Very shortly much of the country will go crazy celebrating Valentine's Day.

Many people will declare their love to the object of their affection; either face to face, by phone, with flowers, or even anonymously. Whether or not we join in, I suspect we could all give an opinion of what love is – or what love should be. In the following letter, Maria had obviously worked it out: "Dear Jimmy," she writes, "No words could ever express the great unhappiness I've felt since breaking off our engagement. Please say you'll take me back. No one can ever take your place in my heart, so please forgive me. I love you so much, my heart is breaking. Yours forever, Maria. PS: Congratulations on winning the lottery!"

Cupboard love, as my grandma used to say. She only wants him for what she can get out of him. Call it what you will, it isn't real love. Real love is a costly business, and can be painful too, even when all is going well.

During the 17th century, Oliver Cromwell, Lord Protector of England, sentenced a soldier to be shot for his crimes. The execution was to take place at the ringing of the evening curfew bell. However, that evening, the curfew bell didn't ring; there was no sound. The soldier's fiancée had climbed up into the bell tower and clung on to the great clapper of the bell to prevent it from striking. When she was summoned by Cromwell to account for her actions, she wept as she showed him her bruised and bleeding hands and body. Cromwell's heart was touched, and he said, "Your fiancé shall live because of your love. Curfew shall not ring tonight!"

That is real love – sacrificial love. That woman could have died through her actions, but she was desperate to save the man she loved and would have done anything to help him.

And that is exactly how God loves each and every one of us – whoever we are. In fact he loves us so much, he allowed his only Son, Jesus Christ, to be brutally murdered to demonstrate his love for us. Of course, Christ's death isn't the end of the story, there would be no point to it if that's all there is; it wouldn't make any sense. Once, again, this Easter Day (April 20th), we will be celebrating with great joy and love, the fact that Jesus was raised up from the dead. He defeated death, in order to give us a new fullness of life – in fact, eternal life, with him.

The build up to Easter begins on Ash Wednesday (5th March this year). The weeks of Lent give us space to stop and step aside from our frantic busyness; to remind ourselves of what I believe is the greatest story in the world's history. We can take time to re-read the story, to stop and remind ourselves of the many blessings that we have received from God. we can try to change the way we live so that we might demonstrate that love to others. We can really begin to understand what sacrificial love means and hopefully, we can reflect that same love in our day to day lives – not just at Easter when it comes, but every day.

Residents are reminded that they now have to book a slot to take rubbish to the Norwich North recycling centre. This can be done on line at https://www.norfolk.gov.uk/article/62757/Norwich-North-Recycling-Centre-and-Reuse-Shop

The Council still has access to some funding as a result of the development off Manor Road and they continue to evaluate future projects.

Following the two storms in December, the Parish Council dealt with fallen trees at Newton Street and Swan Plain. At the December meeting, members considered future predicted expenditure and set the level of the Parish Precept for 2025/26 at £33,000.

Several allotment plots have become vacant but a considerable amount of rubbish clearance is required and will be carried out by the Council. Those on the waiting list will be contacted shortly.

The telephone kiosk on Norwich Road is redundant due to low usage and the phone service is to be removed. The Parish Council are considering "adopting" this kiosk although there are no firm plans for it's future use at the moment.

Three vacancies remain on the Council which has powers to co-opt. Any resident who may wish to be considered should contact the Clerk for an informal discussion on what is involved.

I was happy to report in the last journal, that our three Table Tennis teams SFC A, B, and C in Divisions 1,2, and 3 were all placed near the top of each Division.in the Norwich and District Table Tennis League.

We are still riding high with SFC A, in 3rd place and B lying in first place, and the C team currently in 5th spot. We all have 9 or 10 matches to play by Easter, so we must all do our best to retain these high positions, which are much better than last season, so far.

Captain Ben Briggs is constantly reviewing team selections whilst dogged by injuries and winter coughs and colds, so we are all doing our best to support his arrangements. We have only needed to postpone a couple of matches to date. Each team has three players for each meeting, which consists of each player competing for 3 matches of the best of 5 sets. So nine games played so far. One doubles 5 setter completes the evening to produce a final score. Win with 10/9/or 8 games gives a maximum 4 points to nil. Win with 6 or 7 games shares the points 3-1, and a 5-5 draw shares the points, 2 each. We like to fulfil each fixture with a full team, despite the ability to reduce by 1 player and forfeiting their 3 matches. That is not really an option, having to start an evening 3 nil down, so in almost all cases, rearranged fixtures are preferred!

Our Dereham and District League has our team still one from the base of Division 1, so they will do well to recover a few mor points in the remaining 7 matches scheduled. This League has a completely different scoring system, which I will not confuse you with !



The red telephone box is a telephone kiosk for a public telephone designed by Sir Giles Gilbert Scott, the architect responsible for Liverpool Cathedral.

The telephone box is a familiar sight on the streets of the United Kingdom, its associated Crown Dependencies, British Overseas Territories and Malta.

Despite a reduction in their numbers in recent years, the traditional British red telephone kiosk can still be seen in many places throughout the UK, and in current or former British colonies around the world. The colour red was chosen to make them easy to spot.

From 1926 onwards, the fascias of the kiosks were emblazoned with a prominent crown, representing the British government. The red phone box is often seen as a British cultural icon throughout the world.

In 2006, the K2 telephone box was voted one of Britain's top 10 design icons, which included the Mini, Supermarine Spitfire, London tube map, World Wide Web, Concorde and the AEC Routemaster bus.

In 2009, the K2 was selected by the Royal Mail for their "British Design Classics" commemorative postage stamp issue.

Many of the phone box designs are protected by trade mark registrations and copyright, held by British Telecommunications plc.

In 2019, the prototype K2, located at Burlington House in London since 1924, was listed to Grade II in "recognition of its iconic design status".

As mentioned in the Parish Council news the telephone box on Norwich Road in Horsham St Faith is being withdrawn from service but may be "adopted" for an alternative use.

Success stories in other parts of the country include installing a defibilator which seems to be the most popular re-use but there are already two in the village one at The Surgery and another at St Faiths Centre.

Other uses by other places are a local museum of village iife, a book library, a toy library, art galleries, book exchanges, exhibition spaces, information centres, mini greenhouse, community food bank and even a pub!
