



Queen Victoria was born on May 24, 1819. Following the death of 3 uncles and her father, she became Queen of the United Kingdom on June 20, 1837 and reigned until her death on January 22, 1901. During Victoria's life, the British Empire expanded considerably. However, her powers as Queen of the United Kingdom were reduced as the House of Commons became more important and powerful in British politics.

The monarch's birthday has been celebrated in Canada since before the beginning of Queen Victoria's reign. After her death, in 1901, May 25 became known as Empire Day. The sovereign's official birthday was still celebrated, often on the King's or Queen's actual birthday. In 1952, Empire Day was moved to the Monday before May 25 and since 1953, the official birthday of Queen Elizabeth II has been celebrated on this date in Canada. In 1958, Empire Day became known as Commonwealth Day, which was moved to the second Monday in March. The Monday before May 25 then became known as Victoria Day, which is a Canadian statutory holiday.

Local School Council Raises Big Funds With Books!

Last week, Beaver Valley Community School's Parent Council held the inaugural BVCS book fair; a swap and shop that allowed students to donate their previously-read books and then come back to shop the sale, including books, bags, bookmarks, and puzzles. The sale raised over \$6,100 for the library and teacher school supplies.

"Not only did the sale raise such an impressive sum, we were able to keep books out of the landfill," says Sue Min, Parent and Committee Volunteer, "we were also able to put affordable books in the hands of children and ultimately make the focus on the love of reading and not on trinkets and toys."

The idea for the fair was born out of feedback that a lot of parents find that they end up with too many books in the house and donation sites can be overwhelmed with books. Inspired by the Holiday Swap in Collingwood, hosted by Joyful Homes and Novel Tutoring, PAC was able to create a book fair with minimal cost but a lot of impact. The BVO was also a huge support to the fair by sorting through their donations and providing BVCS with gently-used children's books.



"The Book Fair was a breath of fresh air and an experience that brought joy to both teachers and students," says Julie Phillips, BVCS Principal, "we are grateful to PAC and the parent volunteers who donated their time and energy to making this event fun, accessible, and educational for both students and teachers." Clan of the Painted Lady

Ontario Premiere at Blue Mountain Film Festival, May 28

Hakka-Canadian filmmaker Jennifer Chiu's engrossing feature documentary, *Clan of the Painted Lady*, is a deeply personal film tracing her family's history, exploring the Hakka — a people, a language, and a culture that have been obscured for far too long.

Tracing her own lineage back from Canada to China to Kolkata, India, director/producer Jennifer Chiu creates an illuminating, bravely personal film. Through her own story, Jennifer explores the weight of parent-child separation, which migration often entails, and the loss and disconnection between generations that must somehow be healed.

Thought to hail from the north of China, the Hakka settled in the south of the country, where they were known as the "guest people". In the face of war, poverty and social marginalization, many of them dispersed to places such as Mauritius, India, Jamaica, and Canada — including BC's Lower Mainland, where Chiu spent much of her childhood.

Chiu's reach is as expansive as her people's migratory spread: Using found Super 8 footage, she explores the Hakka's history in India, and through candid, probing interviews with relatives and community leaders, she brings forth a search for belonging in a centuries-long story of migration. Chiu has made a warm and introspective film that is never weighed down by its explorations of family secrecy, the costs of assimilation, or the uncertain future of Hakka culture.

Clan of the Painted Lady follows Jennifer's personal journey from China to Canada to India, as she discovers why her family moved and how they keep their heritage alive while adapting to new places. With an ensemble of Hakka voices from around the world, the film explores how culture is transmitted from one generation to another, and the challenge of defining identity within a diaspora.

Jennifer Chiu is an award-winning writer, director, producer and documentary researcher living in Vancouver, British Columbia. Her dramatic feature *INEDIA*, and short films *Memory of the Peace* and *CABBIE*, have screened at festivals around the world, including DOK Leipzig, the Edinburgh Film Festival, Festival du Nouveau Cinéma, the Mill Valley Film Festival, and the Vancouver International Film Festival. *Clan of the Painted Lady* is her first feature documentary.

Chiu's production team includes Creative Producer Bradley Keeling, Consulting Producer Sarah Jane Flynn, Cinematographer Antonia Ramirez, Co-writer and Editor: Aynsley Baldwin and Co-Composers and Co-Sound Designers Scott Gailey and Oscar Vargas.

Clan of the Painted Lady is produced by Amino Acid Technology and produced in association with Knowledge Network. Developed with the financial participation of Creative BC, The Canadian Media Fund, Telefilm Canada, and the Bell Fund. 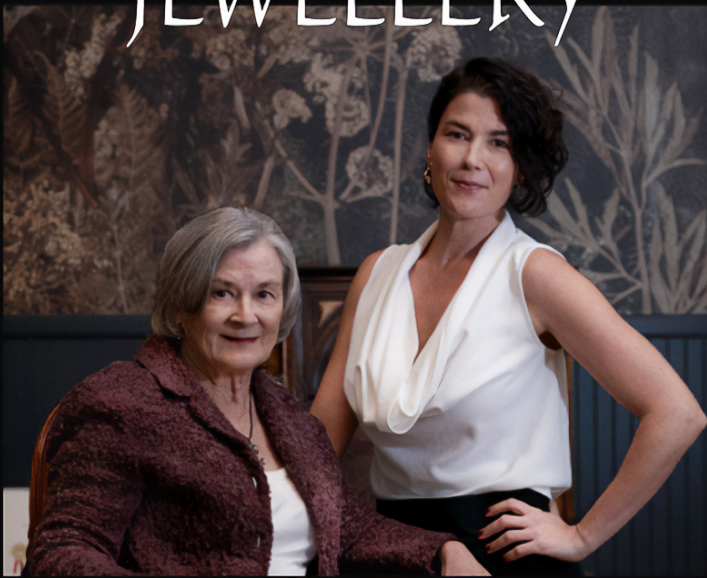

Ontario Expanding Scope of Practice for Pharmacists and Other Health Professionals

To protect Ontario's health-care system and provide more connected and convenient care to people around the province, the government is allowing pharmacists to administer additional publicly funded vaccines that protect against six diseases and assess and prescribe for a further nine common ailments. This historic expansion of their scope of practice will improve access to care and reduce pressure on the health-care system by empowering health professionals to provide care to the full extent of their training and making pharmacies a one-stop location for convenient, everyday care.

Beginning July 2026, pharmacists across the province will be able to administer six additional publicly funded vaccines for eligible Ontarians, including

Tetanus	Pertussis	Diphtheria
Pneumococcal	RSV	Shingles vaccines

Under the current model, these publicly funded vaccines are only available to patients through a visit to a doctor's office, walk-in clinic or other clinical settings. Under the new expanded scope of practice, families will now be able to receive critical vaccines more easily at thousands of additional locations across the province, with pharmacy technicians and qualified staff able to administer all eligible vaccines.

The province is also allowing pharmacists to assess and prescribe for nine additional common ailments, with plans to add up to five more in early 2027, bringing the total expanded number up to 33. Starting July 2026, pharmacists and qualified health-care practitioners will be able to treat the following ailments:

Calluses and corns	Dandruff	Dry eye	Head lice
Jock itch	Mild headache	Nasal congestion	
Ringworm	Warts		

This expansion builds on the province's previous actions to increase scope of practice which has seen Ontario pharmacies provide care in over 2.4 million assessments for the first 19 common ailments. Today, over 99 per cent of all Ontario's pharmacies now participate in the program, connecting people to care in every corner of the province.

Ontario Expanding Scope of Practice for Regulated Health Professionals

The government has directed Ontario's regulatory health colleges for optometrists, physiotherapists, chiropractors, dental hygienists, denturists, audiologists and speech-language pathologists to begin work needed to support further expansions of their scopes of practice.

Ontario Lowering Eligibility Age for Life-Saving Colon Cancer Screening

The Ontario government is lowering the eligibility age to allow people to access publicly funded colorectal cancer screening to help more people receive life-saving screening services sooner.

Starting July 1, the eligibility age will be lowered from 50 to 45 for all individuals and to 40 for those at increased risk. This historic expansion will give more than one million additional people the option to connect to life-saving screening services to detect and treat colorectal cancer sooner.

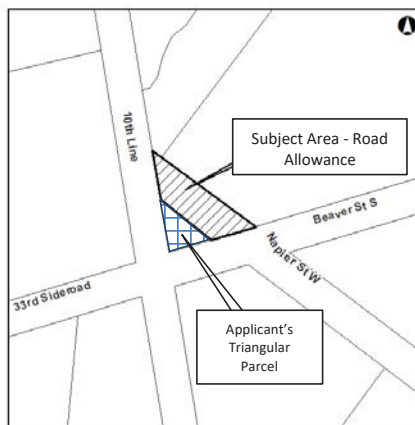
