It's Tick Season, and Grey Bruce Public Health is Urging People To Take Steps To Prevent Tick Bites

As the warm, sunny weather draws people to spend more time hiking, cycling, exploring, and enjoying the outdoors, Grey Bruce Public Health is issuing a reminder to take steps to prevent tick bites and, in turn, Lyme disease.

A sizable portion of Grey-Bruce is considered an Established Risk Area for blacklegged ticks – the tick species capable of transmitting bacteria, viruses, and parasites that can cause potentially serious diseases in people, including Lyme disease. However, blacklegged ticks can be found anywhere in Ontario.

“Because of the warming climate, ticks are now active for longer periods each year, including in the early spring and into the late fall, and their habitat has expanded,” says Public Health Manager Gillian Jordan.

“This is why it’s important for people to be tick aware whenever they spend time outdoors.”

The best way to protect against tick-borne illnesses, like Lyme disease, is to prevent tick bites. If a bite does occur, it’s important to locate the tick and remove it as quickly as possible.

“Public Health recommends people check themselves, their family members, and pets for ticks after spending time outdoors. Promptly removing any attached ticks is critical to preventing potential infection as ticks must be attached for at least 24 to 36 hours, in most cases, in order to pass onto humans the bacteria that causes Lyme disease,” Jordan says.

When spending time outdoors, people can prevent tick bites by:

- Using bug spray with DEET or Icaridin (always follow label directions);
- Wearing closed-toe shoes and covering exposed skin (tucking pants into socks and shirts into pants); and
- Walking on cleared paths or trails (this includes keeping children and pets from wandering off established paths).

People are also advised to:

- Wear light-coloured clothing while outdoors, so it’s easier to spot any ticks that may have climbed onto them;
- Use a sticky lint remover before getting back into their car to remove any ticks that may have crawled onto shoes or clothing;
- Perform full body checks for ticks upon returning home and take a shower/bath;
- Check pets for ticks;
- Put clothes in a dryer on high heat for at least 10 minutes to kill any ticks.

Blacklegged ticks, also known as deer ticks, can carry the bacterium *B. burgdorferi*, which, if transmitted to humans via a tick bite, can cause Lyme disease.

About 3,115 people contracted Lyme disease in Ontario in 2025, a 33% increase over the number of human cases reported in 2024. Nearly 200 people have been diagnosed with Lyme disease so far this year.

Early Lyme disease symptoms can include fever, headache, muscle/joint pain, fatigue, and a bull's-eye rash. Residents should consult a doctor if experiencing these symptoms. If left untreated, Lyme disease can lead to recurring arthritis, neurological problems, numbness, or paralysis. If caught early, Lyme disease can be treated effectively with antibiotics.

Ticks can also carry the parasite that causes babesiosis in humans as well as the viruses that cause anaplasmosis or Powassan Virus in people. For tick identification, use the free online platform eTick. GBPH's tick webpage contains additional information on preventing Lyme disease.

Grey County Breaks Ground For New Transportation Depot West Of Flesherton

Ground has officially been broken for a new Grey County transportation services depot near Ceylon, west of Flesherton. Grey County Warden Andrea Matrosovs joined staff for a ceremonial groundbreaking at the site, which will be the base of operations for southeastern Grey County.

The new depot will include multiple drive-through bays for heavy equipment and fleet vehicles, a standalone storage building for salt and other materials, and dedicated lunchroom and meeting space. The facility will also be equipped to serve as a backup emergency operations centre if the Grey County Administration Building becomes inaccessible or unsuitable during an emergency.

"This new depot represents a long-term commitment to servicing southeastern Grey County and everyone who travels through this corner of the county," said Grey County Warden Andrea Matrosovs. "Our roads connect communities and support daily travel and economic activity. This depot will strengthen our ability to keep our roads safe and well maintained."

Construction on the site will continue through 2026 and into 2027 with some areas of the site being operation in time for the winter season.

Grey County currently operates out of a leased facility in Flesherton and has been exploring options for building a new depot in the area for several years. Grey County purchased the new property in 2025 and awarded the construction contract to DOMM Construction Ltd. in March 2026 at a cost of \$7,508,000.

The depot has been designed with sustainability and energy efficiency in mind, in alignment with the goals of the Grey County Climate Change Action Plan.

Grey County Transportation Services maintains a network of over 877 kilometres of county roads and 192 large structures including bridges and culverts. Prime Minister Carney Launches National Food Security Strategy To Build A More Affordable And Resilient Food System In Canada

The world is changing rapidly. Trade shifts, global conflicts, and climate change are all putting growing pressure on our food and energy systems, driving up prices at home and abroad. In response, Canada's new government is focused on what we can control: building a stronger, more independent, more resilient Canadian economy. Central to this mission is a stronger, more affordable food system.

While Canada is one of the largest exporters of agri-food products in the world, Canadians continue to face some of the highest grocery costs in the G7. There is not enough competition between grocery retailers, we are not harnessing enough technology in our agri-food sectors, and our food chains rely too heavily on foreign suppliers. 3) Grow fruits and vegetables year-round

- Invest \$750 million to drastically expand year-round Canadian production of fruits and vegetables, including through greenhouses, vertical farms, and other enclosed growing spaces.

4) Cut red tape across the agricultural supply chain

- Modernise key regulations; speed up approvals for seeds, feed, fertilizers, and veterinary products; and reduce backlogs that slow down the system to reduce the regulatory burden on farmers and producers.
- Help provincially licensed food businesses meet federal requirements so that a Canadian product made in one province or territory can more easily reach a shelf in another.

Canada's new National Food Security Strategy puts Canadians back in control of what we grow, of what we buy, and of what we put on our tables. Together, we are building a stronger, more resilient, and more affordable food system for all Canadians.

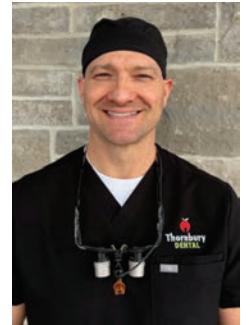

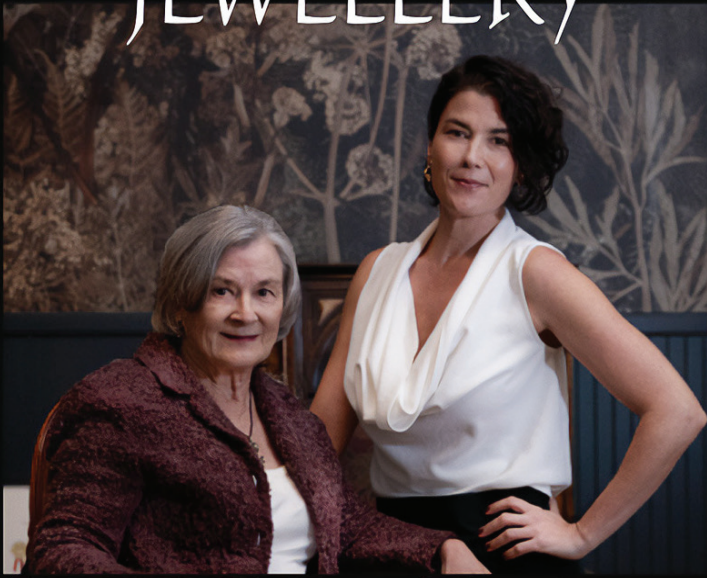

Notice of Community Engagement Session: Crosswinds Boulevard Opening

The Town of The Blue Mountains, in partnership with the Craigeleith Community Working Group, invites members of the public to attend an upcoming Community Engagement Session regarding the opening of Crosswinds Boulevard.

Thursday, June 25, 2026, Time: 5:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m.

The Windfall Shed (140 Crosswinds Boulevard)

Format: In-person (No registration required)

Crosswinds Boulevard is a municipal road located east of Blue Mountain Village that travels through the Windfall and Second Nature communities. Crosswinds Boulevard was formally assumed by the Town in November 2025 and is scheduled to open to the public as a through traffic road in Summer 2026.

While nearby residential development was underway, Crosswinds Boulevard was open at both ends, with a temporary barrier in place between Springside Crescent and Courtland Street to prevent through traffic. Now that the related development work is complete and the road has been formally assumed by the Town, the barrier will be removed, and the road will open as originally planned.

Opening Crosswinds Boulevard is required to improve connectivity in the area and support more direct access for residents, emergency services and Town operations such as maintenance and service delivery. To support the opening, the Town is implementing an operational monitoring plan focused on traffic conditions, vehicle and pedestrian safety, and any follow-up measures that may be needed.

The purpose of the Community Engagement Session is to share information ahead of the opening and to answer questions from residents and community members. The meeting will include a presentation, a question-and-answer period, and an opportunity for attendees to speak directly with staff and share feedback. This session is open to the public, and no pre-registration is required.

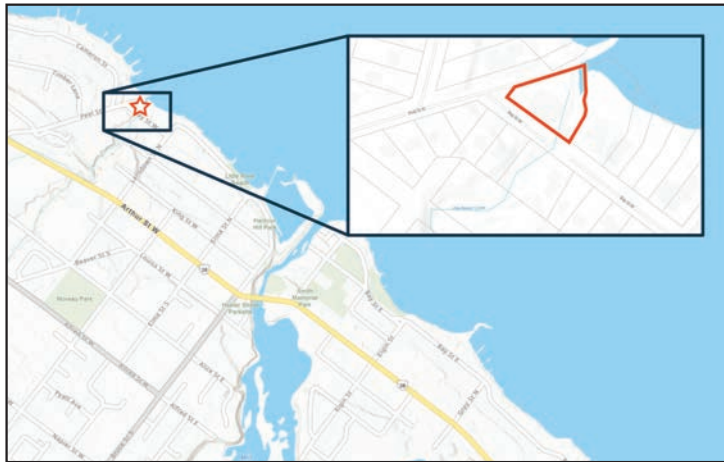

Municipal Class Environmental Assessment for Thornbury Water Treatment Plant Upgrades



The Town of The Blue Mountains has initiated a Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (MCEA) to implement the recommended upgrades to the Thornbury Water Treatment Plant (WTP) as part of the ongoing MCEA for Drinking Water Storage and Supply Deficiencies in the Town's eastern pressure zones.

Background: The Town has been advancing the East Side Water Storage and Supply MCEA to address long-term water storage and supply needs in the eastern pressure zones. As part of this study, near term upgrades have been identified at the Thornbury WTP. As these upgrades are required under each alternative of the ongoing EA, they are being advanced independently from the overall MCEA.

Preliminary Preferred Alternative: The preliminary preferred alternative identified through this MCEA is to *Increase the Capacity of the Existing Thornbury WTP to 18,165 m³/day*. Upgrades generally include:

- Microfiltration membrane upgrades to existing three trains
- Chlorination system upgrades (chemical feed pump and storage tank)
- Clearwell upgrades for additional capacity
- High lift pump upgrades (three new pumps with modifications to headers as required)

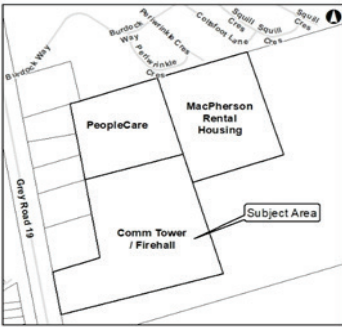

Notice of Public Meeting: PROPOSED TELECOMMUNICATIONS TOWER



Public Meeting Details: June 23, 2026, at 9:30 a.m.

What is being proposed?

The Town of The Blue Mountains is proposing a new 24.38m (80ft) 2.13m x 2.13m triangular lattice style tower. The tower will be free-standing to provide point-to-point connectivity for two-way base station radio connections for Fire Department communications and will also provide connectivity to the Craigleith Wastewater Treatment Plant, Happy Valley Reservoir, and former Fire Hall #2. Enhanced metering infrastructure related to remote water meter readings is also proposed.

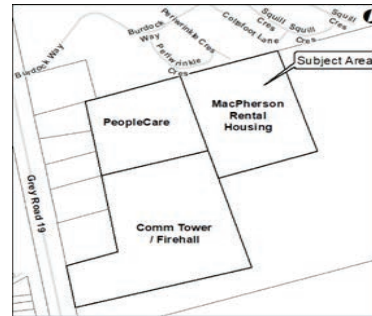
The establishment of new telecommunication facilities is under the exclusive jurisdiction of the Federal Government. Innovation, Science and Economic Development (ISED) Canada is the approval authority for telecommunication towers and requires all proponents of new facilities to consult local planning authorities to ensure local protocols and surroundings are considered during the mandated site selection process. The Town of The Blue Mountains Protocol for Establishing Telecommunication Facilities requires public consultation for all new telecommunication facilities.
