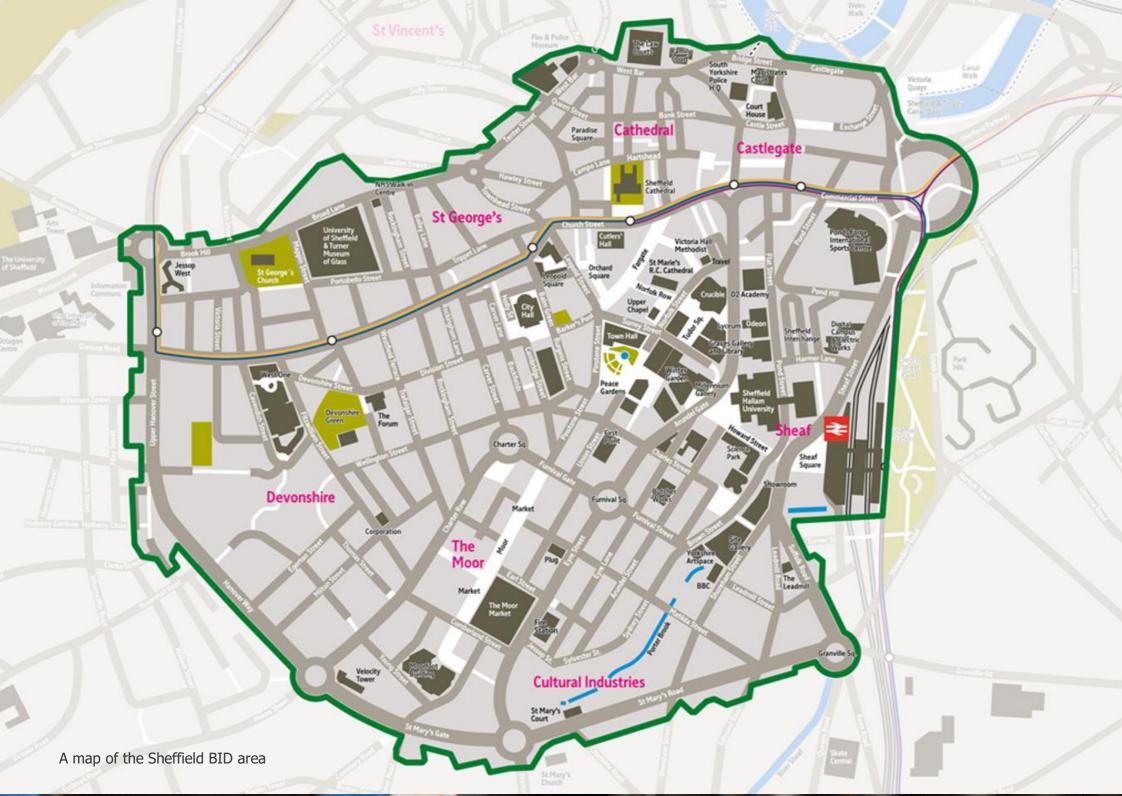

May 2025





Key retail metrics

- In May 2025, monthly retail sales in Sheffield were £21.8m. Year-to-Date (YTD) sales were £96.0m.
- Compared to May 2024, monthly sales increased by +10.2% while YTD sales increased by +4.3%.
- The increase in monthly sales was due to an increase of +11.5% in customer numbers and a decrease of -1.1% in average revenue per customer (ARPC).

Sales growth

Sheffield city centre v. comparator areas

- Monthly sales change between May 2024 and May 2025 in Sheffield (+10.2%) is higher than Leeds (-1.6%), Manchester (-5.6%) and Nottingham (-2.3%).
- YTD sales change between May 2024 and May 2025 in Sheffield (+4.3%) is higher than Nottingham (-2.7%), Leeds (-4.0%) and Manchester (-3.6%).

Sector sales - overview

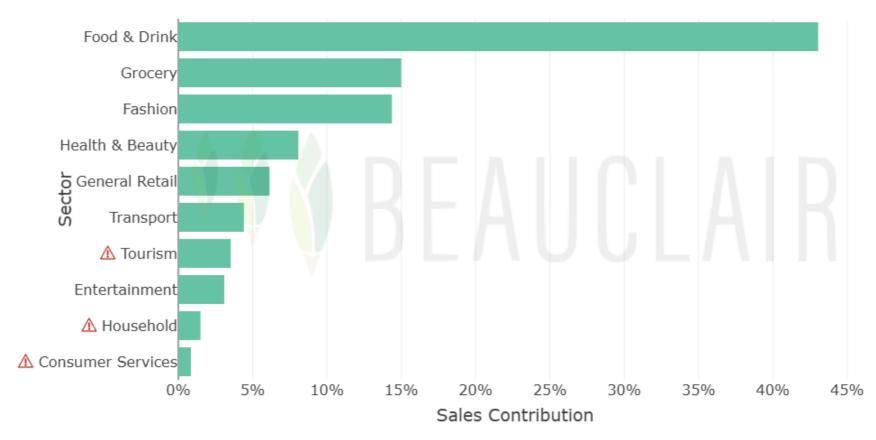
- The five sectors with the highest monthly sales are Food & Drink (£9.37m), Grocery (£3.26m), Fashion (£3.13m), Health & Beauty (£1.76m), and General Retail (£1.33m).
- The five sectors with the highest YTD sales are Food & Drink (£38.4m), Grocery (£16.0m), Fashion (£13.7m), Health & Beauty (£8.53m), and General Retail (£5.96m).
- The five sectors showing the largest change in sales between May 2024 and May 2025 are Food & Drink (+£1.62m), Health & Beauty (-£231k), General Retail (+£200k), Fashion (+£189k) and Tourism (+£74.8k).

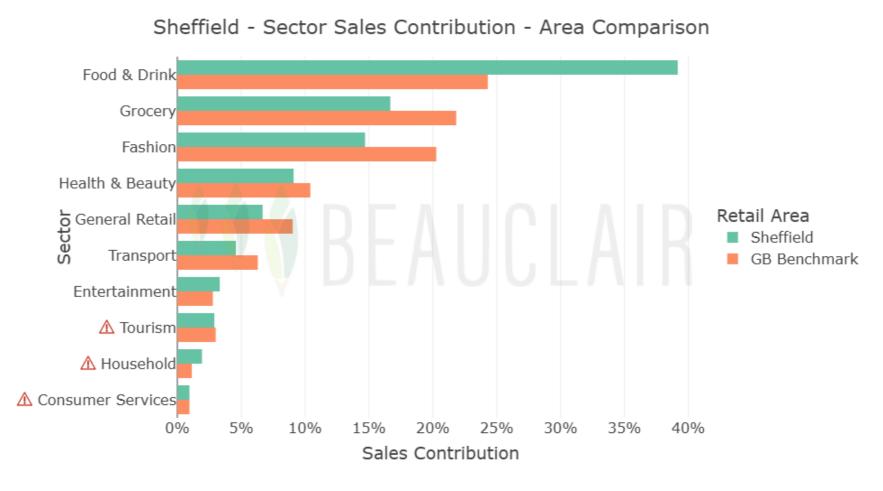

Sheffield - Sector Sales Contribution - May 2025



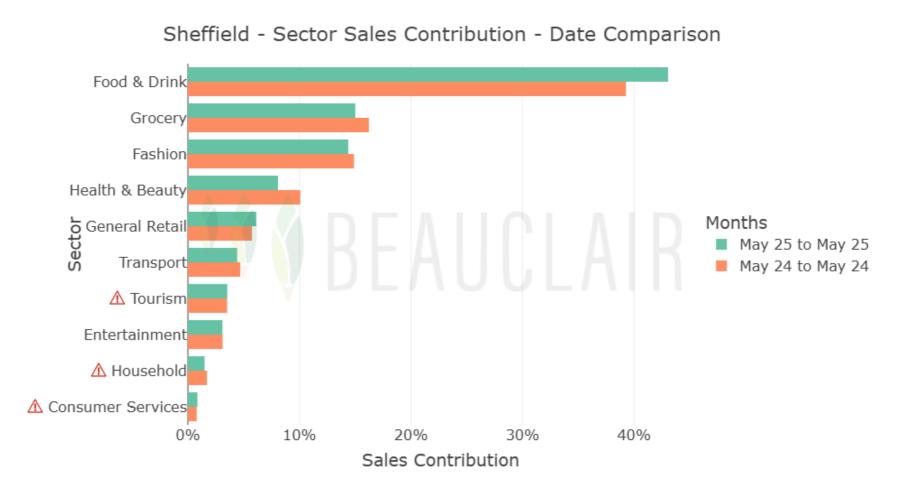

Sector sales – May 2025 v May 2024 (Sheffield city centre)



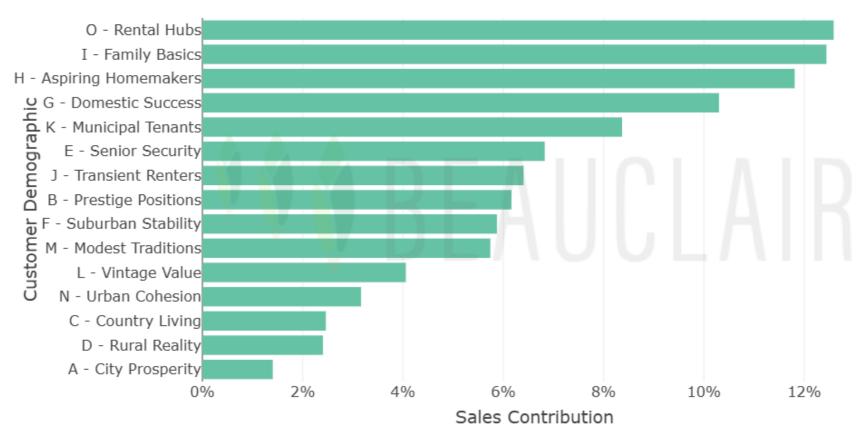

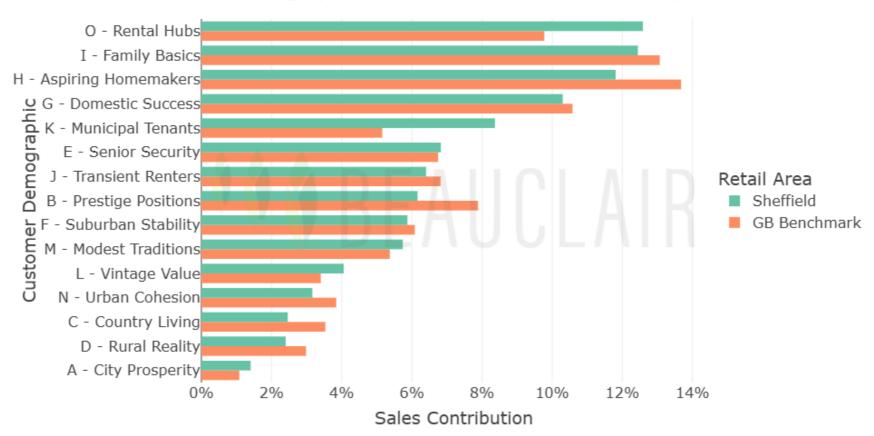
Sheffield - Demographic Sales Contribution - May 2025
