




- Barclays bollards issue to be resolved

Underground Bins



What is it?

- Common throughout Europe in urban areas
- Liverpool and Cambridge have developed similar schemes
- Allows for large volume of waste to be collected in single visits






Using them

- Above ground system will have fob/card/app access to open the hopper
- Place waste or recycling into relevant above ground hopper and close the chute, waste drops into the below ground chamber
- Access control system will ensure only registered users can use the bins



Emptying the bins

- Emptied with specialist collection vehicle
- Requires hi-ab crane system on the vehicle
- Chamber lifted out of the ground and emptied over the top of the collection vehicle





Why use them?

- Limited options for waste collections along Fargate
- Removes the need for bins or sacks to be placed out overnight
- Reduces the number of vehicle movements for waste collections
- Will ensure users meet the requirements of the Environment Bill/Simpler Recycling
- Single point of contact for all waste services



Prices – the all important part

- Service will be priced to ensure that its highly competitive we want everyone to use this scheme
- The priority is a good service not profit but we can't operate at a loss
- Prices are being worked up currently and market tested to ensure they are sound
- We expect to be able to save all users money on their current arrangements
- Pricing will be based on a model of the user's operation what waste they would be expected to produce, it won't be a per bag or per fob scan charge
