VILLAGE OF PEMBERVILLE COUNCIL MEETING November 5, 2024

Mayor Bailey opened the November 5, 2024, Council meeting at 7:00pm with a prayer and the pledge of allegiance.

Roll Call: Present at the scheduled meeting of the Council were Rahe, Angel, Kirkbride, Mazur, Rollins, and Titkemeier. Others present were Chief Vaughn, Eric Campbell, Solicitor Robert Kuhlman, Gene Steele, and the Clerk.

Minutes: Titkemeier moved, and Kirkbride seconded to approve the minutes from the October 15, 2024, meeting. Motion passed 5/6 vote. Titkemeier-yes; Kirkbride-yes; Angel-yes; Rahe-yes; Rollins-abstain; Mazur-yes.

Treasurer's Report: Rahe moved, and Angel seconded to approve the bills in the amount of \$4,107.74. Motion passed unanimously.

Mayor stated that leaf collection is underway. Mayor stated as a reminder that it takes the guys a week to get from one side of town to the other and will repeat until all leaves are collected.

Mayor stated there is a new company out of Bowling Green that will be hanging the lights for Christmas in the Village and the lighted Christmas parade, November 30^{th,} and December 1st.

Mayor stated that currently West Erie Reality is working on obtaining easements for the Bridge St bridge replacement. Mayor thanked members of Council for distributing the flyers for the Income Tax Levy.

Rahe:

<u>Tree Committee:</u> Kirkbride stated the Tree Committee is meeting on November 11th at 7:00pm and will be discussing Village keys and having access to the sewer plant to retrieve the water truck to water trees. Kirkbride stated that they will be planting 10 trees along the trail for the fall planting.

Park and Rec: No report

Rollins: Absent

<u>Personnel Committee</u>: Rollins stated that the personnel committee has met on two separate occasions to work on evaluations and merit pay raises.

<u>Finance Committee:</u> Rollins stated the Finance Committee met and discussed the budget forms and working towards permanent appropriations. Rollins stated that the committee is beginning to look at health insurance information for 2025. Rollins stated that she will be putting out some information to the employees reminding them of comp-time payout and vacation use by year end.

<u>Records and Retention Committee:</u> Rollins stated that committee will be meeting on Friday to continue to sort through more boxes.

Titkemeier:

<u>Planning Commission</u>: Titkemeier stated that the Planning Commission met on October 16th and discussed Bethlehem parsonage that has been sold and the parcel split has been approved by the Planning Commission and signed by Dave Meismer. Titkemeier stated that Mayor Bailey will have an Ordinance drawn up regarding Pember Grove to lower the Performance Guarantee for Sidewalks. Titkemeier stated there was also discussion regarding the progress of the Forks Restaurant, the water tower to be constructed sometime in December, and the issue with the roads in Pember Grove after it rains.

<u>BPA:</u> Titkemeier stated that BPA met and discussed the replacement of cables on the bucket truck that need replaced every four years and the option of looking for a new truck. Titkemeier stated that they discussed Nathan getting a bid on logging out trees at Kahler Rd. woods to prepare for 3 water wells. Titkemeier stated they also discussed the cost of 2 new hydrants. Titkemeier stated there was discussion regarding the dual meter pits and causing low water flow. There was discussion about the installation of the new generator located at the Scout cabin.

Eric Campbell: Campbell stated that there will be a new updated zoning map available on the website soon.

Gene Steele volunteered to provide the materials needed to fix the shed at the pool. Steele stated that the metal doors are always blowing open.
