Town Partners with peopleCare to Deliver Much-Needed Long-Term Care

The Town of The Blue Mountains is pleased to announce a significant partnership with peopleCare Communities to enable the development of a new long-term care (LTC) home in the Craigleith area on a section of the former Tee's Please property. This collaboration is a positive step towards fulfilling the community's long-standing need for increased access to LTC to meet the needs of local seniors and their families.

Through the partnership, peopleCare will purchase three acres of the 18-acre Town-owned land to build the new LTC home, which will provide care and services for up to 192 people.

The new LTC home will ease waitlist pressures on existing LTC homes in the area and lessen the burden on local hospitals for those who need acute care. In addition, the new LTC home will create jobs providing an economic boost and benefit to the local economy and will provide opportunities for innovative community partnerships to enhance senior care, programs and related services.

From Canada Post

After several days of discussions without meaningful progress, Canada Post has informed the Canadian Union of Postal Workers (CUPW) that a temporary pause in discussions is necessary. This pause will allow Canada Post to focus on preparing comprehensive proposals aimed at moving discussions forward constructively. Negotiations resumed at the end of April after breaking off in March. While CUPW requested that both parties return to the table with the assistance of a mediator, the union has either held or hardened its previous positions on key issues, leaving little room for progress.

With collective agreements for CUPW-represented employees extended until May 22, 2025, we understand that our employees and the people we serve are counting on both parties to find a resolution and avoid further labour disruption. Canada Post has therefore advised CUPW that it will use this pause to prepare proposals designed to help advance negotiations and achieve a much-needed resolution. Any offers we bring forward will reflect the Corporation's current realities.

We recognize the significant challenges facing the Corporation and remain committed to adapting to the evolving needs of Canadians. At the same time, we are focused on protecting and enhancing the wages and benefits that are important to our people. We had hoped a new collective agreement would be reached by this point, but without new agreements, there is a possibility of a labour disruption on or after May 22.

a long-standing community priority as ranked in the 2022 and 2024 Resident Satisfaction Surveys. Recognizing the strategic value of the property, locating the new LTC home on the former Tee's Please property is complementary to other potential future uses and recreation amenities that can help build a complete community in the Craigleith area.

This project has been made possible through Council's commitment to work with peopleCare to identify potential sites and paths forward to build a LTC home. The Town is committed to ensuring full transparency through the land sale and planning process for this development.

The conditional purchase and sale agreement is being targeted for an open session of Council in June 2025. After the land sale is finalized, peopleCare will submit a planning application and undertake the planning process, which includes amendments to the Official Plan and Zoning By-law, and opportunities for public engagement through open house meetings and a formal public meeting. Once these public processes are concluded, the home will be subject to Site Plan Control before a building permit is issued.

Penalties for Non-Compliance with Lobbyist Registry Now in Effect

The Town of The Blue Mountains would like to advise members of the public that enforcement of penalties for undisclosed lobbying activities and non-compliance with the Town's Lobbyist Registry come into effect on Monday, May 12, 2025.

The Lobbyist Registry fosters accountability and transparency by publicly listing the names of lobbyists, their affiliations, lobbying objectives, and the Town officials lobbied. Lobbyists must register within ten days following any interaction with a public official. Following initial approval, a six-month grace period from penalties was extended to enable Council, staff and the public to familiarize themselves with the new process. Now that the grace period has expired, penalties will be enforced as follows:

- A 30-day ban on communication with public office holders on the first violation
- A 60-day ban on communication with public office holders on the second violation

Further sanctions as determined by the Lobbyist Registrar for the third and any subsequent violations

The Town has created a dedicated web page to house the Lobbyist Registry. It includes a set of frequently asked questions to provide additional information, including who is considered a lobbyist, what activities are considered lobbying, how to register and how to report lobbying activities.

Ontario Greens and MPP Bobbi Ann Brady to Table Legislation on The Creation of a "Foodbelt"

On May 6th, Ontario Greens Leader Mike Schreiner and Haldimand-Norfolk independent MPP Bobbi Ann Brady were joined by representatives from the Ontario Federation of Agriculture and the National Farmers Union, Ontario to announce their intention to introduce legislation to protect Ontario's farmland through the creation of a "Foodbelt".

"Ontario loses the equivalent of nine family farms each week to urban sprawl, aggregate mining, and expensive highways like highway 413. We simply can't afford to lose any more" said Schreiner. "In the face of global trade instability, we must tariff-proof our economy. That starts with protecting Ontario's farmland to defend our food sovereignty, our food and farming economy and our future so we can feed ourselves."

Schreiner highlighted that Ontario's agriculture sector contributes over \$50 billion to the provincial economy, and employs over 875,000 people – one in nine Ontarians. "Doug Ford is paving over our future, but the Ontario Greens are committed to working across party lines to protect it. That's why we are proud to stand alongside MPP Brady to introduce this legislation."

"Farmland needs to be protected. For many reasons but mainly because we can't make more land. Ontario loses nearly 320 acres of farmland each day," said MPP Brady. "To feed ourselves we must cease and desist this constant subtraction of arable land. I've been loud and clear on this for years now. When in 2023, I launched Bill 62, The Farmland and Arable Land Strategy Act, The PC government voted against it. Unlike PC government MPPs, I can support any good idea from any party. And the Green Party has a good idea in its Farmland Bill and I'm proud to team up with them and protect Ontario's farmland."

If passed, the joint bill from Schreiner and Brady will establish a task force of farmers, agricultural experts, and land-use planners to develop recommendations for a strong Foodbelt Protection Plan. The resulting report would address key priorities such as reducing land speculation, improving soil health and protecting and enhancing farmland that is used for a variety of purposes.

"Now is the time to protect our farmland, support our farmers, and grow more food right here at home," Schreiner concluded.

Babies, Children Under 5 Can Now Receive Measles Vaccines Earlier In Grey-Bruce

Ontario's Chief Medical Officer of Health is recommending families in western Ontario, including in Grey-Bruce, seek earlier measles vaccination for babies and children under five as the area continues to record cases of the airborne virus.

The Ontario Ministry of Health has expanded the eligibility criteria for the measles vaccine based on the increased risk of measles exposure in western Ontario.

While Ontario's publicly funded vaccine schedule recommends children receive a first dose of a measles-containing vaccine at one year of age and a second dose between ages four and six, the Ministry of Health now recommends the following for children who reside in or visit areas, such as Grey-Bruce, with higher measles exposure risk:

Infants (age 6-11 months): Should receive one dose of the measles, mumps, rubella (MMR) vaccine. These children will still have to receive two additional doses of the vaccine after they turn one

Children (age 1-4 years): Children who have received their first dose of the MMR vaccine are encouraged to receive a second dose as soon as possible (at a minimum of four weeks from the first dose).

In addition, the Ministry of Health recommends that all adults (age 18 and up) born on or after 1970 ensure they have received a second dose of a measles-containing vaccine.

The risk of acquiring measles in Grey-Bruce remains very low for people who are fully immunized and those considered immune to the virus, specifically those born in or before 1970.

However, the virus does spread easily between individuals who have not been immunized or are not immune.

One dose of a measles-containing vaccine is about 85% to 95% effective at preventing measles. With two doses, efficacy rises to nearly 100%.

Forty confirmed or probable measles cases have been reported in Grey-Bruce since a multi-jurisdictional measles outbreak began in Ontario in October 2024. Thirty-two of the cases were reported in

Nearly all of the local cases were unvaccinated.



Grey County Long-Term Care Receives Workplace Quality Award From Advantage Ontario

Grey County has been recognized by AdvantAge Ontario with the Innovation and Excellence Workplace Quality award for the Long-Term Care Colour It Coach program. This award recognizes practical and creative programs or strategies that foster workplace excellence. Grey County was presented with the award on May 2 at the AdvantAge Ontario Convention in Toronto.

The Colour It Coach program provides support and mentorship to students and staff who are new to healthcare roles. Coaches in Grey County's three long-term care homes (Grey Gables, Lee Manor and Rockwood Terrace) help to improve the experience of staff and students during placements. This helps students learn with confidence and in turn improves the quality of care within the homes. The program has also proven to support both the recruitment and retention of staff and helps foster a positive and collaborative workplace culture.

"Grey County is committed to building a safe, vibrant workplace where staff have the tools, support and trust they need to provide the very best care and teach the next generation of caregivers," said Grey County Director of Long-Term Care, Jennifer Cornell. "I'm so proud of the work we have done to champion resident-led care, and of all of our coaches who have enthusiastically embraced the program."

Grey County has built a relationship with Georgian College Owen Sound and many other educational institutions to connect students enrolled in the Personal Support Worker program with placement opportunities in Grey County homes. In 2024, more than 250 clinical placements were supported. Thirty-five students who participated in the Colour It Coach program have successfully onboarded as team members in Grey County's long-term care homes. More than 90% of students rated their experience as excellent.

"Supporting and mentoring students in our long-term care homes is great for our services and for the community at large," said Grey County Warden Andrea Matrosovs. "We are encouraging young people to stay in our communities and showing them first-hand that they can have a rewarding career in healthcare. As a former teacher, I couldn't be prouder of the successes the Colour It Coach program has achieved."





Notice of Watering Restrictions

June 1, 2025 - September 1, 2025

The Town of The Blue Mountains would like to remind residents that Watering Restrictions are implemented annually from June 1 to September 1.

Stage 1 Water Use Restriction

- Residents may water between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 9:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. and 9:00 p.m.
- Properties with odd numbered addresses can water on odd numbered calendar days
- Properties with even numbered addresses can water on even numbered calendar days

Lawn Watering and Tips to Conserve Water

Water only when necessary and according to the Town's Water Use Restriction guidelines.

A brown lawn doesn't always indicate a dead lawn. Brown lawns can recover their green colour after rainfall or cooler weather.

- Avoid frequent watering. Watering too often can cause your turf to develop shallow roots
- Promote a healthy lawn by aerating and mowing no shorter than 7.5cm
- If most of the lawn looks green, only water the dry spots
- When reseeding or planting, consider drought-resistant grasses, which are often more resistant to insects and disease
- Use a rain barrel
- Program irrigation systems to water deeply but infrequently and within Water Use Restriction guidelines
- · Leave grass clippings on your lawn after mowing
- Check for leaks in your garden hose






