Notes for Peter McConnell

Pete was already working in the coal mine when he was 13 in the 1870 Census.

On March 7 1876 Jameson store in Barton Maryland was robbed. Peter McConnell was one of the Perputrators. The others were Willaim Moor, Clay McKenzie and Knoyer. William Moore testified agaist Peter.

Peter was arrested about a week later and taken to cumberland. Thomas came and posted the 1000 bail for his son.

in april 1876 a trial began. Thomas, Peters father had allowed a search of the McConnell home but nothing was found. Pete and Clay Mckenzie were seen on the railroad platform the night of March 7, according to testimony there were many people there. William Moore testified that around midnight the 4 men used an iron bar and pryed the window open. He testifeid that Peter took the funds. Knoyer took a peice of meat home. Moore stated that Peter took some womens wear. Moore stated that McKenzie threated him when he was arrested and he did not feel safe. He stated that the McConnell house was only 200-300 feet from Jamesosn store.

Mary, Thomas and Bernard testified on Peters behalf. Mary stating that Peter came home beofre 10p the night of the robbery and that he said "we have a car tomorrow prepare the buckets, i must get up early. She stated between 1-2a she got up to see if the widows were up and saw peter and Bernard in bed together. called him at 5a to wake him. She only found out about the robbery wehn he was arrested.

Thomas stated he went to bed at 1, Pete got into bed first. Bernard stated teh family came back from church at 9p. thomas and Peter said they had a car and had to go to work in the morning. Bernard stated he thought his brother was there all night. April 29, 1876 was the trial, and the jury could not reach a verdict on the same day. They were sequestered for the night⁵⁹

The next morning at 10a they came back with a guilty verdict. ⁶⁰ Peter was convicted of larceny and house breaking was sentenced to six years in the penitentiary and additional 4 years fro burgulary. Making his enitre sentence ten years. ⁶¹ His fellow consipirators William Knoyer was sentenced to 5 years, Henry Clay McKenzie was ssentences to 5 years and William A. Moore who testified agaist Peter was sentenced to two years.⁶¹

In 1880, Peter was in the state penitentary in Baltimore. in June of that same year he received a pardon form the governor of Maryland⁶²
