On January 26, 2005, Michael Ross, a former life-insurance salesman, will be executed in Connecticut. Only two north-eastern states, Connecticut and New Hampshire, allow capital punishment, but even in these two the **penalty** has been largely theoretical. Although most states have some provision for capital punishment, one-third of all executions since 1976 have taken place in Texas. Given the choice of returning to court or dying, Ross has chosen death. Over the last two decades, Ross has been involved between the state to appeal his **death sentence** and his abhorrence of the court system. Anti-death-penalty groups are now staging rallies not just on the steps of the capitol, but across the state... (AN 15763212)

Journal of Instructional Psychology, Dec2003, Vol. 30 Issue 4, p256, 8p, 3 charts; Abstract: Continued advancements in technology have fundamentally changed the way we work and live. Today's educators have unlimited opportunities to more broadly apply our powerful technological tools and change the way students of all ages are learning. Yet, there continues to remain a consensus among business leaders, parents and educators that our current educational practices do not prepare students to thrive in our ever-changing technological society. The purpose of this study was to investigate and describe the use of **computers** in the classroom by **elementary teachers** and their students. Data was collected university pre-service **teachers** who were currently enrolled in a required education technology course. The results indicate that the responding **elementary teachers** reported only limited use of **computers** in their classrooms. The computer use that was employed by the **teachers** was primarily for desk organization with very little if any classroom instruction being addressed by computer technology. 

2. Effects of Technology Integration Education on the Attitudes of Teachers and Students. By: Christensen, Rhonda. Journal of Research on Technology in Education, Summer2002, Vol. 34 Issue 4, p411, 23p; Abstract: Major findings regarding the effects of technology integration education on **elementary school teachers** are presented. A study of a K-5 treatment site versus two comparison **schools** over one academic year indicates that **teachers** progress one stage in a six-stage technology adoption model as a result of focused, needs-based technology integration education delivered throughout the **school** year. Needs-based technology integration education is shown to have a rapid, positive effect on teacher attitudes, such as computer anxiety, perceived importance of **computers**, and computer enjoyment. This type of education is shown to have a timelagged positive effect on the attitudes of students as well. [ABSTRACT FROM AUTHOR]; (AN 7554377)

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## Examples of Abstracts From Published Research

**Background:** In response to intense national pressure to improve care of the dying, efforts have been made to determine problems or barriers to optimal care. However, prior research is limited by such factors as setting, focus, and sampling.

**Objectives:** The purpose of this study was to identify barriers to optimal care of a population-based representative sample of decedents across a full range of settings in which death occurred.

**Method:** Families were contacted 2 to 5 months after decedents' deaths by using data on their death certificates. Over a 14-month period, telephone interviews were conducted with 475 family informants who had been involved in caring for the patient in the last month of life. Interviews were standardized by use of a 58-item structured questionnaire.

**Results:** Data show a high frequency of advance planning (68%) and a high level of respect by clinicians for patient—family preferences about end-of-life location and treatment decisions. Family satisfaction with care was generally high, even though pain was a problem in one-third of the sample of decedents.

**Conclusion:** Barriers to optimal care of the dying remain, despite a generally positive overall profile; barriers include level of pain and management of pain, as well as some dissatisfaction with physician availability (Tolle, Tidmarsh, Rosenfeld, & Hickman, 2000).

تلخيص بكلماتك الخاصة (عبارات معاد صياغتها).

استخدم اللغة المناسبة (على سبيل المثال، "وجدت العديد من الدراسات ...").
