Young people who have been identified as needing further support through the positive role model programme will work together within their school to create a social action project with the support of their positive role models.

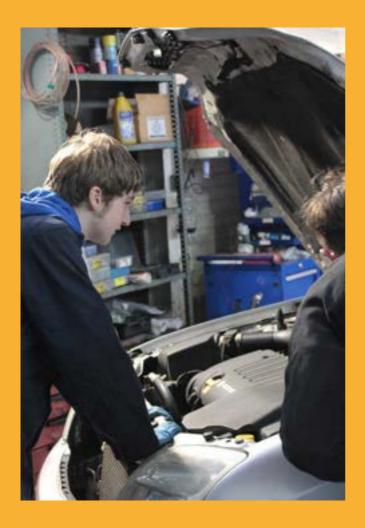
What is this project?

DREAMSCHEME PROJECT

WHAT IS THE DREAMSCHEME PROJECT?

Grants of up to £400 are available to all schools and youth groups in Cumbria for social action projects that involve young people, It enables them them to participate in community based activity, learning and achieving self-development, enterprise skills and offering accredited learning.

Projects must include young people. Projects must provide a community benefit.

Up to £400 is available for each Dreamscheme project.

Dreamscheme's combination of volunteering, social action and enterprise skills and accreditation is a unique opportunity for young people to participate in community based activity, learning and achieving self-development for themselves and their team

UNIVERSITY OF CUMBRIA

Youth Worker Degree Apprenticeship

The University of Cumbria are exploring the feasibility of the Level 6 Integrated Youth Worker Degree Apprenticeship, to establish an understanding of what employers and potential apprentices would want from a programme, alongside trying to establish the demand for this in the sector and the capacity that the sector has, to support its delivery.

The Level 6 Integrated Youth Worker Degree Apprenticeship requires that organisations employ apprentices for at least 30 hours per week for the 3 year duration of the apprenticeship.

FIBRUS COMMUNITY FUND CUMBRIA

Grant awarding

The Fibrus Community Fund Cumbria was established by Fibrus in 2023. The Fund is aimed at addressing digital poverty and exists to support the work of communities in particular areas of Cumbria, to provide access to digital technology for the most vulnerable. Fibrus recognise that the most vulnerable in our community can sometimes get left behind when it comes to accessing modern technology, something most of us take for granted. Having the ability to access the internet can open a range of opportunities for individuals and communities especially when it comes to education, employment, and socialising. The Fund will offer technology grants to enable people to stay connected, whether it is young people staying connected to online resources for school, or elderly people ordering groceries and video calling family.

Grants for community groups and organisations in the eligible areas below to provide access to digital technology for the most vulnerable in their community, with a particular focus on older people (aged 60 years and older) and young people (aged 18 years and under)



DISABILITY RIGHTS UK

Campaigners call on Government to provide more financial support to Disabled people

The next government <u>disability cost of living payment</u> is again £150 and will be paid to around six million people in summer 2023. Many people who are eligible for the £150 payment will also be eligible for a £900 cost-of-living payment, which is going out to people on certain meanstested benefits, including <u>Universal Credit</u>.

Rachel Curtis, a full-time carer to her daughter Betsy raised her petition – entitled 'Provide an energy grant to people with a disability or serious medical condition' alongside another by Disabled student Abigail Broomfield, which was entitled 'Make people on disability benefits eligible for the £650 one off payment'.

Disability Rights UK, and Inclusion London met with <u>Marsha De Cordova MP</u>, a member of the Petitions Committee who led the debate, to brief her on the current financial situation for Disabled people, explaining that poverty is increasing in the Disabled community while energy and food prices continue to rise and benefits remain low.

Although debates are only usually granted when petitions reach 100,000 signatures or more, Ms De Cordova asked to open a debate on the issue stating that the Petitions Committee had launched an additional survey on cost-of-living payments where 10,854 people had responded.

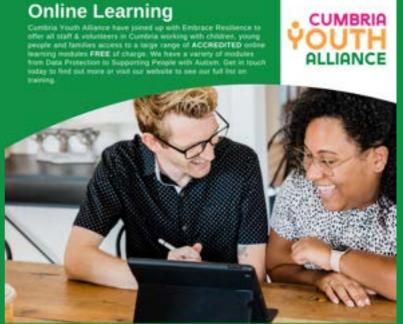

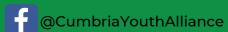




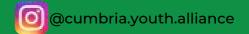
