
What is this project?

To raise awareness of the Fellfoot Forward area's fantastic night skies, the North Pennines AONB Partnership through the Fellfoot Forward Landscape Partnership Scheme is creating a roundhouse which will offer visitors a space to rest, reflect and look up. Volunteers aged 18+ are invited to apply for a series of three day workshops at which volunteers will learn traditional green wood working skills, using traditional coppicing tools, making the hazel panels which are part of the pavilion build. Whitehaven, Egremont & District Credit Union were newly formed in April 2010 as the result of a merger between Whitehaven Credit Union, and Egremont & District Credit Union.

The two credit unions were set up to address the issue of financial exclusion, which a lot of low income families and individuals suffer from. They also needed to address the problem of the high cost of borrowing money (from banks or doorstep lenders etc.) and to encourage regular saving. The aim was effectively to establish a community-run business, which would actively encourage members to add to their savings whilst at the same time would give them access to low cost affordable loans Junior savers schemes were also set up to encourage saving at a young age, which would hopefully break the cycle of reliance on doorstep lending – which has become a pattern in many families. The two credit unions have now merged are still working to further fulfil these aims.

DISABILITY RIGHTS

Throughout 2022, many changes affected the way that the benefit system operates in the shadow of the coronavirus pandemic. The ways that benefits can be claimed are changing, as are the responsibilities that you must meet to keep getting paid.

The cost of living crisis has put more pressure on a social security system already battered by over a decade of cuts. Keeping up with the changing rules is more crucial than ever.
