

Alternative Option 2 - Eastern location

Immediately west of junction of Wapping High Street and Wapping Lane



If a bus gate is implemented at this location, road closures will be required at Brewhouse Lane, Reardon Path, Dundee Street and Scandrett Street so that motorists do not use these roads as a rat-run to avoid the bus gate. All road closures will remain open for cyclists and pedestrians. Emergency vehicles will be allowed to use the bus gate. This location is not recommended because of the impact on the local streets.

What happens next?

We will collate the data gathered from your responses and analyse the collective opinion on the location of the bus gate and other improvements around Wapping. Your feedback will then be taken into consideration in taking this forward.

Introduction

Tower Hamlets Council is committed to making the borough a safer place for all road users by delivering a range of street improvements in the area; intending to benefit pedestrians, cyclists, drivers and public transport users alike.

Wapping is currently being reviewed to provide a safer road environment for the local community, pedestrians and cyclists. The review is in response to residents' concerns about rat-running and the problems it causes in local streets, such as noise and air pollution, and safety concerns.

There will be a series of other proposals for traffic changes in Wapping, including better junction layouts, improved pedestrian safety, and steps to reduce bad driving behaviour. This will come later in the year in our Love Your Neighbourhood project.

What are we proposing?

Traffic currently avoids The Highway (A1203) by cutting down Glamis Road/Wapping Lane towards Wapping High Street and Vaughan Way/Thomas More Street to access The Highway (A1203).

It is proposed to install a bus gate restriction on Wapping High Street, enforced by automatic number plate recognition, to address rat-running traffic, A bus gate is an entry point across a road which means only buses are allowed to go any further. There is no physical gate as such. Such a gate would prevent all traffic (unless a bus, or a cycle or maybe an exempted local vehicle) from passing the Pier Head without risking a penalty.

We do understand that local residents may be inconvenienced by the bus gate and we could allow some groups of residents, by address, and possibly by vehicle type, to pass through the bus gate. However experiences show that limiting exemptions best

achieves traffic reduction. In this consultation we are asking for your views on the proposal, and any exemptions for local residents that might apply.

We recommend that the most effective proposal would be to install a bus gate at:

- Western location
- · 24 hours a day, seven days a week
- Bus and cycle access only
- No access for motor vehicles, motorbikes or taxis

There have been other suggestions, for example banning right or left turns at certain points from the Highway into Wapping. We believe these would be less effective than these proposals and they would require detailed modelling, which would further delay implementation. However, in question 7 you are invited to make other observations or proposals, if you think we should consider these.

Tower Hamlets Council now invites your comments on our preferred option including location, times of the restriction and who will be exempt. We welcome any comments for further improvements to the area.




Overview plan

Recommended Option 1 - Western location

East of junction of Wapping High Street and Sampson Street



If a bus gate is implemented at this location, a road closure will be required at Knighten Street so that motorists do not drive around the bus gate via Sampson Street and Knighten Street which would create a rat-run in this area. All road closures will remain open for cyclists and pedestrians. Emergency vehicles will be allowed to use the bus gate. This location is recommended because it includes fewer road closures on local streets.
