More Than Trees: GSCA Helping Landowners Enhance Their Property and Leave a Legacy

Grey Sauble Conservation Authority (GSCA) is inviting local landowners to participate in its Tree Planting Program for spring 2026, an opportunity to transform unused land into thriving forests, enhance their property, and leave a green legacy for future generations.

Since 1984, GSCA has helped landowners plant millions of trees across Grey Bruce. Through this program, GSCA provides expert planning and planting services, helping landowners design and establish windbreaks, riparian buffers to improve water quality, and larger tree planting projects. Participants also gain access to financial support through Forests Canada's 50 Million Tree Program, with grants available to cover up to 90% of project costs.

The environmental benefits of planting trees are well known, including supporting biodiversity, capturing carbon, improving air and water quality, and reducing erosion. What landowners may not realize is that planting trees can also bring direct benefits to their property. Trees can enhance property, provide wind and noise barriers, reduce heating and cooling costs, boost crop yields, and create new recreational opportunities. Forests also play a vital role in helping communities adapt to and mitigate the impacts of climate change.

"Every tree planted is an investment in your land and in the future of our communities," says Michael Fry, Forestry Coordinator at GSCA. "Our full-service program makes it easy for landowners to plant trees that enhance their property, support local wildlife, and leave a greener legacy for generations to come."

Landowners with at least 0.4 hectares (1 acre) of open land, or 1,200 metres for windbreaks or riparian buffer planting, are eligible for grants. GSCA staff are encouraging interested landowners to get in touch now to begin planning their spring 2026 tree planting project.

Community Improvement Plan

The Fall 2025 intake period for applications to the Town's Community Improvement Plans is open from September 15, 2025, until October 17, 2025.

The Town has two Community Improvement Plans:

In 2021, the Town of The Blue Mountains developed two Community Improvement Plans to serve as a long-term strategy to revitalize the community, improve the quality of life of the community's residents, better utilize under-developed properties and promote private investment in land and buildings.

The Town Wide Revitalization Community Improvement Plan encourages private property improvement and revitalization.

The Housing Within Reach Community Improvement Plan facilitates the development of attainable housing.

Interested applicants are encouraged to arrange a pre-application consultation with Town Staff to discuss and confirm application requirements. Following the consultation, applicants must submit a completed application form, including supporting documentation for evaluation. Strategic Initiatives (519) 599-3131 ext. 269

Application Process

- Applicants are required to contact the CIP Administrator to arrange and participate in a pre-application consultation meeting with Town staff, in order to discuss and confirm application requirements, program eligibility, the proposed scope of work, project timing, supporting documentation requirements, etc.
- After the consultation, the applicant will be required to submit a completed application, which will include all of the application forms, in addition to any supporting documentation, as required by the Town.
- Once all the required forms and supporting materials are received, the Plan Administrator will undertake a preliminary screening of the proposal and application.
- Based on the application and proposal, the results of the preliminary screening, Town staff may perform an initial site visit and inspection of the building/property, as necessary.
- If the application clearly does not meet the program requirements, the application will not be accepted.
- If the application meets the program requirements, the application will be accepted. Acceptance does not guarantee financial incentive approval, only that it will be reviewed by Council or a delegated approval authority for final financial approval. www.thebluemountains.ca/CIP

Grey County To Celebrate Completion of New Durham Paramedic Base with Open House September 27

Grey County is proud to announce the completion of its new state-of-the-art paramedic base in Durham, marking a significant milestone in the County's commitment to enhancing emergency healthcare services for residents across the region.

The new \$2.4 million facility, constructed by Domm Construction Ltd., officially replaces the end-of-life paramedic base in Durham and addresses the growing service demands identified in Grey County's Paramedic Services Comprehensive Deployment Review 2023-2033

"This new paramedic base represents Grey County's unwavering commitment to the safety and wellbeing of our residents," said Grey County Chief Administrative Officer, Randy Scherzer. "Paramedics play a vital role in community healthcare, and this modern facility will enable them to provide even better emergency medical services to our communities."

The new facility sits beside the site of the new West Grey Police Services building off Chester Street and Grey Road 4. The proximity creates a centralized emergency services hub that will improve response times and coordination between services.

"With rising call volumes across our region, this new base positions us to maintain and improve our service levels," said Chief McNab, Paramedic Chief. "The modern design and strategic location will help our paramedics respond more efficiently to emergency calls throughout the coverage area."

The new base is a solar-ready net zero build and has been designed with energy efficiency at its core, aligning with Grey County's Climate Change Action Plan. The base design will be used again in future paramedic base builds, including Feversham beginning later this year, Ayton area in 2026, Thornbury in 2027, and Cobble Beach in 2028.

The project was funded through the Durham base reserve, land ambulance development charges, and a debenture. The County also invested \$150,000 to purchase the land from the Municipality of West Grey and contributed \$200,000 toward road and servicing infrastructure shared with the adjacent police facility.

Grey County invites the public to celebrate this achievement at a ribbon cutting ceremony and open house on Saturday, September 27 from 2:00 to 4:00 p.m. at the new Durham Paramedic Base, 451 Durham Road W., Durham. Official remarks will begin at 2:05 followed by facility tours and opportunities to meet paramedic staff.

The event offers community members a chance to tour the new facility, learn about paramedic services, and see firsthand how this investment will benefit emergency healthcare delivery in the region. Guests can also see vehicles and equipment up close to learn more about how paramedics deliver care in an emergency.

Administration for Grey County Paramedic Services is located at the Grev County Administrative building in Owen Sound, Grev County has 8 bases located strategically to optimize our resources and minimize response times. Bases are located in Owen Sound, Meaford, Markdale, Dundalk, Durham, Hanover, Craigleith, and Chatsworth. All bases are staffed 24 hours per day. Up to 13 ambulances and 1 first response unit are staffed during peak hours, with 8 ambulances being the minimum at night.

Two (2) Duty Supervisors are assigned during the day and 1 is assigned during the night to work in the field overseeing ambulance operations. For more information visit www.grey.ca.

Thornbury West Reconstruction Phase 1

Moorefield Excavating expects to complete installation of watermain, sanitary sewer and stormwater sewer on Elma Street by the end of this week. Concrete work is expected to continue next week with preparation for sidewalk, and curb layouts being completed on Alice Street and on the remainder of Elma Street. Asphalt installation is expected to follow in early to mid October.

New curb has been installed on Louisa Street. Sidewalks are up next!

The Thornbury West Phase 1 (originally Elma Street and Alice Street) engineering assignment began in 2019. There were delays with the pandemic and the scope of the work expanded to add Victoria Street and Louisa Street when the project name was changed to Thornbury West Phase 1.

As the design for Victoria Street developed, particularly regarding the storm sewer system, Beaver Street and a further section of Louisa Street were added to avoid constructing temporary storm sewer works that would need to be rebuilt in the future. The Beaver Street design sparked the idea of constructing parkettes on Beaver Street and the Louisa Street slopeand these were added to the project.

To improve pedestrian movement while Victoria Street and Beaver Street were under construction upgrades to Lansdowne Street were added to the scope of work.

Finally, the section of Elma Street between Arthur and Louisa Street was added to the scope of work.



Since the original scope of work has grown significantly since Tatham was awarded final design and project management of the Elma and Alice Street Reconstruction project, an increase in the engineering contract has been anticipated by staff for a couple of years. Staff asked Tatham to delay their request for an increase in their engineering contract budget through an engineering scope change until the remaining scope of work was clearer. With this increase in the value of the engineering contract the total engineering cost is still significantly less than the approved capital budget for engineering.

Staff received Council's approval to increase the value of the existing Thornbury West Phase 1 engineering value by \$266,000, increasing the value from \$1,334,000 to \$1,600,000.

The Thornbury West Reconstruction Phase 1A & 1B has an approved capital budget of \$18,854,400. Currently, actual expenditures total \$11,373,051, with committed costs of \$7,082,930; this includes a previously approved \$9,000 increase from Staff Report CSOPS.23.032 . Following the proposed increase to the engineering services agreement of \$270,682, which includes non-recoverable HST, the total combined actual and committed costs will amount to \$18,726,663. This leaves \$127,737 uncommitted in the project budget. In summary, the proposed increase can be accommodated within the current approved capital budget, meaning no additional funding is required.






