1. Lump sum death benefit

- As the deceased member died in active service before normal pension date, a lump sum death benefit (LSDB) is payable of £248,204.42 (comprising the life assurance benefit of £245,970.00 and a refund of the deceased member's transferred-in contributions of £2,234.42)
- The LSDB is payable to persons at the Trustees' discretion (and so confirmation is required of the beneficiaries to be paid and, if there is more than one beneficiary, confirmation is required of the amount to be paid to each beneficiary)
- The LSDB is within the deceased member's available Lump Sum & Death Benefit Allowance (LS&DBA) of £1,073,100.00

2. Child dependant's pension

• A child dependant's pension is payable of £11,249.79 per annum (which includes an element comprising the deceased member's transferred-in pension)

3. Payment of pension

- The child dependant's pension is payable in monthly instalments in advance
- The pension will start on 1st October 2025
