# The History of Oakville and the Oakville Historical Society

We are delighted that George Chisholm, President of the Oakville Historical Society will be our speaker on August 21. He will be telling us about the history of Oakville and the many activities of the Oakville Historical Society.




George Chisholm is a lifelong resident of Oakville. He and his wife live in the 1839 house in which he was raised. For 30 plus years George was a high school shop teacher, mostly at Oakville Trafalgar High School, retiring in 2007. George joined the Reserve Army while in high school and retired with the rank of Captain after 23 years of service. For most of that time he worked with the local Army Cadet Corps, commanding it for two four-year terms. George was awarded the Canadian Forces Decoration and the Queen's Silver Jubilee Medal.

When George left the reserves in

1992, he joined the board of the Oakville Historical Society, became President the following year and has served in that role most of the time since. His work with the Society includes maintaining the Society's archival centre, the 1829 Thomas House museum in Lakeside Park, making the iconic black and white plaques and conducting guided walks.

"Founded in 1953, The Oakville Historical Society is the official collector of archives for the Town of Oakville, and as a nonprofit, volunteer organization works to preserve and protect the historical heritage of the Town as well as promote it through its various activities and programs. The Society's extensive collections include original documents, pictures, newspapers, maps, albums, letters, diaries as well as a comprehensive historical and marine library."

# **Dues Payments 2025-2026**

For Probus members wanting to make payment to the Club by Interac etransfer, do the following:

- 1) Access the e-transfer area of your bank's online banking screen.
- 2) Set up the Oakville Probus Club as an e-transfer recipient. Use <u>oakvilleprobusno5@gmail.com</u> as the club's email address. You will only need to set up the Club for the first e-transfer. After that the Oakville Probus Club will be included in your personal etransfer directory.
- Identify the account from which you want to send the transfer and amount of the payment that you wish to send.
- 4) In the message area specify the purpose of the e-transfer payment. Do not create a security question/password. This will prevent the autodeposit from happening.
- 5) Click on "Send". You will receive an immediate response that your payment has been sent and deposited into the Club bank account.

All e-transfers are automatically encrypted and are highly secure. No personal or bank data that is attached to the e-transfer can be hacked or stolen by a third party.


### **Book Club**
