Jason is a seasoned Information Systems Professional; he is a co-founder of IT Force which performs IT Support on a day-to-day basis for families and individuals as well as a diverse array of companies across industries which include manufacturing; wholesale; real estate and finance - both at home and abroad.

Cybersecurity is ultimately about protecting government and corporate networks, striving to make it very difficult for hackers to find and exploit vulnerabilities. Cybercrime, on the other hand, tends to focus more on protecting individuals and families as they navigate online life. Ermanno Pascutto introduced our speaker-----Andrey Cavalcanti

Andrey has spent 20+ years at Microsoft leading and 'co-piloting' various projects with corporate and private clients. He manages a group of 100 colleagues across Canada who are working on the next generation of AI. 'Co-pilot' is one feature of Microsoft Clarity (helping businesses and private individuals understand website metrics and more to enhance their results for customers). Much has been written and spoken about AI in our lives and how we are/will be affected increasingly by AI.

Although we may not think about it, we are already using AI, for example, in our homes; cars; shopping at the grocery store; or booking a trip on our laptop. Our kids and grandkids may already be using video streaming platforms and other file hosting services.

Generative AI is a type of **artificial intelligence technology** that broadly describes machine learning systems capable of generating text, images, code or other types of content, often in response to a prompt entered by a user.

Artificial Intelligence (AI) is a field of computer science that enables machines to learn from experience, adapt to new inputs, and perform tasks similar to humans. Here's a breakdown:

- 1. What is AI?
 - **Definition**: AI allows computers to learn and solve problems almost like a person.
 - **Capabilities**: AI systems are trained on vast amounts of data and learn to identify patterns.
 - Examples: From chess-playing computers to self-driving cars, AI relies heavily on techniques like deep learning and natural language processing².

Current Applications of AI:

- Language and Image Recognition: AI systems now have comparable language and image recognition capabilities to humans.
- **Software Programming**: AI helps program the software we use and translates the texts we read.
- **Photorealistic Image Generation**: Systems like **DALL-** and **PaLM** produce stunning photorealistic images.
