Town to Recognize National Day for Truth and Reconciliation on Tuesday, September 30

This joint media release is being shared on behalf of The Blue Mountains Public Library and the Town of The Blue Mountains.

The Town of The Blue Mountains would like to advise members of the public that Tuesday, September 30, 2025, will mark the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation and Orange Shirt Day. The Town and the Blue Mountains Public Library (BMPL) invite the community to take part in a series of events and learning opportunities in honour of

the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation. Together, we reflect on the impact of residential schools, listen to Indigenous voices and explore pathways towards truth, reconciliation and healing.

"The National Day for Truth and Reconciliation is a solemn reminder of the intergenerational impacts of the residential school system," said Mayor Andrea Matrosovs. "As a Town, we remain committed to taking action, listening to Indigenous voices, creating inclusive spaces and ensuring that our plans and strategies reflect the values of equity, respect and healing. We are on a learning journey. Each year, this day is a moment to pause and reflect on that journey and, with intention, take the next steps forward on the path to Truth and Reconciliation."

On **Friday, September 26, from 6:00 p.m. to 8:30 p.m.**, the BMPL will be hosting a free screening of Voices – Lighting a Pathway to Indigenous Inclusion. Produced by Muckpaloo Ipeelie, this powerful film explores how the past continues to shape the present through stories from Indigenous leaders and community members. Following the screening, Muckpaloo will share insights on Inuit culture and lead a discussion on themes of partnership, patience and common ground.

To honour this day, the Town will fly the Truth and Reconciliation flag from September 23 to October 1, with a formal proclamation ceremony taking place outside Town Hall on **September 30, at 9:00 a.m.** to recognize the victims and survivors of Residential Schools across Canada.

On **Tuesday, September 30, at 3:30 p.m.**, the BMPL invites community members aged 8+ to attend L.E. Shore Library to make orange scrunchies in honour of Orange Shirt Day. This activity reflects on the story of Phyllis Webstad and the many Indigenous children



Community Improvement Plan

The Fall 2025 intake period for applications to the Town's Community Improvement Plans is open from September 15, 2025, until October 17, 2025.

The Town has two Community Improvement Plans:

In 2021, the Town of The Blue Mountains developed two Community Improvement Plans to serve as a long-term strategy to revitalize the community, improve the quality of life of the community's residents, better utilize under-developed properties and promote private investment in land and buildings.

The Town Wide Revitalization Community Improvement Plan encourages private property improvement and revitalization.

The Housing Within Reach Community Improvement Plan facilitates the development of attainable housing.

Interested applicants are encouraged to arrange a pre-application consultation with Town Staff to discuss and confirm application requirements. Following the consultation, applicants must submit a completed application form, including supporting documentation for evaluation. Strategic Initiatives (519) 599-3131 ext. 269

Application Process

- Applicants are required to contact the CIP Administrator to arrange and participate in a pre-application consultation meeting with Town staff, in order to discuss and confirm application requirements, program eligibility, the proposed scope of work, project timing, supporting documentation requirements, etc.
- After the consultation, the applicant will be required to submit a completed application, which will include all of the application forms, in addition to any supporting documentation, as required by the Town.
- Once all the required forms and supporting materials are received, the Plan Administrator will undertake a preliminary screening of the proposal and application.
- Based on the application and proposal, the results of the preliminary screening, Town staff may perform an initial site visit and inspection of the building/property, as necessary.
- If the application clearly does not meet the program requirements, the application will not be accepted.
- If the application meets the program requirements, the application will be accepted. Acceptance does not guarantee financial incentive approval, only that it will be reviewed by Council or a delegated approval authority for final financial approval. www.thebluemountains.ca/CIP
