As I have lived in the beautiful South West corner of W.A., 300 kms from Perth, for the past 18 years, opportunities to participate in dog sports are much more limited than previously when I was in the hills around Perth and able to eniov Conformation, Obedience, Agility, etc. with my dogs at the excellent facilities of the DogsWest complex. and also because I am a good many years older and running round a ring has become a distant memory! My nearest dog club now is 100 kms away and although I have shown Isabel intermittently, she is so smart that I felt I must find a new challenge for us both - hence the idea of entering an Endurance Test came up. Isabel already had a good fitness base to build on - I walk her along our numerous bush tracks in the forests several times a week; she doesn't chase anything, she has a very good recall, so it's not a problem to let her run through the bush which she loves to do oh and she's also done snake awareness training – very important. My daughter walks her 6 kms or so on lead two or three times a week along by the river or through town and my son-in-law, Patrick, practices his golf chipping with her tennis balls which she speeds off to retrieve for him!

The German Shepherd Dog Club of W.A., under the auspices of DogsWest, used to run these Endurance Tests twice a year in July and September, but now hold one in July only as September is becoming too uncertain weather -wise in terms of heat, thanks to climate change. Test is called off if the temperature reaches 24 C and I understand one year, this occurred and the Test had to be abandoned just before the final km. How frustrating that must have been for all! The Endurance Test involves covering 20 kms in stages of 8 kms, 6 kms and 6 kms, with a 15 or 20 minute break in between each stage, together with a Vet check, and the whole Test is preceded and completed with a short Willingness test, basically some heeling and a recall. The test needs to be carried out at a speed of 10 kph and be completed within 2 hours, excluding the compulsory breaks and is conducted at the Club's spacious grounds in Southern River, near Perth.

Numbers have dropped in recent years since the time when there were 20 or so participants and when I received my catalogue on arrival, I discovered there were only 4 entries – an Australian Shepherd, a Border Collie, Isabel and a German Shepherd, to run in that order. The Australian Shepherd was scratched before we started and the Border Collie dropped out in the first 5 or 6 kms, so that just left Isabel, who is 4 ½, and a 6 year old German Shepherd named Delta. Handlers have jogged, or used

a scooter but the most popular way is to cycle and my lovely son-in-law, Patrick who is an avid cyclist, offered to accompany Isabel in the Test. He was later complimented by the judge on keeping up a perfect pace of 10 kph.

It was a cold morning when we arrived at the grounds at 8 am, but it gradually warmed up to about 17C or 18 C and no wind, so pretty well ideal conditions. A friend, Sonia Pfister, had completed the Test with her Flat Coat, Kajsa, some years earlier and she gave me lots of very good advice and tips on how to tackle it - many thanks for that help, Sonja. The bit about walking the dog in long, wet grass to help bring down a slightly elevated temperature was especially useful! During the Vet check in the first two breaks, Isabel's temperature was slightly high but quickly reduced after a gentle walk through wet grass and, to my amazement after the Vet check at the conclusion of the event, her temperature was absolutely normal as were all her other checks So she was all warmed up after 20 kms and ready for the next big thing?!! fact, that afternoon we went for a walk in the Perth hills, and she was hThere was a small group of members present for the event, watching and encouraging and then there was meengrossed by it all, and probably more stressed than the handlers and dogs combined! ever, I needn't have been Isabel, ably guided by Patrick, was magnificent and completed the Test with flying colours, as did Delta, the German Shepherd. Izzy has a Certificate and Badge, and the letters, E.T., after her name which is more than I have!

The three of us very much enjoyed our visit to Perth for this event; it brought back many memories of the fun I've had over the years since I had a puppy from Joy Gregg's "Blackregal"'s first litter in 1997 and we took part in Conformation together which led on to Obedience, some Agility and Jumping trialling and a little bit of Retrieving. Izzy is my 7th Flat Coat – all such special and beautiful dogs, in temperament as well as "glamour". A big 'thank you' to Joy, who remains a dear friend, for all the wonderful times I've enjoyed over the years, tinged, of course, with the deep sadness when they inevitably depart for the "Rainbow Bridge".

My daughter, Jacky, is interested in doing Obedience with Isabel so the future looks full of fun and excitement. Watch this space!
