2026 Town Budget

The Proposed Budget has been released including the 2026 operating budget and a ten-year capital budget. The purpose of the proposed budget is to serve as a starting point for budget discussions with Council and members of the public.

The budget will be reviewed and deliberated by Council at a series of special budget meetings.

Each year, the Finance Department leads the preparation of the annual budget for the Town. As part of the Strategic Plan to ensure long-term financial stability of the community, the Town is committed to community involvement and feedback throughout the budget process.

Developing the annual budget involves several months of planning and coordination among Town Staff, Council, and stakeholders. This process involves extensive consultation with the public and ratepayers, ending with the development of a three-year operating budget and a five-year capital budget for the following year.

The Town's budgeting goal is to ensure, through prudent fiscal planning, the long-term economic sustainability of the community.

Notice of 2026 **Budget Meetings for Grey County**

Grey County has set the schedule for the 2026 budget discussions and budget approval.

Meetings will take place in the Council Chamber located at the Grey County Administration Building, 595 9th Avenue East in Owen Sound, and will be streamed publicly to the Grey County YouTube channel and website at www.grey.ca/council/ live-stream. Meetings will begin at 10:00 a.m. unless otherwise stated on the public Council Calendar.

On Friday, December 5, 2025, a report will be presented to provide a corporate budget and background overview information on the 2026 budget.

On Friday, December 12, 2025, a draft 2026 corporate budget will be presented for consideration. If the draft 2026 corporate budget is recommended for approval at the special Committee of the Whole meeting on December 12, 2025, a budget by-law will be presented to County Council for consideration on Thursday, January 8, 2026.

Community Improvement Plan

The Fall 2025 intake period for applications to the Town's Community Improvement Plans is open from September 15, 2025, until October 17, 2025.

The Town has two Community Improvement Plans:

In 2021, the Town of The Blue Mountains developed two Community Improvement Plans to serve as a long-term strategy to revitalize the community, improve the quality of life of the community's residents, better utilize under-developed properties and promote private investment in land and buildings.

The Town Wide Revitalization Community Improvement Plan encourages private property improvement and revitalization. The Housing Within Reach Community Improvement Plan facilitates

the development of attainable housing.

Interested applicants are encouraged to arrange a pre-application consultation with Town Staff to discuss and confirm application requirements. Following the consultation, applicants must submit a completed application form, including supporting documentation for evaluation. Strategic Initiatives (519) 599-3131 ext. 269

Application Process

- Applicants are required to contact the CIP Administrator to arrange and participate in a pre-application consultation meeting with Town staff, in order to discuss and confirm application requirements, program eligibility, the proposed scope of work, project timing, supporting documentation requirements, etc.
- After the consultation, the applicant will be required to submit a completed application, which will include all of the application forms, in addition to any supporting documentation, as required by the Town.
- Once all the required forms and supporting materials are received, the Plan Administrator will undertake a preliminary screening of the proposal and application.
- Based on the application and proposal, the results of the preliminary screening, Town staff may perform an initial site visit and inspection of the building/property, as necessary.
- If the application clearly does not meet the program requirements, the application will not be accepted.
- If the application meets the program requirements, the application will be accepted. Acceptance does not guarantee financial incentive approval, only that it will be reviewed by Council or a delegated approval authority for final financial approval. www.thebluemountains.ca/CIP

New paramedic base opens in Durham

Grey County celebrated the completion of its new \$2.4 million paramedic base in Durham on September 27 with a ribbon-cutting ceremony and open house. The state-of-the-art facility, built by Domm Construction Ltd., replaced an aging base and was designed to meet growing service demands identified in the County's 2023 - 2033 deployment review.

Located beside the new West Grey Police Services, the solar-ready net zero facility creates a centralized emergency services hub. The project was funded through reserves, development charges, and a debenture. The design will be replicated for future bases in Feversham, Ayton, Thornbury, and Cobble Beach through 2028.

Grey County Archives celebrates 25 years in 2025!

Established at its first location in the former Glenelg municipal building in the Municipality of West Grey following a wave of municipal amalgamations in Ontario circa 2000. The Archives moved to its purpose-built home at Grey Roots Museum & Archives in 2004.

The holdings at the Grey County Archives, including materials to be processed, measure 1,669 linear metres (1.669 kilometres) comprising over 900 collections. The archives inherited museum archival collecting which began in 1955, along with the subsequent collecting efforts of the Grey County Historical Society. The Archives categorizes its holdings as municipal, private, media, school or Women's Institute.








Communique #1:

Update From The Special Advisor Regarding Work with The Board of Health for The Grey Bruce Health Unit

Date: Tuesday, October 7th

I am pleased to provide an update on my work as Special Advisor to the Chief Medical Officer of Health, Dr. Kieran Moore, in respect of the Grey Bruce Health Unit. To ensure the continued delivery of critical public health services, on August 14, 2025, the Chief Medical Officer of Health temporarily assumed the powers of the Board of Health under s. 77.1 of the Health Protection and Promotion Act to support operations.

As Special Advisor, my primary role, on behalf of Dr. Moore, is to work with the appointees to the Board of Health, staff at the Grey Bruce Health Unit, and municipal partners to develop and implement an Action Plan to build up the capacity for effective leadership, rebuild key relationships, and support long-term stability of the Board of Health/Health Unit.

Over the last few weeks, it has been my privilege to meet with current board appointees, health unit staff, and representatives from both Bruce and Grey Counties. My goal has been to better understand different perspectives and ideas. I want to thank all of those who have made time to meet with me for your support, candor, and commitment to moving forward together.

On October 3, 2025, I held the first of a series of consultations with governance partners, including current appointees to the Board of Health, representatives from the Office of Chief Medical Officer of Health, the Medical Officer of Health, at the Grey Bruce Health Unit, along with municipal leaders from both Counties as well as their Chief Administrative Officers.

At this meeting, we mapped out a strategy to move forward together to develop the comprehensive Action Plan needed to address the important findings documented through the independent assessment conducted under section 82 of the Health Protection and Promotion Act. In line with that strategy, we had a very good discussion about the skills that should be represented at a reconstituted Board of Health table to strengthen governance, accountability, and public confidence in the leadership of the Grey Bruce Health Unit.

I want to assure our community and partners that the important work of the health unit continues. I also want to acknowledge the positive commitment and support from both Counties for the continued delivery of public health services. I look forward to working closely with them and all the parties involved in public health here.

During this interim period, I am actively supporting Dr. Moore to make required decisions in his role in exercising the powers of the Board of Health. I want to reiterate that the Grey Bruce Health Unit remains fully operational. The dedicated professionals working at the Health Unit continue to deliver essential public health services with professionalism, compassion, and care.


win big while helping local pets in need.






