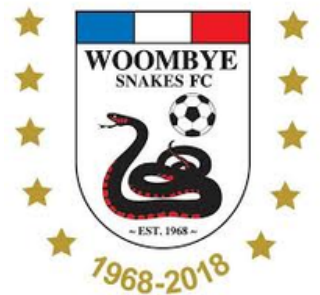

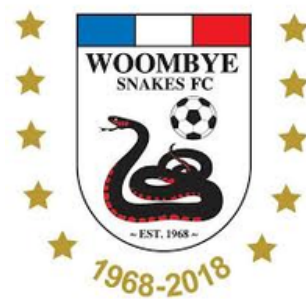

WOMEN'S MATCH REPORT

Coming off the bye round our Noosa Women's team were ready to face Woombye in an important fixture in the race for final league positions. With a large emphasis in training leading up to this game placed on converting the numerous goal scoring chances we create, it was brilliant to see us go 1-0 up early on the 7th minute mark with a silky combination pattern calmly finished off by midfielder Charlie Taylor. We continued creating numerous chances and had another goal harshly disallowed before we finally added to the scoreline from a header from fullback Emma Bestek in the 40th minute. Early in the second half we broke away from the opposition backline and added a 3rd goal from striker Jess Doyle in the 50th minute. From then on we went into game management mode with Woombye throwing everything at us to try and get back into the game. Proud of our defensive shape from the ladies against a top team, meant the final score ended in a 3-1 win. In the U23's we had a great team performance where we limited the opposition to a handful of scoring chances via our ability to dominate possession for periods of time. We created some massive goal scoring chances but unfortunately were not able to convert on these moments and paid the price by conceding late to lose 1-0. “TO CONCEDE A LAST SECOND EQUALISER TO GYMPIE, REGARDLESS OF EXTERNAL INFLUENCES WAS INCREDIBLY DISSAPPOINTING. THE BOYS HOWEVER BOUNCED BACK WITH A 1-0 WIN AGAINST NYU IN A CAGEY AFFAIR, WHERE BOTH TEAMS KNEW A DRAW OR LOSS WOULD LIKELY END THEIR PREMIERSHIP HOPES.

MEN'S MATCH REPORT ROUND 10

GREAT WINS FOR THE NOOSA FQPL WOMEN (3:1 AT WOOMBIE) AND UNDER 23 TEAM (6:0 AT NYU, WITH CHARLIE FISHER SCORING FOUR) ADDED TO THE WEIGHT OF EXPECTATION ON THE NOOSA LIONS FQPL MENS TEAM TO GET A RESULT AT YANDINA. IN THE REVERSE FIXTURE AT THE END OF MARCH, NYU HAD DESERVEDLY WON 3-1, AND NOOSA WERE EAGER TO MAKE UP FOR THAT DEFEAT AND TO GAIN GROUND ON THE TOP OF THE LADDER. A WIN WOULD PUT THEM WITHIN ONE POINT OF SECOND-PLACED NYU AND TWO POINTS OFF LEADERS, CALOUNDRA. THE LIONS STARTED BRIGHTLY AND WERE SHOWING AN INTENSITY THAT WAS LACKING IN THE HOME FIXTURE. HOWEVER, IT WAS NYU WHO CAME CLOSE TO TAKING THE LEAD IN THE 14 TH MINUTE, WITH CAMERON BOLDY MAKING A GREAT REACTION SAVE TO TIP THE CLOSE RANGE SHOT

ONTO AND OVER THE BAR. A FEW MINUTES LATER, OLI WILLIAMS DREW A SAVE FROM THE NYU KEEPER WITH A FLICKED HEADER. THIS WAS QUICKLY FOLLOWED UP BY MAX ADEY DRIVING DOWN THE LEFT AND ATTACKING THE NEAR POST, WITH THE NYU DEFENCE AND 'KEEPER SCRAMBLING TO KEEP THE BALL OUT.

TWO WELL-MATCHED AND WELL-ORGANISED SIDES WERE PLAYING OUT A CAT AND MOUSE STYLE GAME WITH SOLID DEFENCES AND TIGHT MIDFIELDS LIMITING CHANCES FOR EITHER FORWARD LINE.

ON THE HALF-HOUR, FIRST NYU AND THEN NOOSA TRIED THE LONG BALL OVER THE TOP WITH BOTH

GOAL-KEEPERS MOPPING UP WELL. IN THE 38 TH MINUTE, FROM A NOOSA FREE KICK, MITCH BRIDGE HAD A HEADER SAVED, BUT WITH FINAL PASSES GOING ASTRAY NOOSA WERE UNABLE TO

FASHION ANY CLEAR CUT CHANCES. NYU FINISHED THE HALF STRONGLY, BOLDY MAKING ANOTHER

GREAT SAVE TO KEEP THEM OUT AND HE AND THE LARGE NOOSA SUPPORT WERE RELIEVED TO SEE THE CROSS FROM THE RESULTANT CORNER GO UNTOUCHED AS IT FLEW ACROSS THE NOOSA GOALMOUTH.

NIL-NIL AT HALF-TIME AND THERE WERE MANY MORE KIWI NOOSA SUPPORTERS IN THE CROWD THAN CHANCES CREATED! WHILST NOT A BLOOD AND THUNDER HALF OF ATTACKING FOOTBALL, IT

WAS AN ENTHRALLING SPECTACLE, WITH THE TEAMS MATCHING EACH OTHER MOVE FOR MOVE. COULD THE COACHES COME UP WITH AN ATTACKING GAMBIT TO BREAK THE DEADLOCK?

NOOSA AGAIN STARTED WELL WITH SAM BOLDY GETTING A SHOT ON TARGET AFTER OLLIE BLACKMORE HAD CREATED PRESSURE ON THE NYU BACKLINE. NOOSA BEGAN TO SHOW MORE CONTROL OF THE GAME AND PROBE FOR OPENINGS THROUGH THE COMPACT NYU MIDFIELD. LACHIE KUSABS MADE TWO GOOD RUNS FROM RIGHT BACK TO GET BEHIND THE NYU DEFENCE AND PRESSURE WAS BUILDING WITH CONSECUTIVE CORNERS AND AFTER MORE GOOD WORK FROM

OLLIE BLACKMORE, NYU AGAIN HAD TO CLEAR THE BALL OFF THE LINE. NOOSA COACHES, MICHAEL WILLIAMS AND MATT DIGWOOD, SOUGHT TO INCREASE THE PRESSURE AND MADE THE FIRST GAMBIT – DRESHER BEING REPLACED BY TAKAISHI AND OLI WILLIAMS MOVING FURTHER FORWARD. IN THE 70 TH MINUTE, BOTH WINGERS WERE REPLACED WITH JACK WILLIAMS AND SUNNY LAW COMING ON.

MORE SUSTAINED NOOSA PRESSURE LED TO ANOTHER GOALMOUTH SCRAMBLE, BUT IT WAS NYU WHO CAME CLOSER TO SCORING WITH BOLDY FORCED INTO ANOTHER GOOD SAVE AND SOME DESPERATE DEFENDING IN THE 77 TH MINUTE. A FINAL GAMBIT SAW THE RETURN OF CAPTAIN, LUKE BECCONSALL TO THE TEAM, REPLACING KUSABS AND HE HAD AN INSTANT IMPACT, STEPPING UP TO ENSURE NYU FORWARDS WERE CAUGHT OFF-SIDE AS THEY THREATENED TO BREAK. SPACE WAS FINALLY OPENING UP FOR THE FORWARDS. IN THE 85 TH MINUTE, A FINE CROSS BY BLACKMORE FROM THE LEFT WING FOUND SUNNY LAW UNMARKED ON THE RIGHT-HAND

EDGE OF THE NYU BOX AND HE TOOK A GREAT TOUCH BEFORE LEATHERING THE BALL IN AT THE NEAR POST. A CRACKING GOAL, WORTHY OF WINNING THE GAME AND ONE BUILT ON A PATIENT AND INTENSE NOOSA TEAM PERFORMANCE.

FOLLOWING TUESDAY NIGHT'S DISAPPOINTING LATE CONCESSION OF A GOAL, THE NOOSA PLAYERS WERE DETERMINED TO WITHSTAND LATE NYU PRESSURE AND ALL WORKED HARD TO CLOSE OUT THE GAME AND SECURE A VERY VALUABLE THREE POINTS.
