Notice of Community Information Session - Thornbury Wastewater Treatment Plant Outfall Pipe Installation Friday, August 28, 1-2 p.m. ; Town Hall, 32 Mill Street, Thornbury

The Town of The Blue Mountains is holding a Community Information Session to provide an overview and update on the installation of the new treated effluent outfall pipe for the Thornbury Wastewater Treatment Plant. The Town's engineering consultant, Arcadis, will be giving a presentation outlining the outfall installation process and the planned site restoration activities.

The Town is upgrading the Thornbury Wastewater Treatment Plant Outfall Pipe to allow the plant to meet its full capacity. This outfall will be installed from



the Treatment Plant to the shoreline within the Grey Street road allowance. It will then extend off the north end of the Grey Street road allowance, and run 1.5 km into Georgian Bay. The pipe has been assembled in segments at Lora Bay Park, and will be floated in Lora Bay until final assembly can be completed.

All those interested in the project are invited to attend the Community Information Session. The event will include a presentation and a Question & Answer session. The meeting will be recorded and posted to the project page for anyone unable to attend in person. If you are unable to attend the meeting in person, but have questions that you would like asked on your behalf during the Q&A, please email them to communications@thebluemountains.ca.

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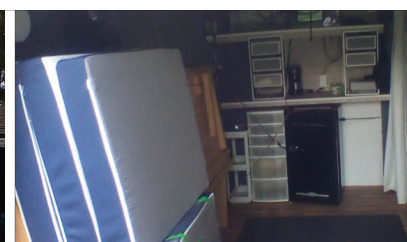

Grey County Committee of the Whole August 13

Council received a report highlighting changes to the way 911 medical calls are dispatched. A new **Medical Priority Dispatch System** will be implemented in the region on October 14. The new system will help triage and prioritize incoming calls for service to better ensure responders are available to provide rapid response to patients with the highest severity needs.

Council received a report highlighting the results of the Grey County Paramedic Services Land **Ambulance Review**. This review is mandated every three years and focuses on the areas of patient care, quality assurance, and administration. Grey County received a positive review, and the license has been renewed for three years.

Council received a report on **Healthcare Funding Requests** and directed staff to maintain the annual transfer of \$200,000 to the funding reserve when preparing the 2027-2028 budget. Further, Council directed staff to include a funding request of \$175,000 from Saugeen Hospice in the 2027-2031 budgets for consideration.

Council approved updates to the **Land Acquisition and Disposition Policy**. Updates support fair, open, and transparent processes that also protect the interests of Grey County.

Council approved a report directing staff to add a **County Community Improvement Plan (CIP)** project to the 10-year capital budget and to include it within the Development Charges Background Study. A CIP is a tool that helps municipalities offer incentives that support strategic community priorities. Until recently, upper-tier municipal governments were not permitted to deliver a CIP program. Priorities Grey County may consider include affordable housing and further complementing existing municipal CIP programs.

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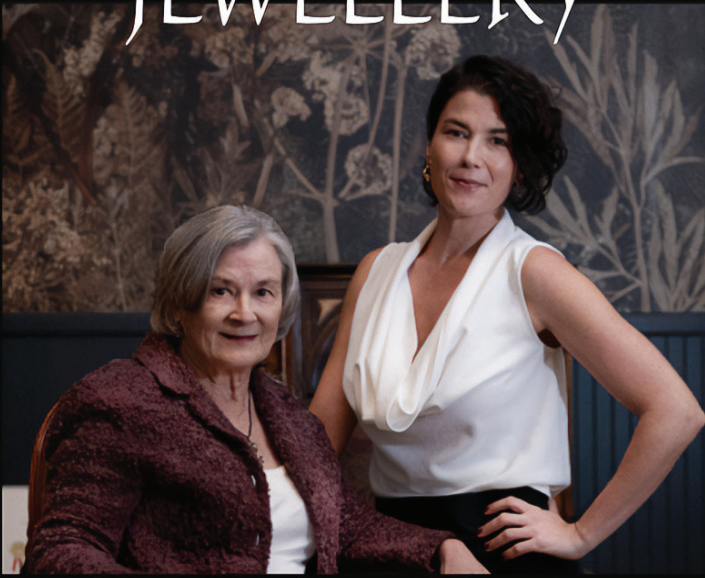
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Grey Roots Unveils Community Canvas: A Roger Mooking Experience

Grey Roots Museum & Archives is proud to announce the unveiling of Community Canvas: A Roger Mooking Experience, a unique large-scale collaborative artwork that brought together professional artists, local community members and visitors to create a shared visual story of Grey County.

The completed artwork will be revealed during a public celebration on **Wednesday, August 26, 2026**, from 2:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m. at Grey Roots Museum & Archives. Guests will have the opportunity to hear from the artists, enjoy live music and refreshments, and be among the first to experience the finished piece.

Led by acclaimed artist Roger Mooking, Community Canvas transformed a blank six by six foot canvas into a vibrant reflection of place and identity. The artwork evolved through multiple phases, beginning with historical imagery and archival materials, expanding into interpretations of Grey County's landscapes, and incorporating contributions from visitors who added their own drawings and personal reflections. The final layer culminated in a striking portrait representing the collective spirit of the region.

"At its heart, Community Canvas is about connection," says Mooking. "The artwork belongs to everyone who contributed to it. Together, we've created a visual record of the stories, memories, and perspectives that make this community special."

Mooking was joined by Ontario artists Lonny Doherty, who contributed interpretations of Grey County's natural landscapes, and Sarah Rose Irwin, whose portrait work helped bring the community's collective identity to life.

The Community Canvas artwork reveal celebration is included with regular museum admission and free for Grey Roots members.

Wild Weather is a hands-on, high-energy exhibition that brings the awe-inspiring power of severe weather to life for visitors of all ages. From roaring hurricanes to crackling lightning, this immersive museum experience invites curious minds of all ages to explore the science behind Earth's most extreme conditions.

Hometown Hockey

In **Hometown Hockey**, explore the fascinating history of hockey in Owen Sound. The teams, championship seasons, and players that have made hockey an essential part of this Grey County community. With archival photos, and a selection of hockey artefacts from the Grey Roots collection, this exhibit is sure to delight hockey of all ages.

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NOTICE OF MUNICIPAL ELECTION – October 26, 2026 INFORMATION FOR VOTERS

WHO MAY VOTE?

Any person who on election day (October 26, 2026) meets the following qualifications is eligible to vote:

1. Is a Canadian citizen;
2. Is at least 18 years old on election day;
3. Resides in the municipality or is the owner or tenant of land in the local municipality, or the spouse of such a person;
Non-residential commercial or industrial property electors are not entitled to vote for school board trustees but are entitled to vote for other municipal offices or questions.
4. Any person not prohibited by law from voting.

WHAT SCHOOL BOARD DO I VOTE FOR?

Electors are entitled to vote for school boards if their qualifying property is residential. Each eligible elector may vote for school representation once in a school board jurisdiction.

The following is a list of the School Boards for which qualified electors will be entitled to vote unless there are acclamations.

1. **Bluewater District School Board** (anyone can support)
2. **Bruce Grey Catholic District School Board** (must be Roman Catholic)
3. **Conseil scolaire Viamonde** (must have French Language Education Rights)
4. **Conseil scolaire catholique Providence** (must be Roman Catholic and have French Language Education Rights)

VOTERS' LIST INFORMATION

Until August 12, 2026, voters are encouraged to confirm, register or amend your voter information via Elections Ontario, www.RegisterToVoteON.ca.

From September 1, 2026, to October 26, 2026, voters may contact the Town of The Blue Mountains, Clerks Office to confirm, amend or be added to the Voters' List.

INTERNET & TELEPHONE VOTING

There will be no advance poll or proxy voting, as both Internet and Telephone Voting allow voters to cast a ballot anytime between Friday, October 16, 2026, at 10:00 a.m. and Monday, October 26, 2026, at 8:00 p.m. Voter Information Letters will be mailed to electors at the beginning of October and will include voter credentials and instructions on how to vote.

During the Voting Period, October 16, 2026 to October 26, 2026, the Election Help Centre will be available in the Town of The Blue Mountains, Town Hall. At the Election Help Centre, Electors can:

- Register to vote
- Receive voting assistance or vote independently
