Re: **Heather Edhouse** (deceased) – Date of Death: 11th September 2025

Following notification of this member's death, details of the benefits payable are set out below:

1. Lump sum death benefit

- As the deceased member died in active service after normal pension date (NPD), there is a lump sum death benefit (LSDB) payable of £55,425.78 (equal to 5 years' pension payments, assuming the deceased member retired at the date of death but capped to the deceased member's 75th birthday)
- The LSDB is payable to persons at the Trustees' discretion (and so confirmation is required of the beneficiaries to be paid and, if there is more than one beneficiary, confirmation is required of the amount to be paid to each beneficiary)
- The LSDB is within the deceased member's available Lump Sum & Death Benefit Allowance (LS&DBA) of £962,294.77

2. Spouse's pension

- A spouse's pension of £6,786.83 per annum is payable

3. Payment of pension

- The spouse's pension is payable in monthly instalments in advance
- The pension will start on 1st October 2025
- The pension will be paid for life and will be subject to PAYE

4. Pension increases

- The spouse's pension in payment will be increased each year on 1st April by the lower of the rise in the retail prices index and 5.0%

5. Details required

Before the spouse's pension can be put into payment, the following will be required:

- The member's original death certificate
- The member and spouse's original marriage certificate
- The spouse's original birth certificate
- The completed bank details form for the spouse (*form attached*)
