



Snake Avoidance Training - Jean Ross



Thank you to everyone who contacted me and shared their personal experiences of snake avoidance therapy.

Five weeks ago I walked out of my laundry and a 1 metre-long tiger snake was sunning itself on the concrete. We called several snake catchers and eventually the snake was dealt with. Witnessing how fast and aggressive it was when cornered - was scary. Thankfully, our dogs were not in the area. Just a reminder to be vigilant at this time of year.



Retrieving Ability Test for Gundogs 2nd June 2024 Venue: Connewarre Wetlands and the F&G centre is being held in conjunction with

The Retrieving Ability Tests for Gundogs is an introductory step into retrieving and testing basic obedience, with two levels of ability - Novice and Open.

Open tests have more complicated concepts including double retrieves. Both Registered and Associate gundogs are allowed to compete in these trials.

The Novice level is judged out of IOO points and includes obedience and retrieving components.

The obedience part of the test is not as demanding as the novice level of obedience trials; it is intended to demonstrate that owners have their dog under control.

The first exercise consists of the dog walking at heel for 20-30 metres. (10 Points) and the second exercise is a recall (15 Points).

The retrieving component consists (Exercise Three and Four) of two single mark retrieves of approximately 50 metres (30 Points) and 70 metres (35 Points), and may include land and water.

Dogs are allocated up to IO points for Style and Action.
