Town Seeking Feedback on Bayview Park Parking Lot Designs

The Town of The Blue Mountains has launched a public survey to present and collect feedback on the concept designs for the new formalized gravel parking lot at Bayview Park in Thornbury. The parking area is being constructed to replace the former layby area near the pavilion.

The Town's Community Services Department has prepared two options for the future parking area. The designs have been put together with a focus on providing accessibility while maintaining greenspace. Results of the survey will be consolidated and used to inform a Staff Report which is anticipated to be presented to Council on Monday, October 5, 2026.

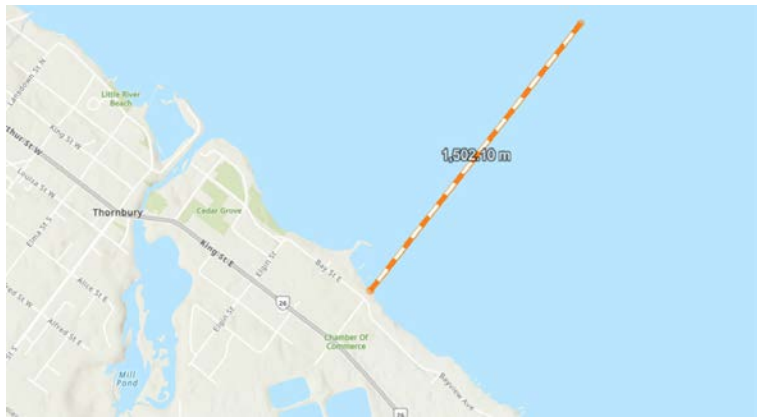

Implementation of Night-Shift Dredging Operations and Extension of In-Water Work Permit

The Town of The Blue Mountains would like to provide the public with an update on the schedule for the remaining work on the installation of the new outfall for the Thornbury Wastewater Treatment Plant.

The project contractor has recently implemented a three-barge operation to increase the rate of offshore trenching and dredging work. Despite these additional resources, challenging lakebed conditions, water conditions and machinery downtime continue to affect daily production rates.

To help advance the work, the contractor will be introducing night-shift dredging operations beginning Friday, September 11. The night shift will operate from 7:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m. using the primary barge and excavator only. This approach will allow offshore trenching activities to operate on a near-continuous basis, subject to weather conditions and established safety requirements. Overnight work will begin approximately 290 metres offshore and will progress into deeper water over time. Work closer to the shoreline will be completed during daytime hours only. All work will continue to be carried out in accordance with applicable approvals and environmental protection measures.

The public may notice additional activity and lighting associated with the offshore work during overnight hours. The Town recognizes this may affect nearby residents and lake users and appreciates the community's patience as the project team works to complete this critical infrastructure project.

The Town has also received approval from the Department of Fisheries and Oceans, Ministry of Natural Resources and Grey Sauble Conservation Authority to extend the in-water work permit until Wednesday, October 14, 2026.

The Town, its engineering consultant and contractors remain committed to completing the work as efficiently and safely as possible. Project updates will continue to be posted to the Town's project web page and emailed directly to project subscribers.

September 17, 2026 - Approximately 310 metres of the trench has been excavated to full depth. The final 100 metres of the trenched portion requires minimal digging. Two barges are working in tandem on the remaining portion, with the third barge completing trench cleanup as conditions allow.

UPDATES TO PRIVATE DRINKING WATER TESTING DROP-OFF SCHEDULE

The Town of The Blue Mountains would like to advise residents of changes to the sample pick-up schedule for the Grey Bruce Public Health Unit's voluntary well water testing program.

Beginning in September, samples will be picked up weekly from Ravenna Hall at 10:00 a.m. each Thursday. The first day of the new pick-up schedule will be Thursday, September 3. Samples must be dropped off within 24 hours of the pick-up time. Ravenna Hall will be open for sample bottle pick-up or drop-off on Wednesdays from 7:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. Water testing is free and part of a complimentary program offered by Public Health Ontario for residents on wells and other private systems. For more information regarding private drinking water testing, please visit the Public Health Grey Bruce website.

If you are connected to the Municipal Drinking Water supply and would like to have your drinking water tested, please contact the Water & Wastewater Division to arrange to have a sample collected.

Community Improvement Plan

Community Improvement Plans (CIPs) are planning and economic development tools available under the Planning Act that enable municipalities to encourage private-sector investment, support housing objectives, stimulate economic growth and advance community revitalization through targeted financial incentives.

In 2021, Town Council approved two CIPs: the Town-Wide Revitalization CIP and the Housing Within Reach CIP. Since their approval, the Town has completed four intake periods and received more than 38 applications. Of those, 35 received funding approval and 29 advanced to executed agreements. As of August 2026, the Town has issued \$241,186.28 in funding for completed projects, supporting total project costs of \$531,834.33 and leveraging approximately \$290,648.05 in private-sector investment.

Through the administration of the existing programs, staff identified opportunities to broaden the eligibility, improve program accessibility and better align program offerings with evolving Town priorities and community needs. In response, Council approved funding through the 2025 budget to undertake a comprehensive review and update of the Town's existing CIPs. Following a competitive procurement process, NPG Planning Solutions was retained to complete the review, with support from Tim Welch Consulting and Parcel Economics. The review included detailed analysis of housing needs, economic development opportunities, market conditions, municipal best practices and the effectiveness of the Town's existing incentive programs.

The updated Community Improvement Plan directly supports the Town's Corporate Strategic Plan by providing a flexible framework to

encourage attainable housing, stimulate private-sector investment, strengthen local businesses, support agricultural and tourism diversification, and advance community revitalization efforts. By modernizing and expanding the Town's financial incentive programs, the CIP helps reduce barriers to investment, improves program accessibility and administration, and provides Council with a strategic tool to respond to evolving community needs while advancing a broad range of housing, economic development, and organizational excellence objectives.

The resulting Community Improvement Plan, *Reaching our Peak*, consolidates and builds upon the Town's previous CIPs through a single, comprehensive framework designed to support attainable housing, economic development, business revitalization, agriculture, agritourism and community improvement initiatives across the municipality.

Initiative: 2.1.2 - Strengthen the community Improvement Plan and land use planning tools to support affordable housing development

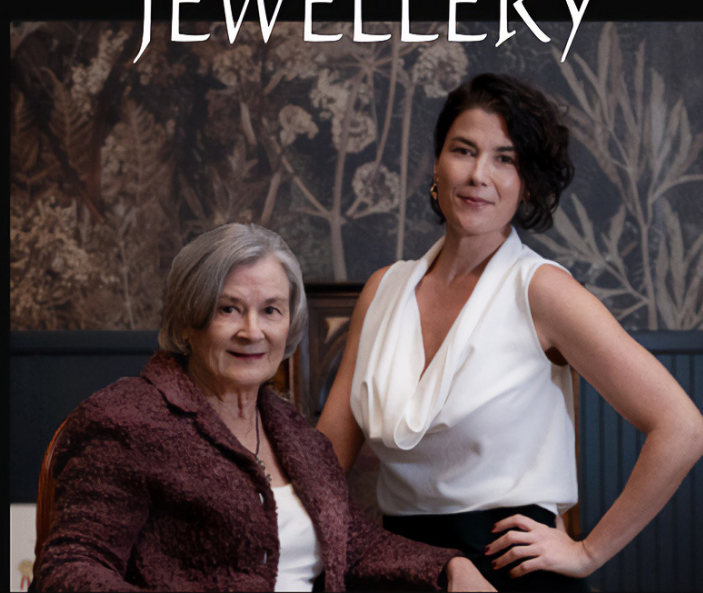

for opportunities to reduce or eliminate barriers for local business success.

Objective: 4.2 - Promote economic diversification to build a resilient economy, including agriculture.

Initiative: 4.2.1 - Develop an agriculture subsector strategy as proposed in the Economic Development Action Plan to support agritourism, agri-food innovation and other business diversification opportunities within the agricultural sector.

The Community Improvement Plan establishes a framework through which financial incentives may be offered to support economic development, community revitalization and attainable housing initiatives. Approval of this updated CIP does not commit Council to any expenditures, as every qualified application will come before council for formal consideration and approval.

Approximately \$1.25 million is currently available in the Town's CIP reserve, with additional funds scheduled to be transferred into the reserve as a result of land and property sales completed through 2026. These funds are intended to be directed towards housing-related incentives within the CIP.

CIP applications will be considered subject to available funding and in accordance with the approval authorities established by Council.

Future funding allocations will continue to be reviewed through the annual budget process. Council retains the ability to adjust funding levels, activate or deactivate programs, and establish future program priorities based on community needs and program performance.

Two months ago, we shared that Hundred Acre Wood was searching for a permanent home. We're so happy to share that we found it.

We've secured nearly 50 acres on the Niagara Escarpment, where children can continue to learn as they always have here: outdoors, in every season, with the land as their classroom. Less than 1% will be built on. The rest will remain open and wild.

With our current lease ending in September 2027, our next chapter is already underway: building the school that will make this our permanent home, and, in time, help address our waitlist of more than 200 families seeking childcare.

Hundred Acre Wood has committed the first \$700,000 toward the \$1.4-million project. We're inviting our community to help us build the other half.

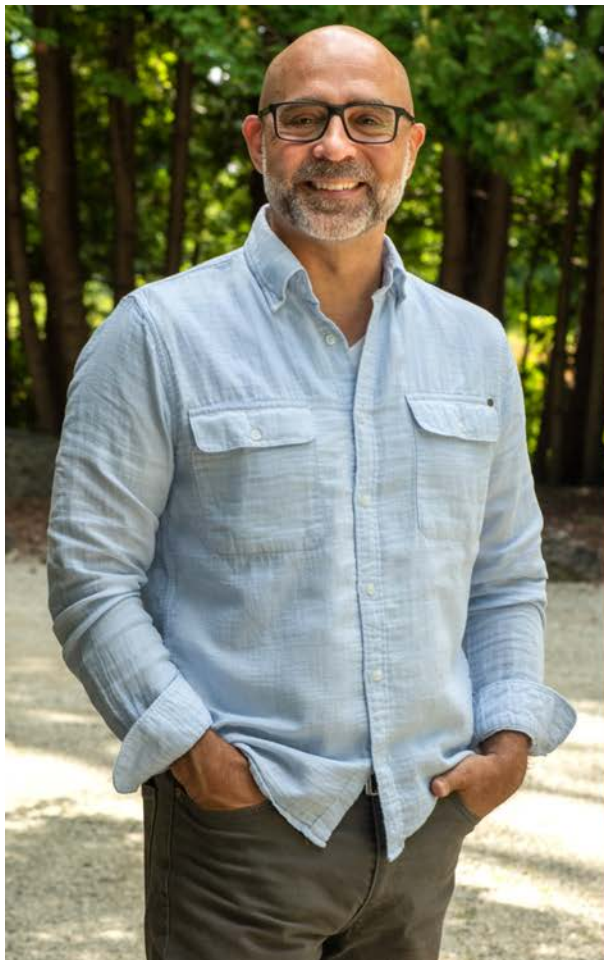

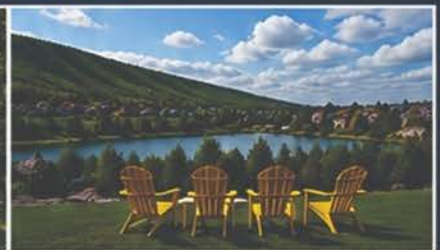

A Telephone/Internet Voting method will be used for the 2026 Municipal Election.

8.1.1 The Voting System provided by Simply Voting Inc. shall allow Electors to vote using a telephone or the internet. Electors shall be required to access a designated internet address or telephone a designated number in order to cast their Ballot.

8.1.2 Every Elector shall be limited to only one vote through the use of a PIN distributed via Canada Post Lettermail in a sealed and personalized Voter Information Letter, or issued in person by an Election Official or by email or telephone in extenuating circumstances by the Clerk as necessary. Every Elector shall be required to provide their date of birth along with their PIN.

8.1.3 Following the voter's selection for all offices on a single composite Ballot, the Voting System shall identify the voter's choices and provide the voter with the option of changing or confirming their vote selections prior to submission.

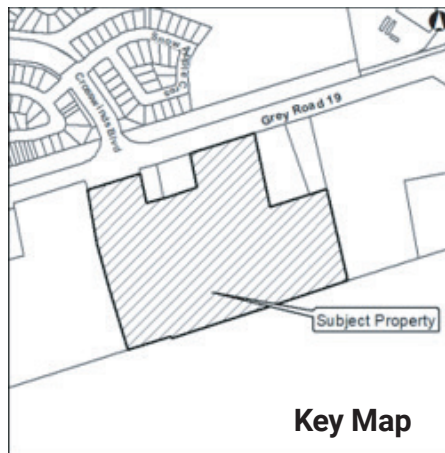

Request for Minister's Zoning Order (MZO)

The Town of The Blue Mountains has received from the owner of the property a request for support from Town Council of a Request to the Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing for an MZO that would allow a rental housing project subject to applicant proposed site specific provisions on this property.

The property, located at 796060 Grey Road 19, is a 9.95 HA parcel located west and south of the intersection of Grey Roads 19 and 21, south of the intersection of Crosswinds Blvd and Grey Rd 19, and near the Blue Mountain Resort.

What is being proposed?

The applicant seeks to permit a rental housing development on lands currently designated Future Secondary Plan and zoned Development (D) zone by way of a proposed Minister's Zoning Order including but not limited to:

- up to 646 apartment dwellings, associated accessory uses and limited resident-serving commercial uses on the developable portion of the lands;
- building heights of 5 storeys located closer to Grey Road 19 and 6 storeys located further into the site.
- site specific parking standards of 1.2 spaces per residential unit;
- protection of wetland, hazard, and open-space portions of the site to be protected through appropriate zoning; and
- detailed matters such as building placement, landscaping, grading, servicing, parking, pedestrian circulation, and urban design would be addressed through future Site Plan Control and other required approvals.

Please note: The subject lands are proposed to be regulated by a MZO issued by the Province of Ontario under Section 47 of the Planning Act. The MZO establishes the permitted land uses and development standards for the property and prevails over the Town's Zoning By-law where there is a conflict. The Province's decision to issue an MZO is not subject to appeal to the Ontario Land Tribunal.

The Public Meeting is your chance to hear more about the proposal and make your views about it known. Public Meeting: Request for Ministers Zoning Order (MZO)

What is a Minister's Zoning Order (MZO)?

A Minister's Zoning Order, commonly referred to as an MZO, is a zoning order made by the Ontario Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing under Section 47 of the Planning Act. An MZO can regulate the use of land, buildings, and structures and may establish zoning permissions directly, without the need for a municipal Official Plan Amendment and/or Zoning By-law Amendment. In this case, the requested MZO would establish the principle of land use, maximum density, maximum height, and related zoning standards for the subject lands. It has been submitted that the MZO is being requested to enable the timely delivery of purpose-built rental housing while still requiring subsequent technical review through processes such as Site Plan Approval and any required agency permits. A decision by the Minister to approve an MZO is not appealable to the Ontario Land Tribunal.

Application Process

The proposed MZO request is being considered as an alternative to the conventional planning approvals process, which would otherwise involve completion of a Secondary Plan, followed by applications for Official Plan Amendment, Zoning By-law Amendment, and Site Plan Approval. The subject lands are located within a Future Secondary Plan Area and that there is currently no approved Secondary Plan for the lands. If supported by Council and ultimately a decision made by the Ontario Minister, the MZO would establish the zoning framework for the property.

An information report summarizing the proposal, information received, and next steps will be presented at an upcoming Committee of the Whole meeting. Following that a Public Meeting to receive community feedback will be advertised and scheduled. Next, a recommendation report will be provided to Council for their consideration in order to receive a Council resolution on the project. More information can be found below on this webpage with additional information coming forward in the upcoming Planning Staff Report.

Proposed Concept Plan

Please note that the applicant has provided the concept plan shown below and they have further advised that it is for illustrative purposes only and does not represent the final site design. It demonstrates one possible development scenario, including general development potential and environmental protection areas. The requested Minister's Zoning Order establishes the zoning framework and development limits for the site. If approved, a future Site Plan Approval application would be required to determine the final site layout and detailed design in accordance with the MZO.

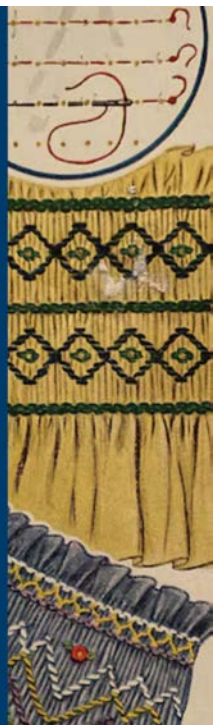
