



Karama Festival is a six-day film festival in Amman, Jordan since 2010. After 8 sessions of the Karama Film Festival, the festival will be organized and organized by the 612 ideas factory. The Festival will include a number of interrelated activities: The festival will be organized by the Ministry of Culture, AFLA (Animation, documentaries and short) from different countries of the world. Film discussions with film production teams; seminars and workshops; and 'Music of dignity', a platform that offers musical performances. And "conscience of art" exhibition. In addition to a professional Karama (an 8-week workshop to be held before the festival to produce human rights films to be displayed during the festival). In 2018 the festival will be held in its ninth session. After the launch of Karama in 2010, the festival attracted many local, regional and international stakeholders; official bodies, civil society organizations, activists, similar festivals, filmmakers, artists, donors, as well as the media. A large number of platforms at the regional and international levels have hosted a team of dignity and packages, and have contributed significantly to the establishment of five similar human rights festivals in Tunisia, Mauritania, Lebanon, Palestine, Yemen and Libya. In addition, Karama, together with a number of local partners and under the management of Ishtar Theater Production and Training, has succeeded in establishing the Karama Festival of Human Rights Films.

Now that we know the purpose of this festival, all human beings are born free and equal in dignity and rights. They have reason and conscience, and they should act with each other in the spirit of brotherhood.

The Karama Human Rights Festival seeks to create a cultural platform for artists, filmmakers and the general public to participate in issues relating to human rights, human dignity, and their sense of worth, belonging and spirit of common well-being among their communities and the wider national spectrum.

Our goal is to defend human rights, to advocate debate, to promote critical thinking and civic engagement, and to open democratic dialogue on human rights issues among the various international, regional and local institutions and organizations, and the wider public.

Karama seeks to promote screen arts that involve human rights issues as their theme.

Our goal is to reach local and regional audiences, especially young people throughout Jordan and the Arab world, and provide them with a platform to engage in global debates and cultures that focus on human rights issues through film fiction and discourse.


The festival aims at several things that it seeks to achieve as follows: Understanding the issues related to violations of human rights.

Attract a new human rights audience through musical and theatrical performances and involve them in key human rights presentations.
