1. CALL TO ORDER

PW called the meeting to order at 10:00 AM

2. ROLL CALL

3. AGENDA & ORDER OF BUSINESS

 PW asked for a motion to accept the agenda. JM moved to approve; seconded by SE and approved unanimously.

4. MEETING MINUTES

 PW asked for a motion to approve the May minutes; SE moved to approve them; seconded by SW and approved unanimously.

5. PUBLIC COMMENT

Cathé Fish made a public announcement that the County Defensible Space Inspector department
 (DSI) will accept chipping requests or green dump bins if you live on a private road. EDJ agreed that
 the county has left over CAL FIRE storm relief funds still available for private roads until March 15th,
 2026.

6. AGENCY/PARTNER REPORTS.

• EDJ stated that Truckee Fire Dept has completed their CWPP and she has signed it as the authorized representative of FSC.

7. REPORT OF THE FINANCE COMMITTEE - Susan Williams

- SW reported that we have been reimbursed for 4 out of 6 quarters of our ERC (Employee Retention Credit) payments. Still waiting for 2 quarters of payments. One of them had a signature issue that has been corrected, and we are hopeful of seeing those funds soon. We have protested the denial of the other quarter and are hopeful of getting that approved. We believe that we meet the criteria for approval because we canceled a fundraising event due to COVID.
- EDD we have entered into a payment agreement with them.
- Audit update no current updates. We are still waiting for the DA's office to return the documents needed to complete the audits.

8. REPORT OF THE CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD - Pete Williams

 PW asked SE about the status on the CWDG grant. SE has been in contact with the Forest Service, and we should hear back in the next 2 – 3 weeks. SE mentioned that the next round of applications

- PW reported that the DSAV new form is a work in progress and is still being tried out. Residents seem to like the new process, as some visits can take up to 3 hours.
- FSC continues to support local events, the next one being the Alta Sierra ASPOA Green Waste event on September 2nd and 3rd 2025.

9. REPORT FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR - Jamie Jones

- EDJ reported that not a lot has changed; we currently are still functioning with one person in administration. Shannon is our only paid employee and everyone else is working in a volunteer capacity.
- Green Waste, Chipping and Firewood administrative tasks we have not been able to close out those grants due to documents that have yet to be returned from the DA's office. They are due April 30, 2026.
- Grant updates: We have changed our FEMA project invoice cycle from quarterly to monthly.
 Reimbursements from Cal-OES have been delayed and they have been provided with all documentation requested. The Home Hardening Retrofit timeline has been extended and we currently have 119 applications with a cap of 150 and \$30,000 per applicant. We have applied for a timeline extension and budget modification for the Deer Creek Shaded Fuel Break project; we are still waiting to hear back from Cal OES.
- Tri-Counties Bank update: EDJ reported that we have not received updated balances for the vehicles
 that have been auctioned off. They did update a reduced liability with the courts, which indicates the
 vehicles have been sold. This was provided by the court. To date we still are not receiving
 communications from Tri-counties or their legal firm.
- Grant applications: We submitted two Wildfire Prevention grants in July offered by CAL FIRE. The
 first is for the Deer Creek Extension project, phase 2. This funding will connect the current Deer
 Creek project and ponderosa phase 2 project. The second grant is a green waste, and chipping
 program.
- EDJ reported that since the BRIC grant was discontinued and has been broken into smaller grants, she is working on HMGP funding which is likely to be largely focused on Southern California due to the L.A. fires. We will only seek 1 of 3 of the grants in partnership with the City of Grass Valley for home hardening, defensible space and hazard tree removal, programs which we have successfully run in the past. The decision was made to submit a very competitive grant, rather than 3 separate ones. The other 2 programs will be held over for another funding opportunity.
- The Firewise USA Regional Coordinator role will stay with Fire Safe Council as the auto assigned organization in the portal. NFPA (National Fire Protection Association) has recognized that only 1 auto assigned regional coordinator is needed at this time. Both organizations, Fire Safe Nevada County Coalition and Fire Safe Council need to work together to better serve our community. Communities who wish for additional help from the FSNCC may add them as an additional coordinator to their individual communities. But they may not replace FSC.
- EDJ stated that PW has been in communication with Cal OES about the status of the Access and Functional Needs (AFN) program which has 750 applicants and \$12 million dollars' worth of work that still needs to be completed.

SE stated that in the next round of the CWDG grants, he is getting together a proposal for fire
hydrant installations around the county. NID and other entities will be included in the future plans.
