 2025.

Grey Bruce Public Health and Brightshores Health System contacted all registered patients who were at the emergency department within the exposure window. However, individuals who were not registered, but were in the emergency department during this exposure window may not have been identified and contacted. Anyone who was present in the emergency department within the exposure window is advised to do the following:

- Confirm vaccination status. Ensure all individuals in the household are up to date on measles vaccination. In general, those born before 1970 are considered immune against measles. Two doses of a measles-containing vaccine are recommended for anyone born after 1970. If unsure of vaccination status, individuals should check with their healthcare provider or ICON.
- If not protected against measles, individuals should contact their healthcare provider or Public Health to receive post-exposure treatment, if it's been six days or less since exposure, or to receive a measles-containing vaccine for lifelong protection.
- Monitor for measles symptoms, which generally start 7 to 21 days after exposure. Symptoms can include high fever, cold-like symptoms (cough/runny nose), sore eyes, and sensitivity to light. About three to seven days after symptoms begin, a rash typically appears. The rash looks like red spots and blotchy patches that start on the face then spread down the body, arms and legs.

If an individual develops measles symptoms, they should immediately isolate at home and call a healthcare provider. Household members who are not immune to measles should also stay home during this period and consult with public health. If medical care is required, call ahead to a healthcare facility before arriving in-person, so the facility can take precautions to prevent the virus from spreading to others.

Ontario is currently experiencing a multi-jurisdictional measles outbreak. As of April 2, 661 measles cases have been reported in 13 Public Health Unit areas. About 95% of the cases did not have immunity to measles or had unknown vaccination status. The latest Grey-Bruce case is believed to be linked to travel outside of the area.

Measles can spread easily when an infected person coughs, talks, or sneezes, and another person breathes in virus particles. People with measles can be infectious from four days before to four days after the rash begins.

Vaccination is the best defence against measles. The efficacy of a single dose of a measles-containing vaccine is estimated to be 85% to 95%. With a second dose, efficacy is almost 100%.

As part of Ontario's publicly funded vaccine schedule, babies should receive a measles vaccine at one year of age and children should receive a second dose ages 4 and 6.

Vaccination is also publicly funded for adults if they have never had measles or been vaccinated.

Adults born before 1970 are generally presumed to have acquired natural immunity to measles; however, susceptible healthcare workers, travellers to places outside Canada, and military personnel should receive a measles vaccine, regardless of birth year.

Infants aged six to 11 months, children aged one to four years, and adults aged 18 or older, born on or after 1970, may be eligible to receive an additional dose of a measles-containing vaccine if they live or will be travelling to an area experiencing a measles outbreak.

Most people who contract measles recover without treatment in two to three weeks, but the virus can be more severe for infants, pregnant women, and those with compromised immune systems. Measles may cause complications, such as pneumonia, brain swelling (encephalitis), or seizures, and, in rare cases, death.

From October 18, 2024 to April 2, 2025, Ontario has reported a total of 661 measles cases (540 confirmed, 121 probable) associated with this outbreak

## **Today in history:**

What memorable events happened on April 9 in history? **2021** - The Duke of Edinburgh, Prince Philip, died at age 99.
Strangely enough, he died on the 99th day of the year, on the morning of the 9th day of the month.

**2019** - Dutch ecologists reported that wolves were living in the Netherlands again for the first time in 140 years.

**2003** - US forces pulled down a statue of Saddam Hussein in Baghdad to symbolize the end of the Iraqi president's brutal reign.

**2002** - Great Britain held The Queen Mother's funeral in London, England. The funeral was at Westminster Abbey, UK. The Queen Mother passed away at 101 years old on March 30, 2002.

**1991** - The Republic of Georgia declared its independence from the Soviet Union.

**1963** - President John F. Kennedy granted Winston Churchill the first-ever honorary US citizenship.

**1960** - NASA publicly announced the names of the first 7 American astronauts. Gordon Cooper, Deke Slayton, John Glenn, Gus Grissom, Scott Carpenter, Wally Schirra, and Alan Shepard were dubbed the Mercury Seven as they were selected for NASA's Mercury space program.

**1945** - The 'National Football League' announced on this day that socks were now a mandatory part of the uniform for all football players. Ever since then, no game has been played without this garment.

**1940** - Nazi Germany invaded and attacked Denmark. The battle lasted six hours, by which point Denmark surrendered.

1917 - The Battle of Vimy Ridge, fought from April 9 to 12, 1917, was a pivotal First World War battle where the Canadian Corps, for the first time as a unified formation, captured the heavily fortified Vimy Ridge in northern France, resulting in a significant victory but at a heavy cost.

**1869** - The Hudson Bay Company gave up its territory to the Commonwealth of Canada.


