Dr. Derek Peters, DVM – Veterinarian

This month, we welcome Dr. Derek Peters. Derek was born, raised, and schooled in Oakville. From age 5 into adulthood, he played on local hockey and soccer teams, including at the rep level. It was also here that he developed an affinity for animals along with a fascination with science and medicine.

His career path was clear – veterinary medicine would include the best of both worlds. He obtained his undergraduate and professional veterinary qualifications in Guelph. Additionally, he is also Fear Free[®] certified, taking the additional time and interest to reduce or remove anxiety triggers that can cause pets to become fearful at home, during transport, and at the veterinary hospital.

Derek spent the last few years honing his craft in Vancouver, B.C., both in a small animal general practice and in an emergency centre before coming home to Oakville where he and his colleagues practise at the Southeast Oakville Veterinary clinic. His special interests include Internal Medicine (the prevention, diagnosis, and treatment of internal diseases) & building lasting connections with people and their pets.

On September 21, Derek will chat with us on a variety of pet-related matters, including the signs and symptoms of pet aging; pet sciences; pet nutrition; choosing pets wisely and understanding ownership costs.

1.0 Minutes

A motion to accept the minutes of the July General Meeting was made by Paul Nelson and seconded by Peter Pretty. The minutes of the last meeting were then unanimously accepted.

2.0 Vice President Alex Murphy was not available but Mike Purcell let us know that former club member Peter Reidiger had moved to a seniors' home in Mississauga.

3.0 **Guests-** Peter Pretty introduced three guests, John Hinnen, William Simpson, and Ernest Ewaschuck.

4.0 Treasurer's Report

Ray Henrickson said the end of July bank balance is \$6,761.50 after minimal expenses.

Ray also did the 50/50 draw which was won by Tony Pinchen

5.0 Speakers

Tim O'Shea outlined the schedule of speakers for the coming months. Today's speaker will be Larry Cain- talking about his career and politics/corruption in the Olympics.

September speaker will be Dr. Derek Peters, Veterinarian October speaker will be Declan Keogh, Dale Lana School of Health, U of T - Investigative Journalism Bureau

November speaker will be Wendy Rinella, CEO of the Oakville Community Foundation –indigenous affairs in Oakville's history.

Jay Kell reintroduced our guest John Hinnen as he is a personal friend, originally meeting him in Naples, Florida but John has been a long time Oakville resident and part of Rogers Communications.

A tour of The Ireland House, 2168 Guelph Line, is planned for Sept. 28th, 11:00 AM followed by lunch at the Black Bull Pub which is only a short drive away. The entrance fee to the Ireland House is \$6 payable at the door.

The Christmas Lunch has been set for December 14th and will again be at the Oakville Golf Club.

7.0Website/Newsletter.

Gerry Pielsticker indicated that all of our events over the past 15 years will be on our web site. It will include all speakers, including Larry Cain, so any member can watch again or share with a spouse who may be interested.

8.0 Profiler- Ulrich Wichardt

Ulrich has been a member of the club since 2008, about 5 years after he officially retired.

Ulrich was born in Germany in 1938 and his family was thrilled when the American army came in and liberated them in 1945 only to be replaced by Russia army 6 weeks later as Germany was being divided up by East and West. The family escaped to the west in 1947 and eventually moved to Liverpool which is where Ulrich spent his formative years.

Ulrich earned an Engineering Degree from the University of London and then a short time later moved to France to learn to speak French. Being bilingual helped him secure a job in Montreal in 1965 and later moving to Toronto and Oakville in 1976. His long-time interest in sailing is still with him although he is not out on the water too often these days but still is active with the Walton United Church.

New Business

The nominating committee will be proposing a motion next month to nominate the individuals for the management positions for the 2023-24 year. This will be done by Alex Murphy as head of the nominating committee. If there is any member who would like to be considered for any of the management positions, please let Alex know before the next meeting.

Mike Purcell read an amendment to the bylaws as issued by Probus Canada. Article II.2 All clubs accredited after July 14, 2023, shall be open to all genders. Any single-gender club accredited prior to July 14, 2023, shall be exempt from this requirement.

9.0 SPEAKER



Tim O'Shea introduced today's speaker

Larry Cain started off by stating that he is a retired teacher, who just happens to be an Olympic Gold Medal winner in canoeing.

Larry's interest in canoeing started when he was 11 when he took summer classes at the Oakville Canoe Club. Once he started getting good, and particularly after seeing John Wood win a medal (silver) in Montreal in 1976, he set his sights on winning a gold.

He trained hard and was ready for the 1980 Olympics but Canada boycotted them, following the lead of the USA, as a protest to the Russian invasion of Afghanistan. Regardless his training continued and paid off when he won two gold medals in the World Juniors in 1981 plus a fifth place when going up against the men. Larry

pointed out that this was a prime example where it is only the athletes that suffer the consequences when politics interfere with sports.

The 1984 Olympics were in Los Angeles and Larry won gold in the 500 metre and silver in the 1000 metre.

In 1988, in Seoul, Larry placed 4th in the 1000 C1 although it was later established that the Silver Medalist, a German, had been on steroids.

Larry continued to race in at the international level until he failed to qualify for the 1996 Olympics in Atlanta and that is when he retired and became a teacher in Physical Education at St. Mildred's School.

He was teaching until 2014 when he took on the coaching position to get the Canadian paddlers ready for the Rio Olympics in 2016.

Today, Larry can be found still at the canoe club, teaching paddlers plus teaching on an international scale through his website, "Paddle Monster". This is for high performance canoeists and paddlers. On top of all this, Larry still competes in Dragon Races around the world with a group of 20 or so enthusiasts which includes the sport of SUP, stand up paddling, in rough ocean waters and surfs. With all the training he has done, Larry has calculated that he has paddled almost four times around the world. Impressive.

Bryan Noble thanked Larry for his time here today and for all he has done for Canadian sports.

Mike Purcell declared the meeting closed.
