New Challenges Facing Our Family Offer Opportunities to Grow Our Faith

Do you remember as a child being scared? Perhaps you can think of a haunted house at Halloween or watching a movie that had an unexpected twist or turn—the kind that is often accompanied by a loud musical blast or shout? Those moments are truly terrifying and, thankfully, quickly pass. Personally, I remember a movie I saw at age 14 that I know gave me nightmares that night, but quickly faded from memory—except that I never want to see that movie again (if you want to know the movie, email me).

On March 26, Susie and I found we were in a very scary place—and this isn't going to pass overnight and there was no loud music playing to heighten the drama. After an

incomplete colonoscopy and a subsequent abdominal CT scan, we were told that Susie has a growth on her kidney that, according to the doctors, has a 90-percent certainty of being cancerous.

That has taken some time to truly sink in for us, so I'll throw some words into this paragraph to let you consider that reality, as well. We left for Chicago the following day so we could serve at the March 29-31 Chicago Oak Brook Hills Weekend to Remember. Because we were in Chicago, Susie had the opportunity to gather her family together so she could share the news with them in person. To God be the glory.

This week, as I am writing the Maupin Message, we are planning

additional CT scans of the rest of Susie's body to be certain that her kidney is the only location for cancer. If true, the procedure going forward seems somewhat predictable and, according to the doctors, quite routine. Routine for them, not so much for us, of course.

We covet your prayers for us as we will continue to followthrough on planned ministry activities, loving on our grandchildren and children and trusting God with our scary unknown. By His grace, there are many among our family and friends who have been where we are and there is much comfort and encouragement there. Also, knowing our Lord and Savior is always with us keeps us hopeful. Yet, this is still a scary unknown for us.
