



100+ Women Who Care Receives \$17,712 in Tim Hortons Smile Cookie Campaign Proceeds

100+ Women Who Care South Georgian Triangle has received \$17,712.38 from the Tim Hortons Smile Cookie Campaign, made possible by participating Tim Hortons restaurants in Wasaga Beach and the generosity of community members, volunteers, and supporters.

The funds will support the chapter's operational needs for the next three years, helping ensure that 100% of member donations continue to flow directly to local charities.

In keeping with the chapter's commitment to community impact, \$10,000 will be shared among member-nominated, vetted charities serving Wasaga Beach. The recipients and funding allocations will be announced at the chapter's upcoming meeting on Wednesday, September 23.

The September 23 meeting will also launch the chapter's 10th anniversary season of giving. Along with announcing the recipients of the Wasaga Beach funding, members will hear presentations from three local charities and vote to select one to receive a collective donation expected to exceed \$20,000.

"As we celebrate 10 years of giving, we are reminded of the simple idea at the heart of our chapter: when women give together, individual contributions can make a significant difference," said Campbell. "This meeting will celebrate what our members and community partners have made possible while beginning the next chapter of our collective impact."

Online Portal Speeds Access To Well Water Test Results For Grey-Bruce Residents

Public Health Ontario has rolled out a new Online Water Testing Portal, which provides Grey-Bruce households on wells and other private drinking water systems a faster, more streamlined option for accessing water-testing results.

By using the portal, residents can submit sample information and receive results online within two to four business days, rather than having to fill out and send in a paper form and wait for the results to arrive by mail.

"Grey Bruce Public Health is pleased to support the local uptake of the Online Water Testing Portal. This electronic option aims to improve turnaround times for people using Public Health Ontario's complimentary well water testing program and reduce manual submission errors, which can lead to rejected samples," says Andrew Barton, Senior Public Health Manager at Grey Bruce Public Health.

GBPH collaborates with Public Health Ontario (PHO) and local municipalities to offer the well water testing program in Grey-Bruce.

Residents can pick up water sample collection kits and drop off samples at 14 locations throughout the area.

Samples dropped off at the Owen Sound and Walkerton locations are transported each weekday to a PHO laboratory for testing.

A courier contracted by GBPH picks up samples from the other 12 locations and then hands them over to the PHO courier for transportation to a laboratory. Samples are picked up on Wednesdays from the Bruce County locations and on Thursdays from the Grey County locations.

Samples must be tested within 48 hours of collection.

PHO tests samples taken from private water sources, such as wells, cisterns, or treated lake water, for the bacterial indicators of contamination, specifically E. coli and total coliforms, which can make people sick and can even be fatal.

GBPH recommends testing private drinking water sources at least three times a year, after any work is done to a well or water system, and after significant weather events, such as a fast thaw or severe rainstorm.

Residents who use the new Online Water Testing Portal can enter their information and sample details into an electronic form. Once the test is completed, they can receive their water test report electronically through the portal.

Town of The Blue Mountains Announces Organizational Realignment to Support Service Delivery and Growth

The Town of The Blue Mountains is sharing the following message from Chief Administrative Officer Adam Smith:

As part of the Town's commitment to service excellence, accountability and continuous improvement, several organizational realignments will be implemented. These changes are intended to better align responsibilities, strengthen collaboration and support the Town's evolving operational, infrastructure and growth management needs.

The changes support the Town's new Corporate Strategic Plan by aligning internal resources and responsibilities with the delivery of reliable municipal services, responsible growth and sound infrastructure.

Within the **Operations Department**, the delivery of water, wastewater, roads and drainage services will be more closely aligned with the teams responsible for the day-to-day operation, maintenance and renewal of these critical municipal assets. This structure will strengthen the focus on asset management, preventative maintenance and long-term operational planning to support reliable, sustainable service delivery.

The Town's Planning & Building Services Department will be renamed **Planning & Growth Management**. The Engineering function within the department will have an expanded focus on development review, infrastructure planning and growth-related capital projects. The revised structure is intended to better connect development approvals with the implementation of infrastructure requirements to support both the Town's current and future needs.

Additional changes to align corporate support functions with related operational areas include:

Fleet and Facilities shifting to **Community Services** bringing responsibility for municipal buildings, vehicles and related assets closer to the department that delivers and maintains many community-facing facilities and amenities. It aligns with the Strategic Plan's objectives to create opportunities for active living, leisure and community building and ensure municipal infrastructure is reliable, resilient and meets community needs.

Information Technology will shift to **Strategic Initiatives** and better connect technology services with the Town's broader work in corporate modernization, innovation, performance measurement and service improvement. This alignment will support more coordinated digital planning and implementation, helping the Town use data, digital tools and modern technology to improve internal efficiency, strengthen evidence-based decision-making and enhance the resident experience. The Corporate Strategic Plan identifies continuous improvement, transparent and evidence-based governance and modernized performance measurement as key components of an effective and responsive organization.

Following recruitment of the new Director of Operations and Director of Planning and Growth Management, **By-law Services** will be realigned to Administration and report directly to the Chief Administrative Officer. This change supports the Corporate Strategic Plan's priority of Accountable & Transparent Government by strengthening corporate oversight in the administration and enforcement of municipal by-laws.

Collectively, these changes are intended to support clearer accountability, strengthen cross-department collaboration, and position the Town to continue delivering effective services while supporting future growth, infrastructure investment, and community priorities.

The Town of The Blue Mountains would like to advise residents of changes to the sample pick-up schedule for the Grey Bruce Public Health Unit's voluntary well water testing program.

Beginning in September, samples will be picked up weekly from Ravenna Hall at 10:00 a.m. each Thursday. The first day of the new pick-up schedule will be Thursday, September 3. Samples must be dropped off within 24 hours of the pick-up time. Ravenna Hall will be open for sample bottle pick-up or drop-off on Wednesdays from 7:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. Water testing is free and part of a complimentary program offered by Public Health Ontario for residents on wells and other private systems. For more information regarding private drinking water testing, please visit the Public Health Grey Bruce website.

If you are connected to the Municipal Drinking Water supply and would like to have your drinking water tested, please contact the Water & Wastewater Division to arrange to have a sample collected.

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Ontario Launches Student and Family Support Offices in Simcoe-Grey

The Ontario government is expanding Student and Family Support Offices to all 72 school boards across the province, giving parents and families a clear, effective way to get help regarding their child's education and find solutions faster. Today, Brian Saunderson, MPP for Simcoe-Grey, announced that all school boards in Simcoe-Grey now have Student and Family Support Offices in place, providing families with an additional way to get answers on broader community concerns, navigate complex issues and receive the information and support they need. This initiative is one more way the government is delivering on its broader plan to make school boards more accountable and focused on student success with a back-to-basics approach that strengthens student achievement and prepares them for rewarding careers.

"Our schools and educators do excellent work every day supporting students and families in our communities," said MPP Saunderson. "These new offices will provide parents with an additional resource when more complex concerns arise, helping families navigate the education system and get the support they need. I'm pleased to see this additional support now available across Simcoe-Grey."

Student and Family Support Offices review concerns raised by parents to help address matters that need to be escalated following initial engagement with a child's teacher and principal. As part of their mandate, these offices streamline the response process for families by acknowledging inquiries within two business days and aiming to provide an answer within five business days. School boards are also expected to ensure responses to parent inquiries are conducted in a clear manner that is easily understood by a parent and include relevant and accurate information that addresses the specific inquiry.

This will make the education system more responsive and accessible for families by ensuring existing resources can be directed to help students, parents and families navigate the education system and make sure their concerns are addressed. The Ministry of Education will collect information regularly from all 72 school boards to identify patterns and trends about the types of concerns parents are raising, helping to find ways to improve processes so students and families receive better support.

Student and Family Support Offices have already been operating in supervised school boards, with 95 per cent of family inquiries acknowledged within two business days and nearly 90 per cent receiving a response within five business days or an estimated response date for more complex matters. The experience from these offices has helped inform the expansion of this consistent approach to all school boards across the province.

QUICK FACTS

Ontario is providing historic levels of education funding in 2026-27, with an investment of \$30.6 billion in Core Education Funding to focus key resources where they matter most: on student success.

For the 2026-27 school year, Ontario is making changes to strengthen student achievement and deliver more consistent learning experiences across the province that prepare students for the jobs of tomorrow.

A Telephone/Internet Voting method will be used for the 2026 Municipal Election.

8.1.1 The Voting System provided by Simply Voting Inc. shall allow Electors to vote using a telephone or the internet. Electors shall be required to access a designated internet address or telephone a designated number in order to cast their Ballot.

8.1.2 Every Elector shall be limited to only one vote through the use of a PIN distributed via Canada Post Lettermail in a sealed and personalized Voter Information Letter, or issued in person by an Election Official or by email or telephone in extenuating circumstances by the Clerk as necessary. Every Elector shall be required to provide their date of birth along with their PIN.

8.1.3 Following the voter's selection for all offices on a single composite Ballot, the Voting System shall identify the voter's choices and provide the voter with the option of changing or confirming their vote selections prior to submission.

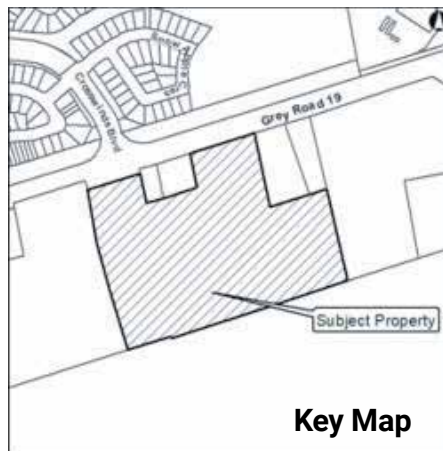

Request for Minister's Zoning Order (MZO)

The Town of The Blue Mountains has received from the owner of the property a request for support from Town Council of a Request to the Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing for an MZO that would allow a rental housing project subject to applicant proposed site specific provisions on this property.

The property, located at 796060 Grey Road 19, is a 9.95 HA parcel located west and south of the intersection of Grey Roads 19 and 21, south of the intersection of Crosswinds Blvd and Grey Rd 19, and near the Blue Mountain Resort.

What is being proposed?

The applicant seeks to permit a rental housing development on lands currently designated Future Secondary Plan and zoned Development (D) zone by way of a proposed Minister's Zoning Order including but not limited to:

- up to 646 apartment dwellings, associated accessory uses and limited resident-serving commercial uses on the developable portion of the lands;
- building heights of 5 storeys located closer to Grey Road 19 and 6 storeys located further into the site.
- site specific parking standards of 1.2 spaces per residential unit;
- protection of wetland, hazard, and open-space portions of the site to be protected through appropriate zoning; and
- detailed matters such as building placement, landscaping, grading, servicing, parking, pedestrian circulation, and urban design would be addressed through future Site Plan Control and other required approvals.

Please note: The subject lands are proposed to be regulated by a MZO issued by the Province of Ontario under Section 47 of the Planning Act. The MZO establishes the permitted land uses and development standards for the property and prevails over the Town's Zoning By-law where there is a conflict. The Province's decision to issue an MZO is not subject to appeal to the Ontario Land Tribunal.

The Public Meeting is your chance to hear more about the proposal and make your views about it known. Any person or agency may provide comments on this matter in writing or verbally at the Public Meeting. Comments at the Public Meeting assist the Town and Council in their decision-making process, so be sure to have your say!

Public Meeting: Request for Ministers Zoning Order (MZO)

What is a Minister's Zoning Order (MZO)?

A Minister's Zoning Order, commonly referred to as an MZO, is a zoning order made by the Ontario Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing under Section 47 of the Planning Act. An MZO can regulate the use of land, buildings, and structures and may establish zoning permissions directly, without the need for a municipal Official Plan Amendment and/or Zoning By-law Amendment. In this case, the requested MZO would establish the principle of land use, maximum density, maximum height, and related zoning standards for the subject lands. It has been submitted that the MZO is being requested to enable the timely delivery of purpose-built rental housing while still requiring subsequent technical review through processes such as Site Plan Approval and any required agency permits. A decision by the Minister to approve an MZO is not appealable to the Ontario Land Tribunal.

Application Process

The proposed MZO request is being considered as an alternative to the conventional planning approvals process, which would otherwise involve completion of a Secondary Plan, followed by applications for Official Plan Amendment, Zoning By-law Amendment, and Site Plan Approval. The subject lands are located within a Future Secondary Plan Area and that there is currently no approved Secondary Plan for the lands. If supported by Council and ultimately a decision made by the Ontario Minister, the MZO would establish the zoning framework for the property.

An information report summarizing the proposal, information received, and next steps will be presented at an upcoming Committee of the Whole meeting. Following that a Public Meeting to receive community feedback will be advertised and scheduled. Next, a recommendation report will be provided to Council for their consideration in order to receive a Council resolution on the project. More information can be found below on this webpage with additional information coming forward in the upcoming Planning Staff Report.

Proposed Concept Plan

Please note that the applicant has provided the concept plan shown below and they have further advised that it is for illustrative purposes only and does not represent the final site design. It demonstrates one possible development scenario, including general development potential and environmental protection areas. The requested Minister's Zoning Order establishes the zoning framework and development limits for the site. If approved, a future Site Plan Approval application would be required to determine the final site layout and detailed design in accordance with the MZO.

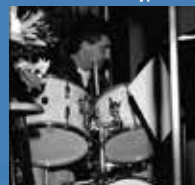
