I have attached some pics of the Beaver River accelerated erosion. Rivers flooding in spring is not news. But as a hiker and kayaker of this river I see with great concern the loss of shoreline now threatening town infrastructure and the loss of sections of the Beaver River Trail. A beloved trail used by many. There is no sign this is abating in fact accelerating each year. A decision needs to be made if the town wishes to protect these resources on our watch if future generations are to enjoy them.



Pic 1 - Beaver River Trail - West of the Clarksburg, Marsh Street bridge. This town maintained trail disappears into the Beaver River now. Only a few years ago large Willow trees flanked this trail on both sides of the trail securing the shoreline.

Pic 2 - Firemans Park - Last few trees that have secured the shoreline now threatened and will likely be soon lost.

Pic 3 - Beaver River at Fireman's Park. Loss of most of vegetation securing the soil. Approximately 10' shoreline erosion in last few years. Now threatening Clark St. and hydro pole.

## The Blue Mountain Film + Media Festival Bringing Together Creativity And Community

The BLUE MOUNTAIN FILM + MEDIA FESTIVAL (BMFM) is pleased to announce the fifth edition of the Festival where mountain culture meets the silver screen with award-winning films from Canada and around the world, with 33 films representing 16 countries.

BMFM 2026 opens with **Opening Night Spotlight:** DANCING ON THE ELEPHANT, a Canadian comedy-drama about two friends (Sheila



McCarthy, Mary Walsh) who attempt to break out of a retirement home, forging a life-changing bond that leads to one last, unforgettable adventure. The film is directed by Julia Neill and Jacob Z. Smith, adapted from a stage play of the same name by Lisa Hagen. The film's star Sheila McCarthy will be in attendance for the introduction/Q&A, along with other cast and crew.

**The Saturday Night Feature:** Film Screening + After Party (May 30) showcases Nick Davis's exuberant documentary You Had To Be There: How The Toronto Godspell Ignited The Comedy Revolution, Spread Love & Overalls, And Created A Community That Changed The World (In A Canadian Kind Of Way) about the legendary 1972 Toronto production of the musical Godspell, which launched many illustrious careers. One of the original cast members, screen and theatre legend Jayne Eastwood, will be in attendance for the post-screening Q&A.

BMFM 2026 will also set the stage for **two films making world premieres**. Matthew Poitras' THE BRUCE PENINSULA is about two half-brothers who meet for the first time after the death of their estranged father and embark on a road trip across Northern Ontario to spread his ashes. THE NORTHMEN WAY: A LACROSSE STORY explores and celebrates the legacy and phenomenon of how Orangeville became a lacrosse powerhouse. Both local films will have film teams participating in in-person Q&As following their screenings.

South Georgian Bay's students will have an opportunity to see Kid Koala's animated feature **SPACE CADET** on the big screen as part of the school screening program, engaging the students about the craft of filmmaking and the power of storytelling. The students will have the chance to bring their questions to head of story-animator-production designer Lillian Chan. Adapted from Kid Koala's graphic novel of the same name, SPACE CADET is about a young astronaut and her guardian robot which explores grief, loss and love across generations.

The highly anticipated **BMFM Creative Forum** is also a part of the Festival's fifth edition. It is an intimate, high-impact, face-to-face gathering where creators connect directly with buyers, funders, commissioners, distributors and key decision-makers. The Creative Forum is about accelerating the projects that get to the screen with direct industry access.

Some highlights include **Fireside Chats** with Bell Media Executives and CBC Executives, clear-eyed looks at where opportunities are emerging across scripted and unscripted content.

**Pitch & Pour** is part competition, part networking, with participants delivering quick and compelling pitches while the audience makes connections. The winner receives \$35K+ in prize of goods and services from Urban Post and Sunbelt.

**Mountain View** is BMFM's elevator pitch with stakeholders while riding up Blue Mountain in a gondola.

## 2026 Curbside Yard Waste Collection

The Town collects leaf and yard waste at the curbside during the spring and fall seasons each year. Outside of these dates, leaf and yard waste may be dropped off at the Town's Landfill and Recycling Depot anytime during regular operating hours (subject to fees as applicable).

### Spring Collection

April 20-May 28

### Fall Collection

October 12-November 19

### Leaf and Yard Waste Collection Guidelines

Yard Waste is collected on your regular curbside collection day and must be curbside no earlier than 7:00 p.m. the day prior, and no later than 7:00 a.m. on collection day (subject to fines)

Yard Waste collected curbside is limited to 10 compostable bags or containers weekly

Oversized yard waste is not collected curbside but can be delivered to the Landfill and Recycling Depot (subject to applicable fees)

The site is currently used for material and equipment storage related to Town activities, in addition to seasonal storage of boat cribs and trailers. The Site Reclamation Plan will evaluate and specify remediation methods to be undertaken to enable unrestricted future use of the land, but it is not intended to determine what the specific use or uses will be.

## Launch of Cloud Permit for Short-Term Accommodation Licensing

The Town of The Blue Mountains would like to advise the public that the Town has transitioned to using Cloud Permit for managing the Short-Term Accommodation licensing process.

Effective April 20, 2026, all new applications and re-registrations for Short-Term Accommodation licenses must be submitted through Cloud Permit. This new system is designed to streamline the application process, improve efficiency and provide a more user-friendly experience for applicants.

Through Cloud Permit, applicants will be able to:

- Submit new license applications
- Complete re-registrations
- Upload required documentation
- Track application status
- Make payments for the license
- Download documents and the issued license from the portal

Short-term Accommodation operators can now create an account to access the portal. Users who have already have a Cloud Permit account will not need a new account. Only one account should be created per license holder or management company.

All applications submitted before April 20, 2026, will continue to be processed through the previous method. Any applications that were started but not submitted before April 20 must be resubmitted through Cloud Permit. Existing license holders must use the new system for their next renewal cycle.

The Town would like to remind the public that operating a Short-Term Accommodation without a valid license remains a violation of municipal by-laws and may result in penalties or enforcement action. Operators must also sign up for the Municipal Accommodation Tax registration to be in compliance with current regulations. Operators can register for the Municipal Accommodation Tax online.

It is therefore important we move forward in a timely manner while working closely with our bargaining agents and the government to ensure we can meet the evolving needs of Canadians in a financially sustainable way.

As we undertake this important transformation, we are committed to providing consistent, reliable service, competitive rates and the certainty and stability your business needs.

### The move to community mailboxes

We are converting approximately four million addresses that still receive door-to-door delivery to community mailboxes. This will take about five years, with different areas moving to community mailboxes each year.

As a first step, we are reaching out to 13 communities where we plan to convert approximately 136,000 addresses from door-to-door delivery to community mailboxes in late 2026 and early 2027. A list of these communities and postal codes can be found on our website at [canadapost.ca/ourtransformation](http://canadapost.ca/ourtransformation).

Canada Post will engage with communities as it identifies suitable locations for community mailbox sites. It is also notifying residents of the upcoming change to their mail delivery, and will keep them, businesses, bargaining agents and employees informed every step of the way.

Converting addresses to community mailboxes helps ensure your products are delivered securely and conveniently to customers. Community mailboxes feature locked compartments for mail and parcels, giving residents reliable access to mail and parcels at any time of day.

More than 80% of parcels delivered by Canada Post fit into a community mailbox's individual compartment or one of the dedicated parcel compartments. Parcels that do not fit or that require a signature are delivered to the door or held for pickup at a nearby post office.

Placing more addresses under lock and key will help manage growing concerns about package theft, providing additional peace of mind for both businesses and customers.

### Retail modernization

While Canadians still value post offices, they are visiting them less frequently and making fewer in-store purchases. This pattern has driven a 30% drop in retail revenue since 2021. Usage is also uneven across the network.

The retail modernization process will begin with market reviews to gather and validate operational data of local post offices. This will provide us with an accurate and up-to-date view of each location.

Regions will also be evaluated as a whole so each post office can be viewed through a community lens.

This analysis will support careful evaluation of our network to determine where changes are most warranted while prioritizing service to Canadians and protecting it where it is needed most.

Retail modernization supports the long-term, financial sustainability of the postal network, helping ensure services continue to be available where and when they are needed.

Our retail network – the largest in Canada – will continue to provide customers with access to pickup and drop-off services across the country, supporting the delivery needs of businesses and Canadians as expectations continue to evolve.

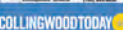

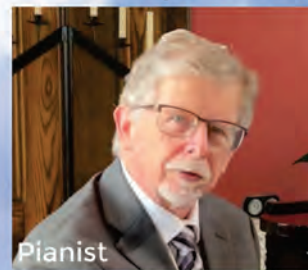

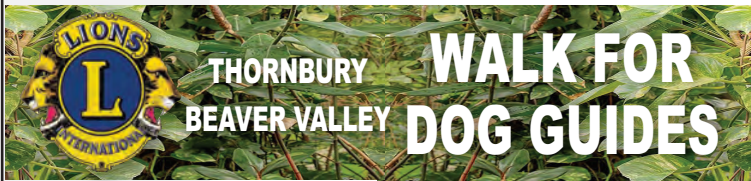
