

THE ITINERARY

Day 1: Get to Luxor and begin your Nile Cruise by going to the East Bank.

A Royal Ankh representative will meet you at the Luxor airport and take you to your Nile Cruise, where your check-in process will go extremely smoothly. After your Nile Cruise, a Blue Sky representative will pick you up and drive you to the temple of Karnak in an air-conditioned luxury. The temple, the largest in history, was built in honor of God Amon, his wife Mut, and their son Khonsu. In reality, this magnificent temple is a collection of many temples that were constructed successively by numerous Pharaoh generations over 2,000 years ago. The huge "hypostyle hall" of Karnak Temple is a forest of enormous pillars. Following your visit to the Luxor Temple, which is situated in the center of Luxor City, you will be returned to your Nile Cruise.

Day 2: Tour of Luxor's West Bank .

Our tour guide will transport you in an air-conditioned luxury car from your hotel or Nile Cruise to the west side of the river, where you may see the two sculptures of Memnon en route to the Valley of the Kings. Three remarkable tombs carved into the desert rock may be seen in the Valley of the Kings. They are richly decorated and contain treasures for the pharaohs' afterlife. A visit to Hatshepsut Temple at El Deir El Bahary will be the next stop on the itinerary. Rising from the yellow desert in a sequence of terraces, the temple devoted to Hatshepsut, the only female pharaoh, is as remarkable as she was. transport to your Nile Cruise. Day 3: Visit to the Temple of Edfu and Kom Ombo.

After your Nile cruise, our tour guide will take you to Edfu to see the Horus temple, which is regarded as one of Egypt's best-preserved temples. After that,

the boat will set sail for Kom Ombo, where you will explore the Temple of Kom Ombo, which is 45 kilometers away from Aswan. It was constructed to honor the fertility gods Crocodile, who is headed by Sobek, and Horus, who is headed by the Falcon. Its twin entry for both deities reveals its peculiarity; you will then return to the boat to cruise to Aswan and spend the night there. B: The Nile Cruise D: The Nile Cruise

Day 4: Visit to Philae Temple, the High Dam, and the Unfinished Oblisk.

Our tour guide will take you to the High Dam, which is rather close to Aswan, from your accommodation or Nile cruise. Lake Nasser, which was formed after the dam was constructed, can be seen from the dam, which was constructed in the 1960s and was a significant accomplishment of President Abdel-Nasser. After that, you'll be taken to see the incomplete Oblisk. You will then be taken by motorboat to the island, where you will get the opportunity to explore the Philea Temple, which was constructed in honor of the god Isis. Aswan's Felucca Cruise on the Nile A representative from Blue Sky will pick you up from your hotel or Nile cruise in Aswan and take you on an hour-long felucca ride to Elephantine Island, where you will see the Botanical Garden, which was used by Lord Kitchener as a resting place and has plants from all over the world. Day 5: Transfer to Aswan Airport.
