Coleshill Town Recent History



Coleshill were promoted to the Midland Alliance, their highest ever level on the non-league pyramid, for the start of the 2008/09 season. They finished their first season in the Alliance in 11th place and won the Tony Allden Trophy.. but fifteen games into the 2009/10 season Carl Adams stood down quoting family and work commitments the reason for his departure. Neil Kitching and Martin Socket were quickly installed as a joint management team and finished in a creditable 8th place.

Coleshill made headlines in the non-league papers and even some daily papers in 2009 when Wilson Palacios moved from Wigan Athletic to Tottenham Hotspur for £14 million. It appears that the Honduran International had made his first ever appearance in England at Coleshill's Pack Meadow ground whilst on trial with Birmingham City. The game had hastily been arranged specifically to see if Palacios could make the grade, 45 minutes and two goals later, it was decided he definitely would!

Kitching and Socket's potential was quickly noticed and they were snapped up by Rushall Olympic during that summer, and so Carl Adams was asked to once again take the reigns for the 2010/11 season and an almost identical record as the previous year saw Coleshill finish in 12th place. That season Dosthill Colts had become tenants at Pack Meadow but they had become the dominant force on the committee, especially when Paul Woodford stepped down and Dostill's Paul Billing became Coleshill's Chairman. Nigel Jones had took a back seat and even put the ground up for sale and so the future of the club seemed uncertain but fortunately Coleshill Town Football Club were able to take their place in the Midland Alliance for the start of the 2011/12 season to maintain their 126 years of football in the town.

Unfortunatley it was a campaign that saw Coleshill flirt with relegation and another year in the Midland Alliance was only confirmed in the penultimate game of the season with a win over Dunkirk. Manager Carl Adams resigned shortly after the last game and was quickly replaced by his previous assistant Jason Lanns, his first taste of management. The 2012/13 season didn't start too well and Lanns stood down! Andy Reece, exprofessional with Walsall and Bristol Rovers took over for three games but left for a full time scouting job at Northampton Town. Chairman Paul Billing took charge of the first team for a couple of games whilst deliberating over who to recruit as manager and take the club forward. Billing finally put his faith in Youth Team Manager Paul Casey. Casey had a job on his hands as Coleshill were in real danger of relegation, but he came through and Midland Alliance status was secured with one game to spare! 2013/14. Casey's first full season, was a record breaking one! Town finished the season in 4th place, the highest position in the club's 129 year history! In the FA Vase Coleshill reached the 4th round and were disappointed to lose to Dunston Uts, one of the favourites, after extra time.

Expectations had risen due to this one season and 2014/15 didn't disappoint. Another record breaking season saw Town finish Runners-Up to Basford United. The Colemen also reached the Semi Final of both the League Cup and the Birmingham Senior Cup finally losing to Birmingham City in a penalty shoot-out. Striker Shane Benjamin became the clubs all time leading goalscorer with 47 and took the League Golden Boot title.

Coleshill Town Recent History



2015/16 started with a 5-2 hammering at title rivals Sporting Khalsa but manager Paul Casey was slowly building a squad capable of competing for trophies. Town reached the 3rd Qualifying Round of the FA Cup, the 4th Round of the FA Vase and the Quarter Final of the League Cup. A 5th place finish was below par but Coleshill finished strongly with seven wins from their last ten games.

2016/17 was possibly the best season in the club's history. In November Paul Casey was head-hunted by Hednesford Town and his assistant Simon Lyons took charge and masterminded an incredible winning streak that took the Town to Runners-Up in the League for the second time in four years, but the highlight was the fabulous run in the FA Vase that finally came to an end just one step from Wembley at the hands of odds-on favourites South Shields. The Semi Final First Leg at Pack Meadow attracted a club record crowd of 1755. However, when the season came to a close Chairman Paul Billing released Simon Lyons. Several of the FA Vase squad moved on and Cameron Stuart was installed as the new Manager.

2017/18. With Cameron Stuart installed as manager Coleshill squad was rebuild during preseason. As the season progressed the title league title and promotion appeared to be between Bromsgrove Sporting and Coleshill. But just as it was confirmed that runners-up would also be promoted, Coleshill stuttered slightly and Highgate Utd came with a tremendous run. Bromsgrove won the league but li came down to the last game of the season for the second promotion place. Coleshill needed to win at Shawbury Utd, who themselves needed a win to avoid relegation. Coleshill duly won and were promoted to step 4 for the first time in the history 2018/19 was a step into the unknown. Playing at Step 4 for the first time against clubs with larger crowds better facilities, bigger budgets, who knew how Coleshill would get on. The aim was to avoid relegation an consolidate in the new league. Well Cameron and his squad excelled and until the penultimate weekend of the season Coleshill were still in with a chance of making the play-offs. But it was not to be and Coleshill finished a very creditable 9th place in the league.

For the 2019/20 season Coleshill were lying in 14th place after 28 games when Covid struck and cut the season short.

The 2020/21 season was cut even shorter with just eight League games played with Coleshill in 13th place. However the season will be remembered for the first win for CTFC in the FA Trophy. Town beat Wisbech in the 2nd Quailifier Round and went on to beat Bromsgrove Sporting in the 3rd Qualifier, then Matlock Town in the First Round Proper, before being embarrassingly dumped out by Telford United 10-1 in the 2nd Round.

For the 2021/22 season Coleshill were moved sideways to the newly formed Northern Premier League Midland Division and finished in 7th place, JUST missing out on the Play Offs by two places. After getting knocked out of the FA Cup in the very first round for the previous three seasons, Coleshill finally got a win over their old rivals Highgate United but lost out to Long Eaton United in the next round.

The 2022/23 season saw Coleshill make the Play offs, finishing in 5th place which saw them play Halesowen, who had finished Runners Up, in the Semi Final but lost 3-1. Halesowen went on to beat Spalding in the Final to gain promotion. For the 23/24 season Cameron Stuart started his 7th season in charge at CTFC with the intension of promotion following going so close the previous season and put together a squad worthy of the step up but after just seven games he decided to move to Coleshill's near neighbours and rivals, Sutton Coldfield Town. Some players left to join Stuart, some left to go elsewhere but the squad was a shadow of the side that just missed out on promotion just months before. Chairman Paul Billing brought in Dave Stringer but he lasted just a few games and decided the role was too much for him. Chairman Billing turned to goalkeeping legend Paul Hathaway, over 500 games for CTFC, but results were still poor and Billing made the very brave decision to let Hathaway go and bring in ex Halesowen coach Craig Nichols to rescue a dying season. Nichols is a good coach but the side continued to drop down the league table, relegation became a real possibility. Coleshill travelled to Championship contenders Spalding Town on the last day of the season, safe from the drop but suffered the humiliation of an 8-0 thrashing. The next day Nichols resigned leaving Coleshill without a manager for the 4th time in the season. Coleshill Town have only ever been relegated once in their entire 139 year history, 1999/2000, but they bounced straight back the next season. The 2023/24 season must rank well up there with the worst season EVER!

So what happened in 2024/25? Chairman Billing wasted no time in replacing Craig Nichols with Grant Joshua who from the minute he walked in the door lifted the clubs spirits, brought in some excellent talent, and if pre-season was anything to go by: Played 6 Won 6 Goals For 26 Against 3 SO FAR we were in for a much better season than the last one. And so it proved to be. Grant brought stability to the club but the team lacked some consistency. What promised to be a good season with playoff a real possibility petered out towards the end with what some would see as a disappointing season. However there were massive high points, our best run in the FA Trophy, taking some big scalps along the way and, of course, culminating in the season finale Walsall Senior Cup victory over Darlaston Town. For the final Grant had moved on to take up a post as manager at Rugby Town, who had been relegated from our league. but faithful club servant/player Gio Dainty stepped into the manager role and superbly guided the team to a memorable victory and the first silverware for a few years.

We now start the 2025/26 season with Harry Harris as manager, who has previous experience at Walsall Wood and Hednesford. Players have moved on and new ones on board so let us see what this season brings

Sporting Khalsa History



The club was established in 1991. Over the years the club has always played senior football in the local Walsall & District Sunday leagues. For two seasons between 1995 and 1997 the club played Saturday football at a semi-professional level.

It has enjoyed modest success throughout. From 1991 to 1997 it used to have a small number of youth sides and gained considerable success within the season 1995/96 by winning the Birmingham boys Under 16 league. Due to lack of resources, both financial and manpower, it reluctantly abandoned the youth policy.

With a more solid foundation and re-organization of the executive committee in 2004, the club re-joined the West Midlands Regional League Division Two (semi-professional level seven league).

In season 2004/05 the first team gained promotion into Division One of West Midlands Regional League (FA League Pyramid Structure level six). It also restarted a youth policy this season. 2005 became a year to remember, as the club became the first Asian semi-professional football club in the country to own its own ground.

The decision to purchase the Abbey Park Stadium (formerly home to Bloxwich Town) was taken by the club as it needed a permanent base from which to build upon its successes and built a centre for footballing excellence. Walsall Football Club played a friendly to mark the official opening of the new ground. A ladies team was introduced in 2006 that played in the South Staffordshire League.

In 2007 the club played in the FA Vase for its first time and lost in the First Qualifying Round and also introduced a Veterans Over 35s side in the Central Warwickshire Over 35s League. After five years at Abbey Park ground, Sporting Khalsa announced in May 2010 that they would be purchasing the five acre freehold grounds of Willenhall Town FC from the Receivers. After extensive work on the pitch and social facilities with the total outlay of over half million pounds the stadium was finished on the eve of the 2010/11 season.

In its first season at their new Aspray Arena home the club gained promotion to the Premier Division of the West Midlands Regional League.2012/13 the club played in the FA Cup for its first time in its history and progressed to the First Qualifying round. Our Sunday team won the Warley Sunday Premier League and also progressed to the Fourth Round of the FA National Cup.

The following season the first team finished sixth in the league and were runners up in J W Hunt Charity Cup at the Molineux Stadium.

At the start of 2014/15 season we appointed our current manager Ian Rowe who promotion to Step 5 Midland Football League by winning the West Midlands Regional Premier League's in its 125th Anniversary year, with a record points total, on top of this they were crowned winners of the Staffs FA Vase too.

2015/16 season was our first season for the club at Step 5 saw us finish a credible third in the league. On top of this the club cemented it's place amongst the non-league fraternity with a memorable FA Cup run, missing out to another non-league giant FC United of Manchester for a place in the First Round Proper. The final game of the season saw us lift the JW Hunt Cup in its 90th year at Molineux. The season also saw the introduction of our Ladies and Girls teams with the Ladies first team playing the National Women's League.

2016/17 season saw us reach the Quarter-Finals of the FA Vase losing narrowly to Coleshill Town and also finish third in the League. The next season we finished fifth in the league.



which also included a new 300 seater stand and new changing rooms. Again we finished a creditable third in the league and won the J W Hunt Cup for the second time this time the Final was against Highgate United and again was played at Molineux.

Both the 2019/20 and 2020/21 never were completed due to the Covid-19 pandemic. 2019/20 season we were second in the league when the season were curtained in March 2020 and also reached the FA Vase Quarter-Final. 2020/21 season we were first in the league when the season was curtained in December 2020. Due to the re-structure of the National League at Stans 3.6 we gained promotion for the first time in our history to Pitching In Northern Premier.

Season 2018/19 saw the opening of the 3G stadia pitch with a total investment of £1 million

season was curtained in December 2020. Due to the re-structure of the National League at Steps 3-6 we gained promotion for the first time in our history to Pitching In Northern Premier League Midland Division (Step 4) on PPG over the two seasons, finishing top of the Midland League.

Season 2021/22 saw our men's first team in the Pitching In Northern Premier League Midland

Division the highest league the club has played in and had an impressive first season by finishing eighth. In the FA Cup, Khalsa progressed to the Second Qualifying Round eventually losing to Conference North side Kidderminster Harriers. It was our debut in the FA Trophy, Khalsa lost in the Third Qualifying Round to Rushall Olympic who did the double over Khalsa by beating Khalsa in the Final of the Walsall Senior Cup played at Bescot Stadium, which saw goalkeeper Sam Arnold given his marching orders after six minutes. 2022/23 saw the club finished in its highest league position, qualifying for the Northern Premier League Midland Division play-offs having finished in 4th place having occupied a top 5 spot for most of the season. Promotion hopes were dashed by a narrow 2-1 defeat at Spalding United in the playoff semi final just 3 days after beating the Tulips by the same score at home to confirm their play-off spot. FA Cup and FA Trophy hopes were ended at the first attempt by Boldmere St

Premier League Young Player of the Season. The 2023/24 season saw a four game winning start to the league season ended on August Bank Holiday Monday with inconsistent form and injury issues eventually leading to a 12th place finish. In the FA Cup the preliminary round tie with local rivals Darlaston Town was the featured game on the BBC marking their live TV debut with a 2-2 leading to replay which Khalsa won on penalties. The following round saw a narrow 1-0 defeat at step 3 Kettering Town while in the FA Trophy there was a 3rd qualifying round defeat at Stafford Rangers after wins over Grimsby Borough and Kidsgrove Athletic in the opening two rounds.

Michaels in both competitions while leading scorer Miracle Okafor was named the Northern

Last season the club ended just one place off the play-off places, just five points short of a chance of promotion with, ultimately, a four game losing streak prior to Christmas proving decisive. The FA Cup run ended at Basford United in the first qualifying round but wins over Coventry Sphinx, Nantwich Town, Harborough Town and Barwell in the FA Trophy saw a trip to National League North side Oxford City in the second round where a 5-0 defeat ended the run, albeit with a record setting run in the competition.

One of the highlights of the season was a visit from William, the Prince of Wales for a refereeing course held at the club with the royal visitor joining aspiring referees both in the classroom and on the field.

2025/26 will see Khalsa compete in the NPL West after lateral movement in the summer with an almost entirely new squad being assembled by manager Ian Rowe after only a handful of players remained from last season.

KIERON WHITTAKER Former Wednesfield midfielder who signed for Khalsa in February 2019 having spent the rest of the season at West Midlands Regional League side Wolverhampton Casuals. He made his first appearance for Khalsa in a 1-0 win against Lye Town in March 2019 and followed this with a string of impressive performances which he wrapped up by scoring his first goal in Khalsa colours during the 5-2 win against Dunkirk on the last day of the 2018-19 season.

GAZ SINGH A dynamic front-man with an excellent goalscoring record, Gaz was a prolific scorer for Smethwick and Tipton Town before clinching a move into the full-time game with Kidderminster Harriers in the summer of 2015. During his time at Aggborough he did well at National League level before moving on to Hednesford Town and Redditch United prior to his arrival at Rushall. After a spell with Sutton Coldfield Town, he returned to Rushall before joining Khalsa in March 2018. Injuries meant his contribution was restricted to four starts and three substitute appearances and a single goal (in the final game of the season against Dunkirk). Gaz returned to Khalsa for the start of the 2019-20 season scoring 13 goals.

PETER TAYLOR Young Midfielder joined from Southern Premier outfit Alvechurch in February 2023. Came through the junior ranks at West Bromwich Albion but missed most of the 2022/23 season due to a knee injury but made his return to action late in the 2023/24 season. An ankle injury last season sees him remain out of action as the new season begins.

KRISTIAN GREEN Joined the club in the summer of 2024 after helping Rushall Olympic to maintain the National League North status he helped them win in 2022/23. Has also previously featured for Stourbridge before moving on to Solihull Moors and Tamworth but made the decision to rejoin former manager lan Rowe having been part of his successful Gornal Athletic side that won the WMRL and reached the FA Vase quarter finals.

CHAY TILT A dynamic winger who rejoined the club in November having left in the summer of 2024 to sign for Hereford in the National League North. A former West Brom scholar has also featured for Stourbridge, Redditch United, Tamworth and Hednesford Town.

ANDRE LANDELL Striker who joined the club early in the season from Stourbridge and has made a huge contribution in the scoring charts this season. In 2013, he moved to the United States where he represented Tiffin University before making the switch to Michigan Bucks who were playing their trade in the North American Premier Development League. Since returning to England he has featured for Rushall Olympic, Alvechurch, Bromsgrove Sporting and Stratford Town along with multiple spells with the Glassboys.

TAYLOR TOWNSEND Forward player who signed in the summer from Worcester City with the former Wolves scholar having also appeared for Alvechurch and Tividale before his move to Khalsa.

NAREL PHILLIPS Young central defender who was released recently by West Bromwich Albion. LUKE SHEARER Forward who joins Khalsa for a second spell after appearing for Coventry Sphinx last season.

ZACHARIAS KOUROUYIANNI Central defender signed from local rivals Darlaston Town last season and has become a key part of the Khalsa backline.

RIO SAWYERS Another young defender signed in the summer after being released from Walsall's academy.

PRINCE HENRY Forward signed in the summer after spending last season with Bromsgrove Sporting. The former Bristol City youngster joins the club having previously played at Hungerford, Yate, Tiverton and Redditch United.

KARTELL DAWKINS A Leicester City youth product where he played in the Foxes U18s before having a loan spell with AFC Rushden & Diamonds. The midfield man moved to Bromsgrove Sporting permanently before making the jump to step 2 with Gloucester City. He has since appeared for Alvechurch and Redditch United as well as appearing for Rugby Town at step 4 last season.

BRADLEY BURGESS A young midfielder who signed in the summer after his release from Cheltenham Town's academy.

STAN ASOMUGHA A pacy striker who is also at home on either wing. After leaving the West Bromwich Albion academy he has featured for Alvechurch, Worcester Raiders & Hednesford Town before taking some time out of the game joining Bedworth United for the latter part of the 2024/25 season.

JUSTICE CAMPBELL Midfielder who signed in the summer of 25/26 and has previously spent time with Hereford, Pershore Town, Wolves Sporting and Lye Town. **COREY COOPER** Another signing in the summer of 25/26 and can play in both defence and midfield. Previously featured at this level for Walsall Wood and Boldmere St Michaels.

Coleshill Town staged a late comeback to edge past Worcester Raiders 2–1 in a tense FA Cup First Round Qualifying tie at Pack Meadow, booking their place in the next round with a performance that combined persistence, pace, and a touch of late drama.

The Colemen dominated possession throughout the first half, dictating the tempo and probing the Raiders' defence with intent. Yet despite two or three clear chances, the final ball often lacked precision, and shots on target were few and far between. Worcester absorbed the pressure, content to reach the interval level.

But the second half began with a sting. Just four minutes after the restart, a moment of hesitation in Coleshill's back line allowed Worcester to work the ball across the box. A clever pull-back found Jordan Murphy in space, and the forward made no mistake, calmly slotting past the keeper to give the visitors a surprise lead.

Coleshill responded with urgency. Their equaliser came on the hour mark, sparked by a blistering run down the right flank from Gyasi, who beat his marker and squared the ball to Alex McSkeane. With the keeper stranded, McSkeane tapped into an empty net to restore parity.

As the match wore on, the tension grew. Theo Rowe nearly stole the headlines with a dazzling solo run, weaving past two defenders before curling his shot just wide of the upright. But he wasn't done.

In the 89th minute, Rowe surged down the right once more, this time cutting outside his man and unleashing a low drive that snuck inside the near post — a goal worthy of winning any cup tie.

The final whistle confirmed Coleshill's passage to the next round, where they'll face Sporting Khalsa in the FA Trophy on 6th September, back at Pack Meadow. The Colemen faithful will be hoping for more magic — and fewer nervy finishes — as the cup journey continues.


