

– A Message from Father Matt Feist –

Hello Friends,

As we close out this month of May, we have celebrated many First Communions, honored our mothers, and marked anniversaries. I am deeply moved and truly grateful for the incredible gathering in honor of my 10th anniversary as your priest. To see so many familiar and beloved faces come together from across our entire family of parishes was nothing short of wonderful. The kindness of your words, your prayers on my behalf, and your extraordinary generosity touched my heart more than I can adequately express. It was a true testament to the greatness of this community.

I was especially delighted that my classmate and dear friend, Fr. McCullough, was able to join us for the festivities. Having him share in that joy with all of you made the evening even more special. A couple of days later, I was able to surprise him at his own wonderful celebration. It is so encouraging to see amazing communities continue to grow throughout our Archdiocese.

As I reflect on that beautiful evening, one thought keeps returning to me: what if we let this be a beginning, not just a celebration? There was something powerful in that room—people laughing, dancing, sharing stories, and breaking bread together across parish boundaries. That is the Body of Christ at work. So let's not allow that energy to fade.

Building community does not require grand events. It starts with simple, consistent acts of showing up for one another. I know we have many wonderful things happening throughout all of the parishes in our family.

At St. Mary's, there are two wonderful opportunities built right into the monthly rhythm of parish life. On the second Sunday of each month, please stay after the 10:30 a.m. Mass for our potluck. Bring a dish, bring your family, and bring a neighbor. On the fourth Sunday of each month, join us for coffee and donuts after the 10:30 a.m. Mass. These may seem like small moments, but they matter deeply.

Beyond that, I encourage each of you to dream a little. Do you have an idea for bringing people together? Act on it and invite others to join you. You might also consider starting a small discipleship group using the free resources available at dquads.com, or volunteering in our Become Catholic (OCIA) program by walking alongside those who are entering the Church.

SAINT BONIFACE

Saint of the Day: June 5

Patron Saint of Germany

Boniface, known as the apostle of the Germans, was an English Benedictine monk who gave up being elected abbot to devote his life to the conversion of the Germanic tribes. Two characteristics stand out: his Christian orthodoxy and his fidelity to the pope of Rome.

How absolutely necessary this orthodoxy and fidelity were is borne out by the conditions Saint Boniface found on his first missionary journey in 719 at the request of Pope Gregory II. Paganism was a way of life. What Christianity he did find had either lapsed into paganism or was mixed with error.

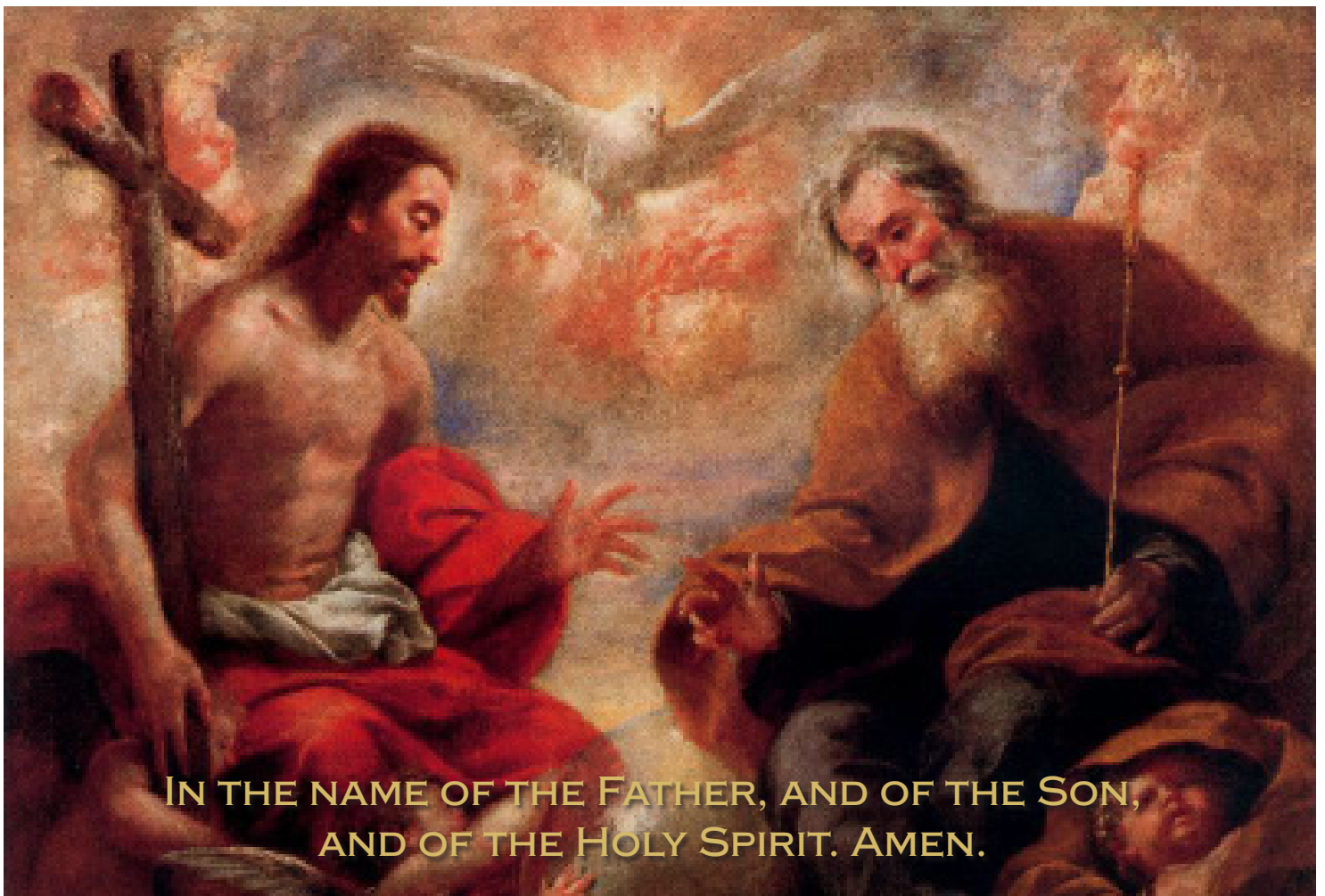
These are the conditions that Saint Boniface was to report in 722 on his first return visit to Rome. The Holy Father instructed him to reform the German Church. The pope sent letters of recommendation to religious and civil leaders. Boniface later admitted that his work would have been unsuccessful without a letter of safe-conduct from Charles Martel, the powerful Frankish ruler, grandfather of Charlemagne.

In the Frankish kingdom, he met great problems because of lay interference in bishops' elections, the worldliness of the clergy and lack of papal control.

During a final mission to the Frisians, Boniface and 53 companions were massacred while he was preparing converts for confirmation.

In order to restore the Germanic Church to its fidelity to Rome and to convert the pagans, Saint Boniface had been guided by two principles. The first was to restore the obedience of the clergy to their bishops in union with the pope of Rome. The second was the establishment of many houses of prayer which took the form of Benedictine monasteries.
