From Vandalism to Vibrancy

An update from Sheffield BID May 2025



Since we launched our campaign in November 2024, over 465 jobs have been logged. The majority of these incidents have been reported through the local authority's crime app.

'A job' can take several hours (or days) to remove multiple tags spanning significant areas.


73% of reports have been addressed including the clean up of 20+ hot spots blighting our city centre!



Working with Crimestoppers to ...





54% of the current graffiti identified is thought to be linked to **5 prolific** taggers with one of these individuals responsible for over 17% of the vandalism (although their monikers may be shared). 97% of graffiti can be attributed to no more than 29 taggers in total!

We are advocating for support measures that **hold offenders accountable**, including financial restitution for damages. Cllr Ben Miskell recently joined us in supporting our efforts, bringing additional visibility and advocacy to our campaign



New laser technology is a step closer

Partnering with a Sheffield-based technology company, pilot cleaning of test sites is underway using state-of-the-art laser technology. This eco-friendly, cost-efficient, and highly precise method reduces chemical waste, lowers maintenance costs, and enhances operator and public safety. If successful, this initiative will be a significant advancement in our field.
