The Rev. Justin Nixon

ROCHESTER, N. Y., July 11 (AP)—The Rev. Justin Wroe Nixon, seventy-two, professor emeritus of Christian theology and ethics at Colgate-Rochester Divinity School, died today at his home.

Dr. Nixon organized the Judson Memorial Church in Minneapolis, Minn., and served as pastor there in the early 1900s. He also served as pastor of the Evangelical Church in Istanbul, Turkey, and the Brick Presbyterian Church, Rochester. He retired in 1954 from the Colgate-Rochester Divinity School after twenty-five years of teaching there.
