were fortunate in being able to get
private nurses for him.

He is still in the oxygen
tent and will be until Saturday.
He is very cheerful and seems
reconciled, although at first he
was very apprehensive.

I am engaging a room
in a country inn in Peterboro
for the month of September when he
will be in the hospital and the
doctors want him to stay in
Peterboro all of October. We have
made no plans beyond that.

Mira knows a furnished apart-
ment we can get in Bronsville
for the winter, but the doctors may
suggest warmer weather for
him. That can wait.

I will keep you posted and
send you my address when I
get home.
