## **Glossary of Terms for Presentation**

## What is a Trust?

A device in which rights either **PERSONAL** or **PROPRIETARY**, held by one person on behalf of another

Trust creator = SETTLOR


Person holding the Trust = **TRUSTEE** 

Person for whom rights are held = **BENEFICIARY** 

## Why have a Trust?

- 1. Person whom rights are given may not be able to manage it (i.e. age, mental incapacity)
- 2. Tax management
- 3. Enjoyment of rights on a plane of time

Note: Trusts can be created by SETTLORS and COURTS
