

Current Year Crime by Ward








Partnership Working





Pennington Street

Over the Halloween period between Friday 28th October & Saturday 29th October, THEOs were tasked to patrol Pennington Street. During this period Tobacco Dock & E1 Club hosted events with the expectancy of over 15,000 revellers visiting. THEOs conducted high visible foot patrols of Pennington Street and other locations in St Katharine's and Wapping ward.

Officers engaged with over 30,000 revellers.

Seized over 600 miniature silver Nitrous-Oxide canisters, over 40 large blue refill Nitrous-Oxide bottles, and many balloons.

More than 37 Fixed Penalty Notices were issued for offences which include 28 FPNs for breaching the noxious substances PSPO and 9 FPNs for street urination.



Pennington Street & Wapping Lane

On Saturday 3rd December Cllr of Wapping & St Katherines raised a complaint of many horse trailers and vehicles causing an obstruction to Wapping lane & Pennington street. THEOs responded and found over 70 vehicles with trailers parked illegally on footways and on double yellow lines causing an obstruction. The vehicles illegally parked caused a traffic congestion. Residents approached the THEOs and aired their frustration, they had to manoeuvre around the vehicles step into the road to pass, and the pavements were covered in horse manure. THEOs arranged parking enforcement to assist, together over 50 PCNs served to vehicles parked illegally.



Partnership Working



- Op Da Vinci month of action for St Katharine's & Wapping Ward during October aimed to tackle ASB problems within the St Katharine & Wapping ward. 84 stop and searches were carried out, 7 arrests were made including those for handling stolen goods, possession of class A drugs, going equipped to steal, breach of CPN and possession with intent to supply class B Drugs. 22 ASB warnings issued. 11 Community Protection Warnings issued, 6 Community Protection Notices issued, 3 court summons for beach of Community Protection Notice.
- St Katharine's & Wapping ward have issued the highest volume of early interventions issued across the Borough to prevent ASB offending.
- Two community speed gun operations carried out. A number of cars were sent a warning letter for driving at excess speed by Roads Transport police.
- Partnership working with _______ has enabled police to have a better overview of the problem, the area was then visited by police on the week of action in November where PC Dove worked a set of night shifts on the ward.





Supporting Rough Sleepers



Keep the Street link website loaded on your phone:

<u>Street link</u> enables the public to alert the council about people sleeping rough in the area. This is the first step that someone can take to ensure that rough sleepers are connected to local services and get the support that is available to them. You can also download the <u>Street link app</u> from the iTunes app store.

Invest your spare pennies and pounds into charities that deal with homelessness

It might seem controversial, but pressing a pound into the hand of a homeless person for them to buy a hot drink won't help them.

Rough sleepers are among the most excluded people in society. Many have been in care as children or in prison as adults and they often suffer with mental and physical health issues. Your spare change won't fix these problems.

It would be better to donate to charities such as **Providence Row**, and bigger national charities like **Shelter**, **Centrepoint** and **Crisis**.

All of these charities campaign long and hard with the government to explore ways of alleviating these issues. These charities also support homeless people – training them for work, providing resource centres, housing and feeding them.



Two of the most commonly stolen items from vehicles includes Blue Badges and Catalytic Converters

Response

In November 2022 the Council ran a targeted boroughwide operation focusing on Blue Badge fraud.

- 250 Blue Badges checked on the National Blue Badges Roadside Database
- 25 badges were classed as stolen, as a result 12 vehicles were impounded
- 6 permits were misused or used fraudulently
