

CALLED TOSTAND OUT

A FATHER'S DAY MESSAGE BY

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"There is no greater urgency in our generation than restoring the covering of true fatherhood."

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"Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind..." – **Romans 12:2 (NKJV)**

In a world that is increasingly confused about masculinity, family, and spiritual leadership, the call for real men has never been more urgent. As we honour fathers today, let us reflect on what it truly means to be a man of God, not just biologically, but spiritually, morally, and purposefully.



















1. Conformity Leads to Compromise

One of the biggest battles men face is the subtle pressure to fit in, to conform to societal standards, peer expectations, or worldly trends. But conformity dilutes conviction. It tempts men to exchange principles for popularity and truth for tolerance. "You shall not follow a crowd to do evil..." – **Exodus 23:2 (NKJV)**

2. Conformity Leads to Confusion

When a man abandons God's purpose for the sake of popularity, confusion sets in. Your role as a husband, father, or leader becomes unclear because it is not rooted in God's design but in human approval. "A double minded man is unstable in all his ways." – James 1:8 (KJV)

3. Conformity Leads to Camouflage

You were never meant to blend in. God calls every man to be a standard bearer, not a shadow. Men of God are visible leaders, not silent spectators. "You are the light of the world. A city that is set on a hill cannot be hidden." – **Matthew 5:14 (NKJV)**



4. Conformity Leads to Complicity

When men conform to ungodly environments, they become complicit in moral decay. Complicity is passive participation, it is knowing the truth but failing to act on it. "Have no fellowship with the unfruitful works of darkness, but rather expose them." – **Ephesians 5:11 (NKJV)**

5. Conformity Leads to Complacency

Complacency is the death of purpose. Many men, overwhelmed by expectation or failure, begin to settle—no longer pressing toward growth, leadership, or spiritual excellence. "Woe to those who are at ease in Zion..." – Amos 6:1 (NKJV)

6. Conformity Leads to Conflict

When you abandon your true identity to conform, internal and external conflict arises. Your spirit wrestles with your compromise, and those around you sense the dissonance between your calling and your conduct. "Where envy and self-seeking exist, confusion and every evil thing are there." – James 3:16 (NKJV)

7. Conformity Leads to Cancellation

When you endeavour to conform to others you run the risk of self-cancellation. You empower the enemy to cancel out your unique identity and calling by trying to fit into everyone else. Uniqueness requires the discipline of choice and conduct. Choose to stand out, don't cancel yourself out! The Bible reminds us that we are a royal priesthood, a special people chosen by God.

"But you are not like that, for you are a chosen people. You are royal priests, a holy nation, God's very own possession. As a result, you can show others the goodness of God, for he called you out of the darkness into his wonderful light." **1 Peter 2:9 (NLT)**



"REAL MEN DON'T CONTROL... THEY COVER
