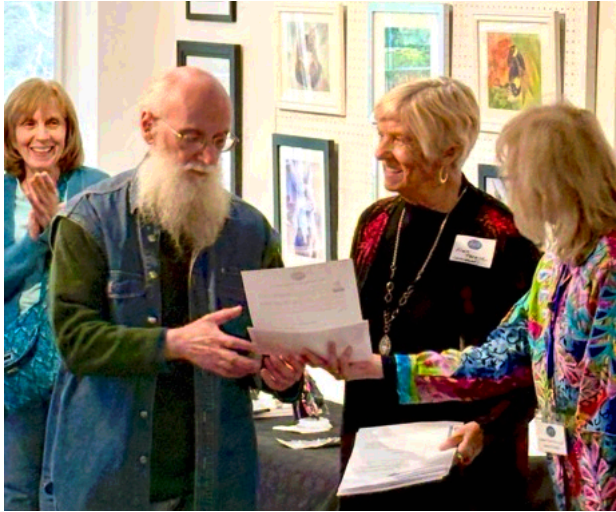

Nick Cutroneo, May 22nd, 2026

Join us **Friday, May 22nd at 7:30 PM** when **classical guitarist Nick Cutroneo** performs at the Marlborough Arts Center at 231 North Main Street, Marlborough, CT.



Described as a “communicative player with natural musicality,” American classical guitarist Nick Cutroneo is a performer and pedagogue active onstage and online.

He studied at the Juilliard School Pre-College with Antigoni Goni and holds Bachelor’s and Master’s degrees in Classical Guitar Performance from The Hartt School, where he studied with Richard Provost and was in the Performance 20/20 honors program.

As a soloist and chamber musician, Nick has performed in the U.S. and Italy. He has appeared with ensembles including the New England Guitar Quartet, Tempo del Fuoco, and the Connecticut Virtuosi Chamber Orchestra.

Admission is usually \$15 but **this month’s program is no charge** due to a generous grant from the Marlborough Greater Together Community Fund of the Greater Hartford Gives Foundation.

Doors open at 7:00 PM and the concert begins at 7:30 PM. Sit where you like among the bistro tables and chairs. BYO beverage (wine, beer, etc) and nibbles to dine on. Other NA beverages and baked sweet treats are often available. There is ample parking, and the Marlborough Arts Center is fully accessible.

Linda Gotta's artistic journey has been significantly influenced by her upbringing in a creative family. Her mother was an artist, and her father was a builder. For the past two and a half decades, Linda has dedicated her life to the art of pastel painting, although she has also explored working in watercolor and acrylic.

Linda's artistic endeavors are characterized by her unwavering pursuit of capturing the inherent beauty of the natural

world. Her compositions often feature landscapes of farms, beaches, and woodlands, as well as intimate views of flowers, animals, and birds. Linda's mastery of color and light is evident in her use of vibrant hues with soft,

impressionistic edges. Light and shadow play a pivotal role in her compositions, adding depth and dimension to her work.

Throughout her artistic career, Linda has actively sought to enhance her skills and knowledge through workshops and classes. Her work has garnered recognition and accolades, including the prestigious “Best in Show” award from the Connecticut Pastel Society for her painting titled “On the Ridge.” Additionally, she received the “Best Floral” award from the SCAA members’ show for her work titled “Meadow.”

Linda’s artistic achievements extend beyond individual recognition. She is particularly proud of being selected for the Spring 2020 Pastel Journal magazine’s “Pastel 100” list for her abstract painting titled “Timber.”

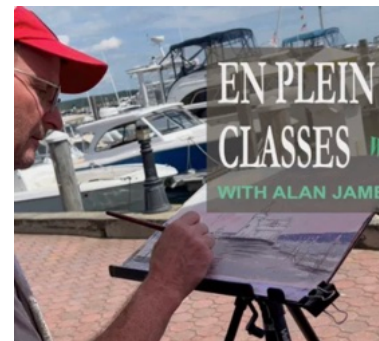

Volunteer Opportunities

1. **Gallery Sitting** – during our public exhibit hours, usually from 1:00 – 4:00pm Sat. or Sun. Greet and keep a count of guests; hand out brochures and membership forms; help set-up for any demos; assist with Gallery purchases.
2. **Exhibition Assistance** – prior to or after the event: help with receiving and installing exhibits or dismantling them; assist us with checking-in or logging-out submissions; coordinate labeling, payment, and processing.
3. **Hospitality** – during receptions and Arts Café events: help with food and beverage presentation; handing out membership forms, class brochures, and other event handouts; help with set-up, clean-up or parking.
4. **Building Maintenance** - to keep our building interior and exterior looking its best: help with general clean-up or refurbishing.
5. **Grounds Maintenance** – to keep our gardens & landscaping maintained: help with planting, weeding, or mulching, etc.

6. **Office and Clerical Help**– during flexible hours that don't require public interaction: help prepare mailings; distribute flyers; maintain supplies; oversee our library.
 7. **Committees** – Help with or coordinate tasks required by our various committees: Publicity, Membership, Classes, Volunteers, Events, etc.
 8. **Computer Assistance** – Provide computer expertise or assist with maintaining lists.
 9. **Miscellaneous** – If you have a particular skill or specific knowledge let us know and we'll find opportunities you can choose from.
