

About Rotory

Our Founder - Paul Harris

Paul Harris set up his law practice in Chicago and formulated his plan for a club for businessmen that would promote friendship and fellowship. With three good friends, he formed the first club in 1905 and named it Rotary because its members met in rotation in their places of work. Memberships grew rapidly and when Paul Harris became the club's third president he strove to extend Rotary to other cities.

In 1911, at the second convention held in Portland, Oregon, USA, Rotarian Arthur Sheldon stated: "The Science of Business is the Science of Service". "He Profits Most Who Serves Best". Thus the early concept of "co-operation in business" gave way to the larger concept of service to others.



There were two further stages that evolved. One was an additional motto, "Service Above Self". The other was the acceptance of one object of Rotary, one word, SRVICE, through four main avenues of activities:

- The development of fellowship
- The maintenance of high ethical standards in business and professions
- The promotion of community-betterment
- The advancement of international understanding

About Rotary International and District 3310

Rotary is a global network of 1.4 million neighbors, friends, leaders, and problem-solvers who see a world where people unite and take action to create lasting change across the globe, in our communities, and in ourselves. Solving real problems takes real commitment and vision.

Rotary International is an international service organization whose purpose is to bring together business and professional leaders united in humanitarian services, advocate high ethical standards in all vocations, and to advance goodwill and peace around the world.

District 3310 comprises of Brunei, Singapore and parts of Malaysia (Johor, Malacca, Sarawak, Labuan FT and Sabah). We have a total of 71 Rotary clubs in the District. There are 2 clubs in Brunei, 23 clubs in Singapore, 3 clubs in Malacca, 11 clubs in Sarawak, 13 clubs in Sabah and 19 clubs in Johor.

The oldest club in our District is the Rotary Club of Singapore (chartered on 11th August 1930) closely followed by the Rotary Club of Malacca (chartered on 1st September 1930). With very few exceptions all Rotary Clubs conduct their meetings in English. A few clubs in our District are bi-lingual (Mandarin/English or Malay/English).

4 Way Test

From the earliest days of the organization, Rotarians were concerned with promoting high ethical standards in their professional lives.

One of the world's most widely printed and quoted statements of business ethics is The 4-Way Test, which was created in 1932 by RI Past President Herbert J. Taylor when he was asked to take charge of a company that was facing bankruptcy. This 24-word code of ethics for employees to follow in their business and professional lives became the guide for sales,

production, advertising, and all relations with dealers and customers, and the survival of the company.

Adopted by Rotary in 1943, the 4-Way Test asks the following four questions: "Of the things we think, say or do:

- 1. Is it the truth?
- 2. Is it fair to all concerned?
- 3. Will it build goodwill and better friendship?
- 4. Will it be beneficial to all?

Own History by PP Vincent Chen



RC Raffles City was chartered in 1980 with 32 members led by CP Low Siew Joon. We were sponsored by RC Singapore under then Pres Philbert Chin and PP Leow Jwee Meng as a project to commemorate their 50th anniversary and the 75th anniversary of Rotary International. We are honoured that PDG Philbert Chin remains an honorary member and close friend of our Club and a regular visitor.





We originally proposed the name Rotary Club of Raffles, but it was turned down as Rotary clubs had to be named after geographical locations, not prominent people, beautiful flowers or commendable values. Still wanting the association with Stamford Raffles, we settled on the alternative of Raffles City which was at that time a huge hole in the ground and yet to be developed into the iconic commercial complex that it is today! Our Rotary banner proudly features the statue of Stamford Raffles superimposed on City Hall and the map of Singapore. We were part of District 330 which at that time comprised almost 100 clubs in Thailand, Malaysia, Singapore and Brunei. With the expansion of Rotary and the division of District 330 into more districts, we are now in District 3310 which is made up of Rotary Clubs in Singapore, Melaka, Johor, Sabah and Sarawak.

In those days the members of a club had to work or live in a geographically demarcated territory. In our case it was essentially the central business district and consequently our membership has always included a good number of lawyers and professionals in the financial sector. Our membership has been maintained at around 50 over the years – a good size that allows for diversity, socializing and adequate resources to undertake projects. Today we are fortunate to still have three charter members with us in CP Low Siew Joon, PP Vincent Chen and Rtn Lim Hua Min.

Originally an all-male Rotary club, in 2000 we admitted our first lady member, Corina Lai. In 2014 she became our first lady president. Today ladies make up about 20% of our membership.

In our first nine years, we held our weekly Tuesday lunch meetings at the Raffles Hotel and we were duly pampered as the General Manager, Roberto Pregarz, was also our charter member and one of our early presidents. Since then, we have had different venues, including the Compass Rose @ Westin Stamford which had the distinction of being the highest Rotary Club meeting venue in the world. We now meet twice a month at the historic Singapore Cricket Club, our home since 2007.

Our club is known for our great fellowship over food, drinks and golf, including dinner gatherings to celebrate Christmas, Chinese New Year and Deepavali. We also enjoy good fellowship with our six sister clubs which include visits in conjunction with club installations and at other times.

We have been supportive of our Rotary District with active participation in district conferences and assemblies and with our members holding district offices. We have also been supportive of Rotary Foundation – most of our members are PHFs and we boast of three Major Donors.



We have also been active in service to the new generation, and currently have the Interact Club of Tampines Meridian Junior College and the Rotaract Clubs of Raffles City and Ngee An Polytechnic under our wing. They have been our regular and helpful partners in many of our projects and activities.

Local Community Service Projects

Like most Rotary clubs we conduct a major project each year and over the years we have supported many charities and worthy causes. The larger fund raisers included \$200,000 in 2008 under Pres Murugiah Rajaram for DAS, and \$200,000 in 2010 under Pres David KT Lee for DAS and Straits Times Pocket Money Fund. To celebrate our 40th anniversary in 2020/21, our Club under Pres Nelson Ng successfully held a gala dinner to raise \$500,000 (incl. a matching grant) for Club Rainbow – an incredible effort in the midst of the Covid-19 pandemic.

Our greatest achievement is the Dyslexia Association of Singapore ("DAS"). It began as a community service project in 1990 led by Dr Jimmy Daruwalla under Pres George Abraham to raise awareness of dyslexia. This led to the founding of DAS in 1991 which for many years grew under the dynamic leadership of the late PP Dr Daruwalla. Today DAS is a large non-profit organization operating 12 learning centres providing educational and support services to 3,200 dyslexic children and others who have difficulty in reading, writing and spelling. To this day, several of our Rotarians are still involved in the leadership of DAS and we have also regularly raised funds for DAS.

Another charity that RCRC has founded is Crohn's & Colitis Society of Singapore. Modest in scale compared to DAS, it caters to people afflicted with inflammatory bowel disease. It was started by PP Nidhi Swarup in 2012 and RCRC is actively involved by contributing leadership and financial resources.

One project of note was the construction of an elevator for the old Red Cross Home for the Disabled at Hillcrest which allowed the residents on the second and third floor wards – many wheelchair-bound – to go down to the ground level to enjoy the garden. It was a 3-year project culminating in the commissioning of the elevator in 1998 and it involved not only fund raising but also the provision of professional architectural and engineering services by two of our members.

A tradition of RCRC is the annual visits to Homes together with our Rotaractors and Interactors – Red Cross Home for the Disabled at Christmas time, Sunlove Home at Chinese New Year, Jamiyah Home at Hari Raya and Thong Kheng Seniors Activity Centre. These were unfortunately disrupted during the three years of the Covid-19 pandemic.

In 1999 we organized a charity film night with "Stepmom" to raise funds for Assisi Home; since then, we have conducted many movie fund raisers which can be considered a signature project of our club. Another is the annual career talks that we hold at Tampines Meridian Junior College. RCRC has also consistently supported the Foundation of Rotary Clubs in Singapore.

International Service Projects

In the 4-decade history of RCRC, we have been involved in many overseas projects, sometimes in conjunction with our sister clubs. A cross section of the projects are presented below.

We are particularly pleased with the half a dozen medical & dental missions to rural villages in Sabah that we have conducted together with our sister club, RC Luyang. They were popular adventures with our doctors, our dentist PP TC Phua, and other members too. On each mission, we attended to hundreds of local villagers and often also distributed used clothing to them. These were also occasions for great fellowship between members of our two clubs.

Another joint project was the funding of houses in the Philippines under the Gawad Kalinga programme which we did through our sister club, RC Makati North.

Khao Lak, a coastal town two hours' drive north of Phuket in Thailand, had been devastated by the 2004 tsunami and many had lost their homes. Some French Rotary clubs had responded by building a cluster of 80 wooden houses on stilts at Pru Teow, forming a Rotary Village. However, there were some defects that prevented the dwellings from being fully inhabitable. In 2006, at a relatively low cost and with the participation of the Rotaract Club of Ngee An Poly, we fixed the defects and rehabilitated the houses.

We did another project in Thailand in 2007/2008, again spearheaded by PP Ronald Pereira and PP Brian Tan. We rebuilt the Ban Pha Mon Primary School in a Hmong village near Chiangmai for \$\$30,000 and provided another \$\$6,000 for furniture, books and uniforms. We also involved our Interactors and Rotaractors who went there to "teach" the children and to experience community service overseas.

In 2018, PP George Abraham led us in a project in India for Navjeevan Centre. This is a school community operated by the Mar Thoma Church for daughters of sex workers in Mumbai to give

them an education and a better future. We contributed \$\$20,000 in a joint project with RC Kalyan to fund a small reservoir to alleviate their chronic water shortage problem in the dry season. We also donated a much-needed transport vehicle at the cost of another \$\$20,000.

In 2023, we joined RC Katingang Cubao in a project to perform cleft lip operations for children in the Philippines. As the International Sponsor in this Global Grant project, we played a major role in raising the US\$40,000 funding for the project. Funding has been approved and the project is in progress.

We also embarked on a project to provide vocational training for at-risk girls in Siem Reap, Cambodia – an ambitious project led by PP Brian Tan of our Club and to be undertaken in partnership with RC Phnom Penh Chatamok. The aim is to equip the girls with knowledge to start and manage a small business, basic hospitality management and first aid skills. We are still in process of applying for Global Grant for this project.

A Few More Thoughts

The Rotary motto is "Service Above Self" and the projects cited above are ample evidence that we have strived to serve the needy and the less fortunate, both in our local community and overseas. Yet, even as we seek to benefit others, we ourselves have also benefited greatly. In serving others, we have learnt to be more compassionate and have derived great joy in helping others and sharing with them. Rotary has also provided us the opportunity to enjoy fellowship, make steadfast friends, broaden our horizons and achieve better international understanding.

In the last 40 plus years, many have passed through the portals of the RC Raffles City and contributed toward the success of our Club. We should acknowledge with thanks all their contributions – each in his or her own way. We also want to acknowledge our Rotary spouses and family members whose participation and support have also been vital to our work and fellowship.

Global Grant Project

This vehicle will have 2 beds & 1 couch, blood storage facility, air conditioning & built-in generator. It is a unique concept to reach out to donors in suburban & rural areas who have difficulty coming to a blood bank to donate blood,

and youth who are too busy at work/study. The beneficiaries are patients, accident victims, maternity related haemorrhage cases etc. This mobile unit will be attached to a local partner hospital with a blood bank.

Funding for the project has already been disbursed by TRF, the vehicle has been purchased and is under conversion & outfitting. We expect the vehicle to be ready for operation & blood collection by September 2025




