
New Magic of Children in the Arts Exhibit arrives at The Gallery at L.E. Shore in Stunning Colour

Craigleith Community Park and Moreau Park Revitalization

The Town of The Blue Mountains is excited to announce that



Colliers Project Leaders has been contracted to manage two major community parks projects – the revitalization of Moreau Park in Thornbury, and the development of the new Craigleith Community Park. Colliers will be working with staff to facilitate conceptual designs and preliminary budget for Moreau Park based on the results of the public survey that was completed in 2023. Construction on Moreau Park is currently anticipated to begin in 2026, with completion in 2027. A preliminary budget has been approved. Once the design is completed, a final budget will be presented to Council based on the elements included.

Colliers will also lead the procurement of the design team for the Craigleith Community Park design process, ensuring that the results of the 2024 public survey are taken into consideration. Construction of the park is estimated to begin in 2026, in coordination with home construction on the Blue Vista site.

"We're excited to be taking the next steps in these projects," said the Town's Director of Community Services, Ryan Gibbons. "The community has shown a great amount of support and interest in these projects, and we want to keep that engagement and momentum going through the final design and construction process."

The public will have additional opportunities to provide feedback on the designs of both parks before they are finalized. To learn more about each project, and to subscribe for ongoing project updates, please visit the Town's dedicated project web pages:

Moreau Park Revitalization: The Thornbury-Clarksburg Rotary Club approached Town Council in September of 2022 with the concept of revitalizing Moreau Park in Thornbury under the theme, "Kindness at Play." The elements proposed by the Rotary Club included a new skate park for all ages and abilities, a year-round paved walking path, a sensory garden and an accessible playground. Council directed staff to include this project for consideration as an addition to the 2023 Town budget.

Craigleith Community Park: Over the past several years, the Town has strategically acquired six hectares of parkland in Craigleith from Windfall, Second Nature, and Blue Vista development sites. This land was gained through the parkland dedication included in each development agreement. The intent is to transform the land into a regional community park for all to enjoy.

Grey County Council Meeting May 22nd

County Council

CAO Randy Scherzer welcomed Deputy CAO Niall Lobley to his new role.

CAO Scherzer highlighted national Public Works Week and recognized Grey County Transportation Services staff for the important role they play maintaining roadways and keeping them safe. CAO Scherzer also acknowledged Paramedic Services Week and thanked Grey County Paramedic Services for their commitment to community care.

Council acknowledged Warden Andrea Matrosov's appointment to the board of the Great Lakes and St. Lawrence Cities Initiatives (GLSLCI). GLSLCI has 325 members in Canada, the United States, First Nations and Tribal Nations. Warden Matrosovs spoke to the recent annual general meeting she attended in Milwaukee. The initiative expressed opposition to the blanket tariffs enforced by the United States and reaffirmed support for water quality, water access and equity. This includes a commitment to upholding the Great Lakes–St. Lawrence River Basin Water Resources Compact and the banning of out of basin diversions.

Committee of the Whole

Director Spicer provided a summary of the May 13 Budget and Finance Committee meeting. At the meeting the committee heard a summary of the Transportation Services department's 10-year capital plan and details of how projects are considered. The committee also approved the audit service plan report.

Council approved an official plan amendment to redesignate lands for a development known as Thornbury Acres in the Town of The Blue Mountains. The lands will operate with a "Special Agricultural" designation to allow agricultural uses along with a residential farm co-operative.

Council appointed five members to the newly formed Joint Municipal Services Committee. This committee will explore which municipal services have the potential to be shared among two or more municipalities across Grey County.

Staff provided a summary of Bill 5, Protect Ontario by Unleashing our Economy Act, a newly proposed bill from the province which aims to protect Ontario's critical minerals and energy sector. Staff highlighted areas of potential concern that may impact municipalities. The commenting window was short and has closed.

Staff provided a summary of Bill 17, the Protect Ontario by Building Faster and Smarter Act. Staff shared concerns with some aspects of the Bill which will impact municipalities. The Bill is proposing changes that will affect several current acts, including The Development Charges Act, Building Code Act, Planning Act and more. Council discussed their concerns. Comments will be provided to the province by the June 11 deadline.

Grey County passed a motion to option back a portion of unused lands previously donated to Brightshores Health System (Markdale Hospital lands). Staff will negotiate an agreement with Grey Highlands to sell a portion of these lands to the municipality.

Council discussed potential delegation requests for the upcoming Association of Municipalities of Ontario Conference in August. Delegations are an opportunity for councils and staff to meet with ministers and their staff to discuss important issues. Grey County will request delegations for the following topics:

- Requesting continued funding for small business enterprise centres beyond March 31, 2026.
- Requesting sustainable funding and investment into rural colleges and universities.
- Requesting continued and permanent funding for community paramedicine beyond March 31, 2026, and requesting to simplify duplicate funding reporting. In addition, the delegation will also request an increase to paramedic services funding in line with inflationary increases.
- Requesting long-term care redevelopment projects already underway be eligible for the 2025 funding model. Also asking for clarity to be provided around the requirements for vulnerable sector checks.

South Georgian Bay Parkinson's Festival

On **Sunday, June 22nd, 2025**, Living Better with Parkinson's is hosting the third "South Georgian Bay Parkinson's Festival" at the Beaver Valley Community Centre in Thornbury, from 10a.m. – 2p.m.

The purpose of the day is to bring like-minded people from the South Georgian Bay region and beyond together who are interested in sharing stories, learning, and meeting new people connected to the Parkinson's community. This festival is the first of its kind supporting people living with Parkinson's Disease in south Georgian Bay. It is anticipated that people will come from around the region to participate in this inaugural event.

"On behalf of Living Better with Parkinson's and the South Georgian Bay community, we are delighted to once again host this important event" said C. Ian Ross – Board of Director's Chair. "LBWP prides itself on cultivating local partnerships to better support people living with Parkinson's Disease in this region. The festival will do just that along with attracting experts from other parts of Ontario. We are thrilled with the response and support to date and hope that event will become an annual event".

Living Better with Parkinson's – a grassroots organization committed to increasing the quality of life of people living with Parkinson's Disease and their caregivers in south Georgian Bay. Promoting daily physical activity, advocacy and education are the primary pillars ensuring that LBWP mission is achieved.

"We are delighted to announce that Dr. Anthony Lang - Professor and previous Director of the Division of Neurology at the University of Toronto – has agreed to deliver a keynote address at this year's festival", shares Catherine Smart, Executive Director of Living Better with Parkinson's. Dr. Lang holds the Jack Clark Chair for Parkinson's Disease Research and the Lily Safra Chair



in Movement Disorders. He is the Director of the Edmond J. Safra Program in Parkinson's Disease, the Rossy Progressive Supranuclear Palsy Program and the Morton and Gloria Shulman Movement Disorders Clinic, Toronto Western Hospital and the University of Toronto.

Over the next decade, 1.5% to 2% of the population over 60 years will live with Parkinson's Disease in North America. The South Georgian Bay (SGB) population is growing rapidly, and the demographics are aging as it attracts more residents to the area. In this decade, People with Parkinson's (PWP) in SGB are expected to double.




