### Medical Emergency Action Plan April 2025

The English Cricket Board (ECB) recommends that Clubs produce a Medical Emergency Action Plan identifying locations of local A&E units and defibrillators, as well as identifying the appropriate procedures to follow in the event of a medical emergency.

This document is to be used in conjunction with the CM 01 which has more information and can be found on the clubs website and in the changing rooms.

### What is the access route for an ambulance / paramedics?

<b>To your clubhouse:</b>	Combination padlock gate and post which needs to be open to allow access onto the ground.  Can access on foot from 2 entrances on Jones Lane or 1 entrance from West Street
<b>To your pitch:</b>	Combination padlock gate and post which needs to be open to allow access onto the ground.  Can access on foot from 2 entrances on Jones Lane or 1 entrance from West Street
<b>What is required to entrance:</b>	Combination code is 6969

### Guidelines for dealing with incident / accident

- Stay calm but act swiftly and observe the situation. Is there danger of further injuries?
- Listen to what the injured person is saying.
- Alert the qualified First Aider who should take appropriate action for minor injuries.
- In the event of an injury requiring specialist treatment, call the emergency services – **999**.
- The telephone number for NHS Direct is: **111**
- Deal with the rest of the group and ensure that they are adequately supervised and safe.
- Do not move someone with major injuries. Wait for the emergency Services.
- Contact the injured person's parent / carer / guardian.
- Complete an Incident / Accident Report Form.
- Complete the accident book and give it to Dawn Bowman or Ian Prentice. Accident book is kept in the wall mounted cupboard by the sink behind the bar in the main club house.
