

GBPH Announces New Provincial Appointee to Grey-Bruce Board of Health

Kenneth Craig, Chair of the Board of Health for Grey Bruce Public Health, is pleased to announce that Michael Murray of Grey Highlands will be joining the local Board of Health as a Provincial Appointee.

The Executive Council of Ontario approved the appointment through an Order in Council, effective July 30, 2026, and for a term not exceeding two years.

Mr. Murray has extensive experience in the public, private and not-for-profit sectors. He served for 28 years with the Regional Municipality of Waterloo, including as its Chief Administrative Officer from 2004 to 2020.

"On behalf of the Grey-Bruce Board of Health, I would like to extend a warm welcome to Michael as the newest member of the Board. 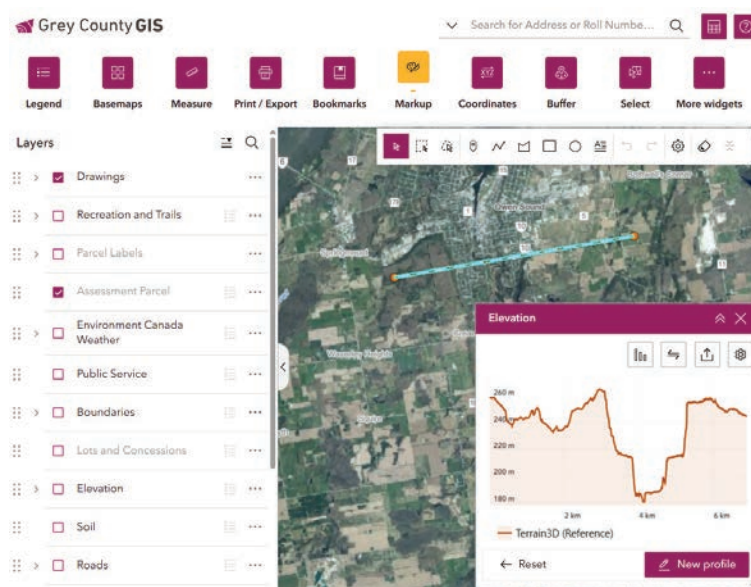
Grey County Introduces New GIS Mapping Application

A new public-facing Geographic Information System (GIS) web application is now available through the County's GIS website.

You can use this mapping application to verify addresses, search for properties by roll number, view the current zoning of a property, print maps, and more.

While the new GIS site has a slightly different look and feel compared to the old version, it functions in the same way. Users will notice new options like a 3D elevation tool, a simplified search experience, and access to an expanded collection of basemaps, including new air photos that were recently captured in 2025.

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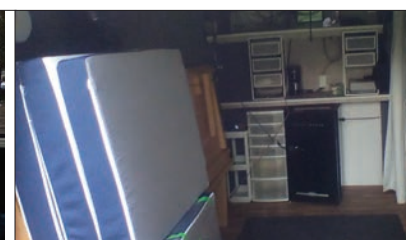

This Week in History

British Prime Minister Winston Churchill and U.S. President Franklin D. Roosevelt met secretly from August 9 to 12, 1941, aboard warships anchored at Placentia Bay off the coast of Newfoundland (at Argentia naval station). This historic wartime summit led to the creation of the Atlantic Charter, which shaped postwar international goals.

The eight key principles of the Atlantic Charter, are no territorial gains, self-determination, and economic cooperation.

Core Goals and Territories

No territorial aggrandizement: Neither the U.S. nor Britain sought new land or territory.

No forced territorial changes: Adjustments to land must match the freely expressed wishes of the people involved.

Self-determination: All people have the right to choose their own form of government and regain self-government if lost.

Trade and Economics

Access to trade: Nations should have equal terms of access to trade and raw materials needed for economic prosperity.

Economic cooperation: Global collaboration to improve labor standards, economic advancement, and social security. North Atlantic Treaty Organization | NATO

Peace and Security

Freedom from fear and want: A post-war peace allowing all people to live safely within their borders without poverty or terror.

Freedom of the seas: Nations should be able to navigate the open seas freely in peace and war.

Disarmament: The abandonment of the use of force and the eventual disarmament of aggressor nations pending a permanent system of general security.



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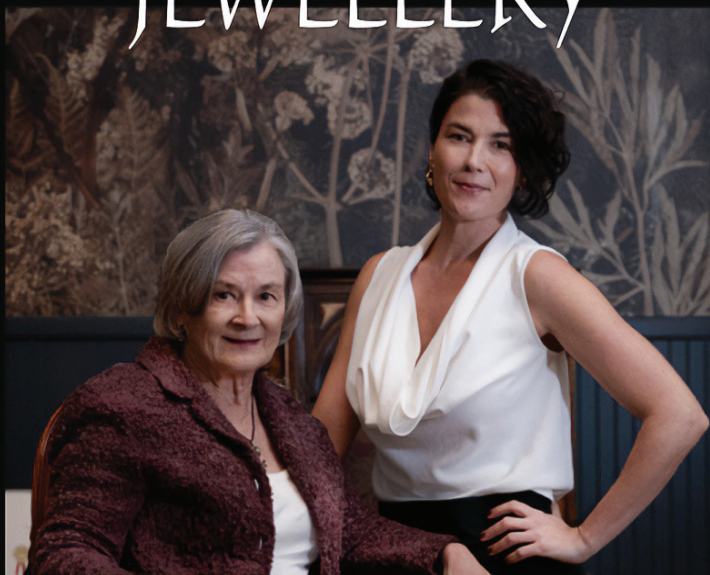
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Ontario Investing \$4,482,500 to Support Hospital Operations in Simcoe-Grey

The Ontario government is investing \$4,482,500 million to support improved operations and reduced wait times at Stevenson Memorial Hospital and Collingwood General & Marine Hospital. This funding is part of a \$1.1 billion investment into our hospital sector as part of Budget 2026, A Plan to Protect Ontario, which represents a 4 per cent increase in annual support for the fourth year in a row.

The funding allocations are as follows:

Collingwood General and Marine Hospital - \$3,003,500

Stevenson Memorial Hospital - \$1,479,000

"Collingwood General & Marine Hospital and Stevenson Memorial Hospital each play a vital role in the health and well-being of our communities across the riding," said Brian Saunderson, MPP for Simcoe-Grey. "This additional operational funding will help support the dedicated health-care professionals at both hospitals as they deliver essential services to patients and families. As our communities continue to grow, ensuring our hospitals have the resources they need to provide high-quality care remains a key priority."

"Our government is making historic investments to protect Ontario's health-care system, ensuring that more people in Simcoe-Grey can connect to the care they need, where and when they need it," said Sylvia Jones, Deputy Premier and Minister of Health. "This investment will allow both hospitals to continue delivering the highest standard of care while reducing wait lists and wait times for patients and families, for generations to come."

CGMH is an acute care hospital with 84 beds providing a comprehensive range of services, including 24/7 Emergency Department care, General Medicine, Internal Medicine, General Surgery, Orthopaedics, Critical Care, Obstetrics, Diagnostic Imaging, and various specialty clinics.

Stevenson Memorial Hospital (SMH) is a progressive, acute care, community-based hospital located in the Town of New Tecumseth that offers 38 inpatient beds and a range of outpatient diagnostic and treatment services, including general surgery, maternal childcare and dialysis, as well as an Emergency Department with 24/7 coverage.

\$11,527,555 for Huron, Bruce, Grey and Perth County Hospitals

The Ontario government is investing a total of \$11,527,255 to complete upgrades and repairs for hospitals in Huron, Bruce, Grey and Perth Counties. These organizations will receive the following funding allocations:

Alexandra Marine and General Hospital	\$362,281
Brightshores Health System	\$3,968,064
Huron Perth Healthcare Alliance	\$5,220,021
South Bruce Grey Health Centre	\$731,779
South Huron Hospital	\$347,824
Wingham and District Hospital	\$897,286

The Health Infrastructure Renewal Fund enables healthcare system partners to address their urgent infrastructure needs including upgrading or replacing roofs, windows, security systems, fire alarms and emergency generators. Since 2024, the Ontario government has increased funding through the Health Infrastructure Renewal Fund by 10% each year, allowing even more hospitals to complete upgrades and repairs in a timely manner.

The Ontario government is investing \$257 million in 2025-26 to support critical infrastructure upgrades and repairs at 126 hospitals and 66 community health-care facilities across the province, a 12.3 per cent increase from the previous year.

Ontario continues to make historic investments in health care. Over the next 10 years, Ontario is investing approximately \$64 billion in major health infrastructure. This is part of the government's plan to get shovels in the ground on more than 50 major hospital projects across the province, which will deliver approximately 3,000 new hospital beds to enhance access to quality care and build a connected, people-first health-care system.

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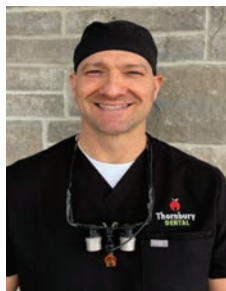

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NOTICE OF MUNICIPAL ELECTION – October 26, 2026 INFORMATION FOR VOTERS

WHO MAY VOTE?

Any person who on election day (October 26, 2026) meets the following qualifications is eligible to vote:

1. Is a Canadian citizen;
2. Is at least 18 years old on election day;
3. Resides in the municipality or is the owner or tenant of land in the local municipality, or the spouse of such a person;
Non-residential commercial or industrial property electors are not entitled to vote for school board trustees but are entitled to vote for other municipal offices or questions.
4. Any person not prohibited by law from voting.

WHAT SCHOOL BOARD DO I VOTE FOR?

Electors are entitled to vote for school boards if their qualifying property is residential. Each eligible elector may vote for school representation once in a school board jurisdiction.

The following is a list of the School Boards for which qualified electors will be entitled to vote unless there are acclamations.

1. **Bluewater District School Board** (anyone can support)
2. **Bruce Grey Catholic District School Board** (must be Roman Catholic)
3. **Conseil scolaire Viamonde** (must have French Language Education Rights)
4. **Conseil scolaire catholique Providence** (must be Roman Catholic and have French Language Education Rights)

Until August 12, 2026, voters are encouraged to confirm, register or amend your voter information via Elections Ontario, www.RegisterToVoteON.ca.

From September 1, 2026, to October 26, 2026, voters may contact the Town of The Blue Mountains, Clerks Office to confirm, amend or be added to the Voters' List.

INTERNET & TELEPHONE VOTING

There will be no advance poll or proxy voting, as both Internet and Telephone Voting allow voters to cast a ballot anytime between Friday, October 16, 2026, at 10:00 a.m. and Monday, October 26, 2026, at 8:00 p.m. Voter Information Letters will be mailed to electors at the beginning of October and will include voter credentials and instructions on how to vote.

During the Voting Period, October 16, 2026 to October 26, 2026, the Election Help Centre will be available in the Town of The Blue Mountains, Town Hall. At the Election Help Centre, Electors can:

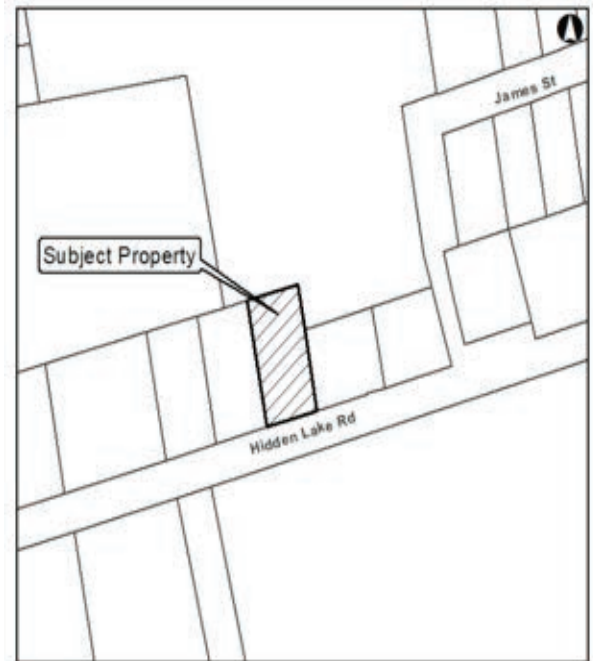

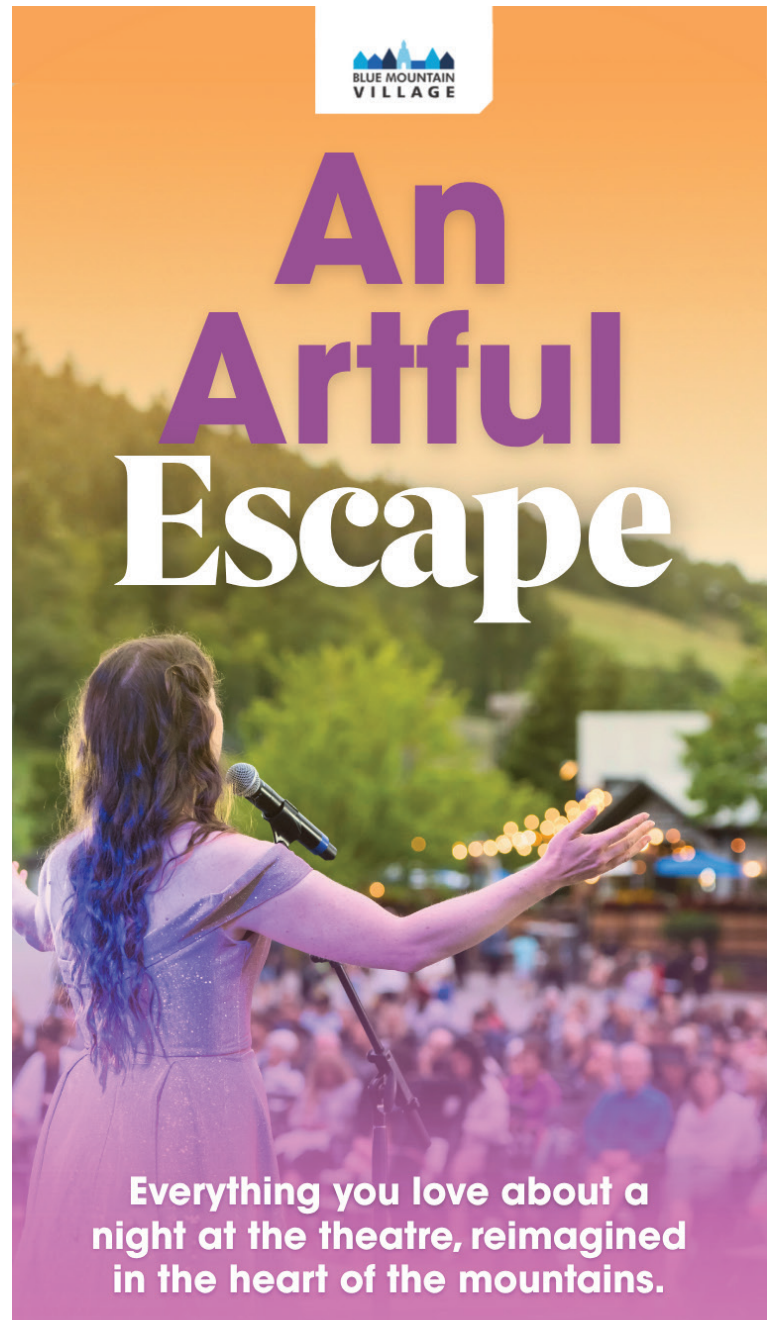
