As a member of Hythe & Dibden Cricket Club you are expected to abide by the following junior code of conduct:

- Be yourself and welcome others
- Play within the rules and respect officials and their decisions.
- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants regardless of gender, ability, cultural background or religion.
- Try your best and have fun
- Listen to your coach
- Please do not wander off or leave without telling a member of staff
- Speak out if you feel worried – reach out to someone you trust
- Keep to agreed timings for training and competitions or inform your coach or team manager if they are going to be late.
- Wear suitable kit – *Shorts/trousers and t-shirts and 'box'. Pads and Helmets can be provided by the club* – for training and match sessions, as agreed with the coach/team manager.
- Pay any fees for training or events promptly.
- You must not smoke on club premises or whilst representing the club at competitions.
- You are not allowed to consume alcohol or drugs of any kind on the club premises or whilst representing the club.
