
What is this project?

Good News Story

In a recent interview, a young person shared their journey with Cumbria Youth Alliance (CYA), highlighting the organisation's crucial role in shaping their career path. Initially referred through a job connection to the DWP outreach project, the individual expressed a desire to move away from seasonal work and find a meaningful career.

CYA addressed the challenges of lacking qualifications and self-confidence by offering personalised support. They assisted in socialisation, obtaining relevant certifications, and improving confidence. The young person participated in various courses, including first aid, health and safety, employability skills, and construction.

Grateful for CYA's role in identifying a career path, the young person secured an apprenticeship with Galliford Try as a trainee site engineer. This opportunity could lead to a master's degree in Civil Engineering. The young person highlighted the importance of effort and collaboration with CYA in achieving personal and professional goals.

Aspiring Leaders Programme

FS Francis Scott Trust

The Aspiring Leaders Programme is a unique leadership development programme for the voluntary sector in Cumbria and the Lancaster District. After 12 years of delivery, the main funder, the Francis Scott Trust and the delivery partners, believe the programme can be enhanced by converting it to an apprenticeship degree. This model would potentially create additional capacity for more aspirant leaders in the sector to access high quality, accredited leadership development which can be limited in our sector.

Before embarking on the conversion of the existing programme, we are asking the organisations that make up the sector for their perspectives on how and whether a programme like this could work, and to help identify barriers to engagement which we may not be aware of. The survey is short, and should only take 6-10 minutes and your contribution and suggestions will be gratefully received and considered in the Trust's decision making. The results will also be openly disseminated (specific organisations will not be identified or identifiable) towards the end of February.

A rolling programme of 9 x 90 minute monthly online peer support sessions across the year (omitting January, April & August). These sessions will provide the opportunity for participants to learn about an aspect of personal development, to develop insights within a supportive group, and to apply learnings to their own experience. In particular, participants will:

✓ Connect with peers within a supportive group and have the opportunity to 'buddy up' outside sessions, thereby reducing feelings of isolation and promoting the sense that others face very similar challenges to them.

 \checkmark Gain clarity on their strengths and key areas for development and learn how to use these insights to ensure they are more effective in their role.

 \checkmark Develop a range of self-compassion perspectives and practices that will enhance their sense of wellbeing and therefore their ability to perform at their best more consistently.

 \checkmark Learn to communicate more effectively and to promote enhanced working relationships amongst their teams.

 \checkmark Reduce 'overwhelm' and create a balanced approach to their lives.

 \checkmark Develop the courage to bring out their best for the benefit of themselves, others, and their organisations.

Saying goodbye to 2023

Every December for the last 10 years I've had the privilege of guest lecturing to MSc students at Surrey University where I get to talk about what I love – my job at CAfS. It gives me an opportunity to reflect on and present what we've achieved over the last year and our future plans, as well as some of the challenges. And I'd like to share some of those thoughts with you here too.

We've had many highs this year - winning funding to support our delivery of energy efficiency advice to low income households, growing our <u>Solar Made Easy</u> and <u>Retrofit Made Easy</u> programmes, delivering numerous events and training courses, steering the progress of the <u>Zero Carbon Cumbria Partnership</u>, dispersing grant funding to community groups. We've worked in partnership with numerous key organisations in Cumbria, including Cumbria Tourism, the National Trust, Cumbria Chamber of Commerce, and Britain's Energy Coast Business Cluster. Our work with <u>community sustainability groups</u> whose volunteers are taking - and demanding - action on climate change have been a constant source of inspiration to us. We've said hello and goodbye to teammates and won a crop of awards. It's been a busy year...

News Update

As we approach the end of 2023, the NAVCA staff team have been looking back at our highlights from the year. We're sharing them with you in this blog post, including some exciting funding news and what we're looking forward to next year.

Developing Quality Accreditation

We launched the LIQA (Local Infrastructure Quality Accreditation) in April, enabling our members to further explore and demonstrate their local impact. We also awarded 22 organisations the VCQA (Volunteer Centre Quality Accreditation). Alongside this, we continued to develop and improve the accreditation process, including the launch of a new submissions portal to make things easier for applicants.

Demonstrating the value of local infrastructure

We held a roundtable event in May, where we had policy makers government and sector funders discussing – and agreeing – on the value that local infrastructure delivers for the VCSE sector. We're looking forward to continuing to develop this work in 2024.

Collaborating with members

We continued to run our Anti-Racist Group, exploring interesting and challenging topics together. We also set up a Climate Network in response to member feedback, where we will explore the role of local infrastructure in tackling the climate emergency. In both of these networks, we have developed a programme of events for 2024.

The manager is responsible for a team comprising of an Advanced Practitioner, 5 Fostering social workers, a Family Finder, a Family Support Worker and Commissioning Assistant and all the human resource consequences of this. The Team works closely with external commissioning services and all children's service professionals and providers in supporting carers in caring for children. Fostering panel and the IRO service offer governance of decisions made within the service.

It is important that the team is compliant with Fostering Standards, Statutory Guidances and the policies of Cumberland and Westmorland and Furniss Councils. Carers live in both areas although we provide a single service, however this post needs to engage with support services in both councils which can be challenging.

This team provides home finding through the central team and Family Finder who provides a specialist service for children seeking long term care. This this service must be available during all working hours and the manager will need to contribute to the day to day working of the team at times. Working out of hours can be required when emergency placements are required.
