joint project to assist during "cook
ups" for Carevan, whose aim is to
provide free, wholesome meals to the

disadvantaged in the community.

The Centre's Jo Maples said ladies from Inner Wheel have been cooking bulk meals for Carevan Wangaratta over the last nine months, and they have recently been involving VCAL students

from The Centre's Greta campus.
