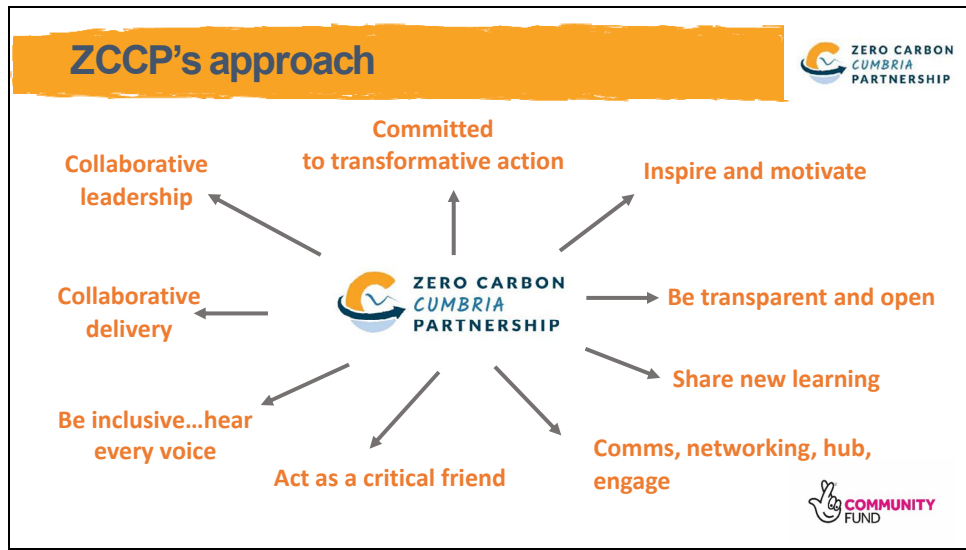

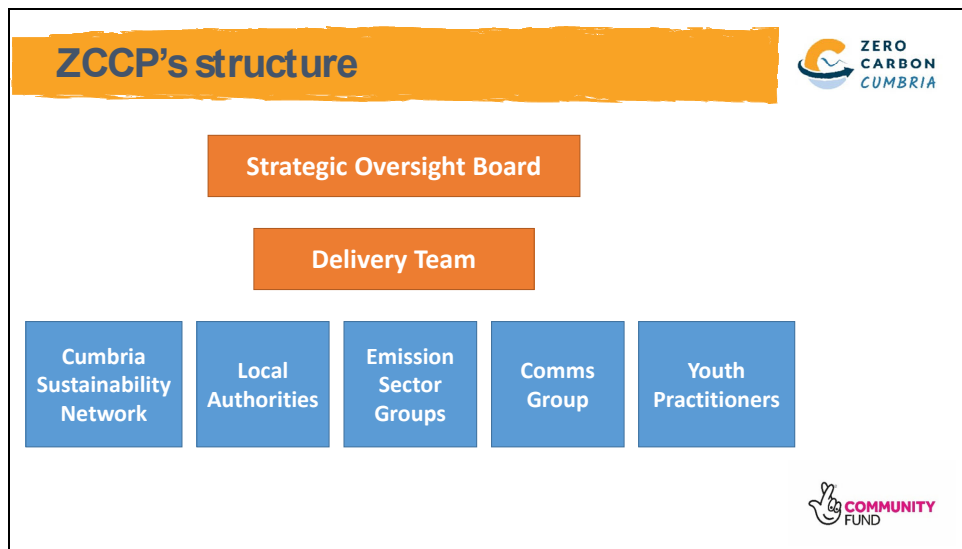


- Plan & oversee a radical programme of action to reduce emissions & enable Cumbria get to carbon neutral by 2037

- Support climate action that ensures that any transaction is fair and just

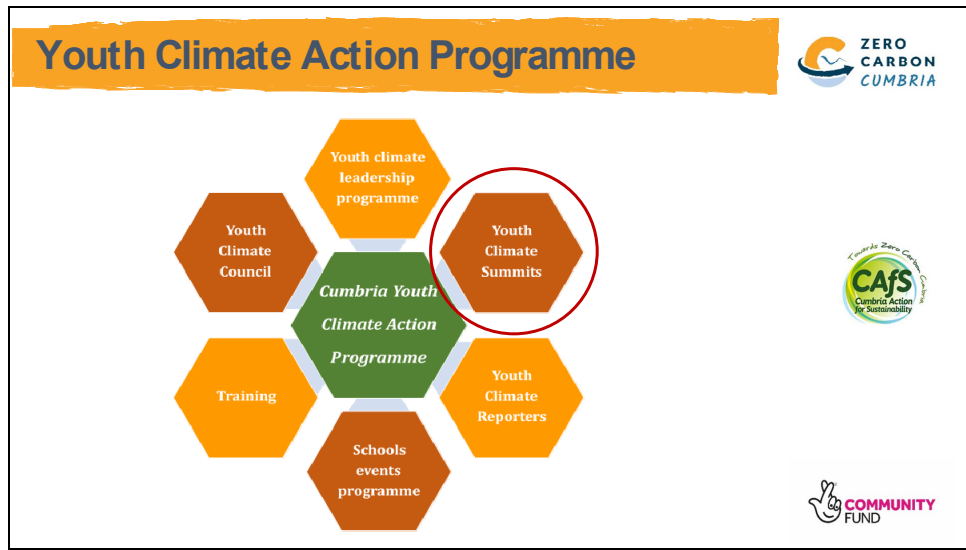
