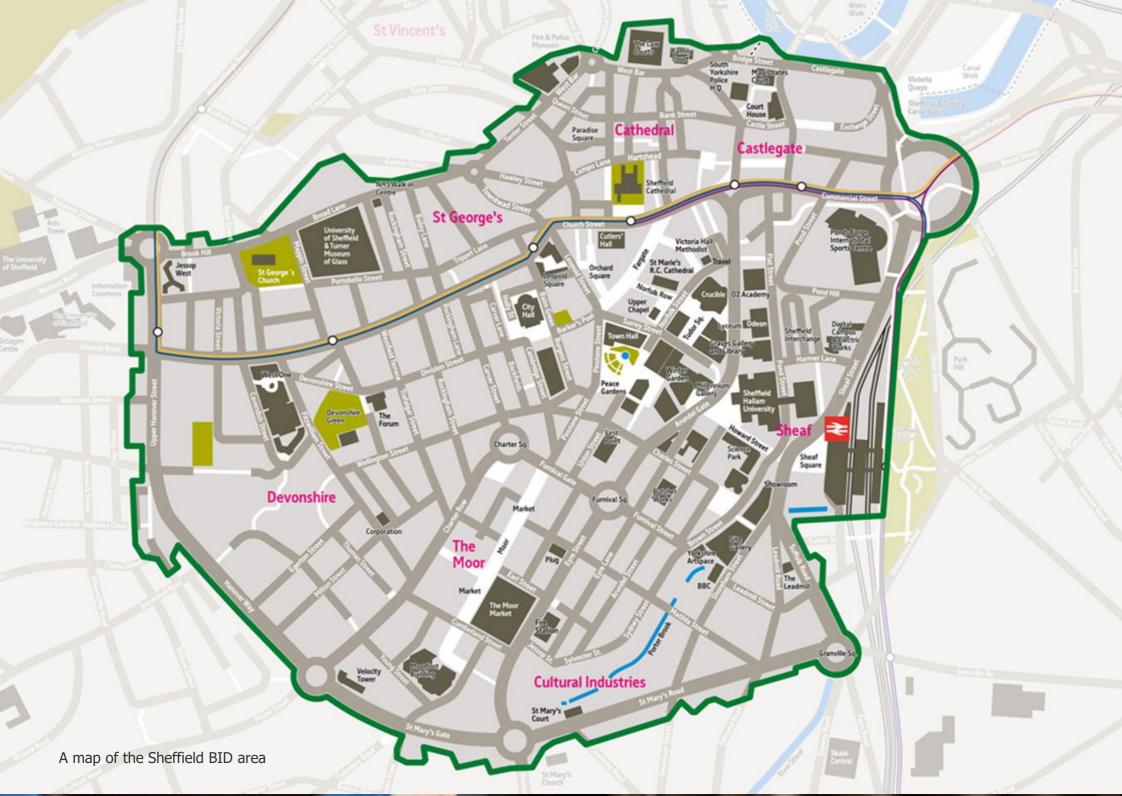

Momentum returns as Sheffield defies national downturn

Year-to-date overview

Sheffield city centre continues to show resilient economic performance in 2025 with year-to-date sales up +0.2% and September spend +3.4% compared to the same month in 2024.

This places Sheffield well ahead of regional and national benchmarks, including:

- Leeds: -9.2% (Sept), -5.5% (YTD)
- Nottingham: -8.6% (Sept), -4.6% (YTD)
- GB Benchmark: -4.1% (Sept), -3.0% (YTD)

Monthly trends

Sheffield recorded five consecutive months of growth from January to May, peaking at +4.3% in May, before a summer slowdown:

Jan-May: Consistent growth (+3.1% to +4.3%)

June: -8.6% (calendar and weather impacts)

July: -1.3% (partial recovery)

August: -6.2% (but still outperforming peers)

September: +3.4% (renewed momentum)

Key retail metrics – September 2025 (Sheffield city centre)

- In September 2025, monthly retail sales in Sheffield were £17.5m. Year-to-Date (YTD) sales were £164m.
- Compared to September 2024, monthly sales increased by +3.4% while YTD sales marginally increased by +0.2%.
- The decrease in monthly sales was due to an increase of +5.8% in average revenue per customer (ARPC) and a decrease of -2.2% in customer numbers.

Sales growth – September 2025

Sheffield city centre v. comparator areas

- Monthly sales change between September 2024 and September 2025 in Sheffield (+3.4%) are higher than Nottingham (-8.6%) and Leeds (-9.2%).
- Year-to-date (YTD) sales between September 2024 and September 2025 (+0.2%) are higher than Nottingham (-4.6%) and Leeds (-5.5%).

The BID Barometer focuses on year-on-year percentage changes in visitor spending trends, not absolute spending volumes.

Sector sales – September 2025 (Sheffield city centre)

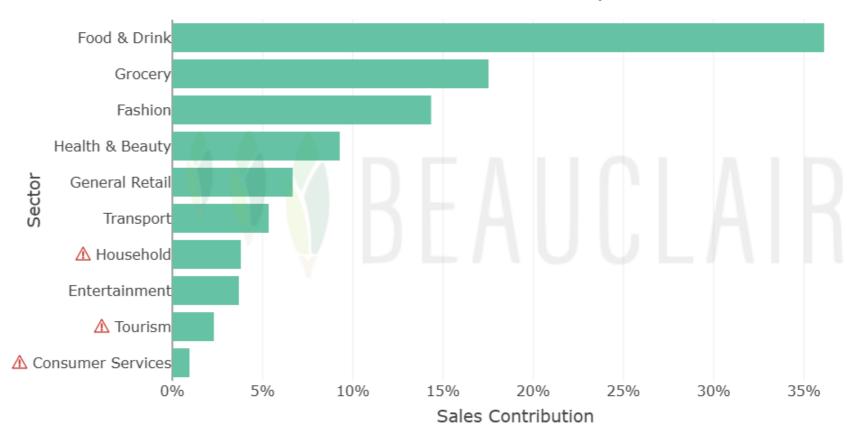
- The five sectors with the highest monthly sales are Food & Drink (£6.31m), Grocery (£3.06m), Fashion (£2.50m), Health & Beauty (£1.62m), and General Retail (£1.16m).
- The five sectors with the highest YTD sales are Food & Drink (£62.4m), Grocery (£28.3m), Fashion (£23.6m), Health & Beauty (£15.6m), and General Retail (£10.7m).
- The five sectors showing the largest change in sales between September 2024 and September 2025 are Household (+£502k), Fashion (+£130k), Food & Drink (-£128k), Transport (+£79.7k), and Entertainment (+£44k).

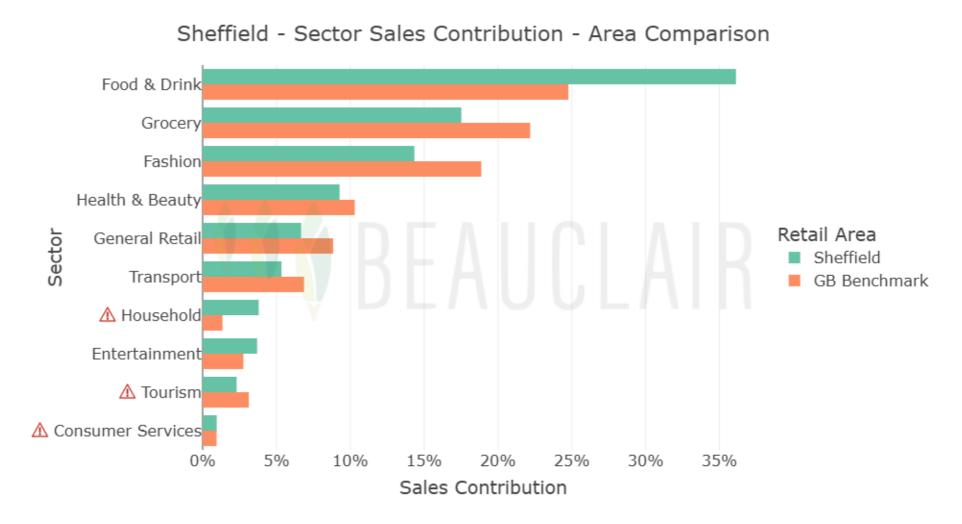
Sector sales – September 2025 (Sheffield city centre)

Sheffield - Sector Sales Contribution - Sep 2025



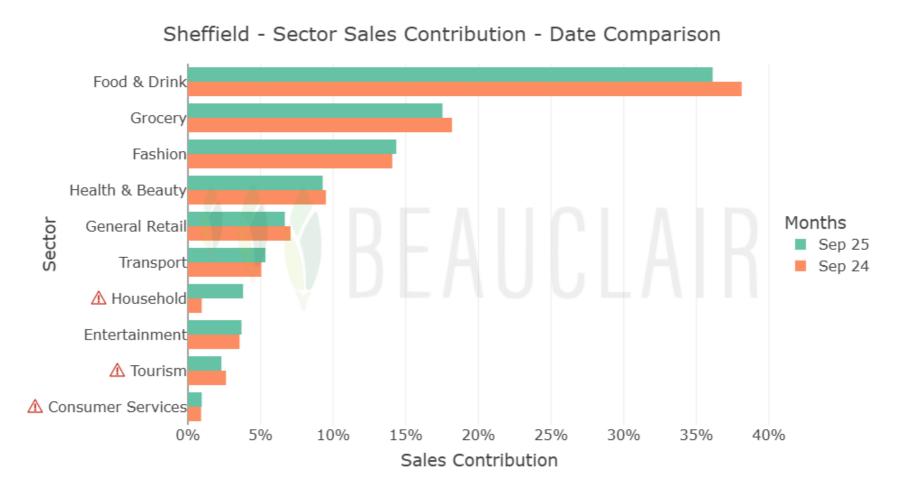

Sector sales – September 2025 (comparison vs GB Benchmark)



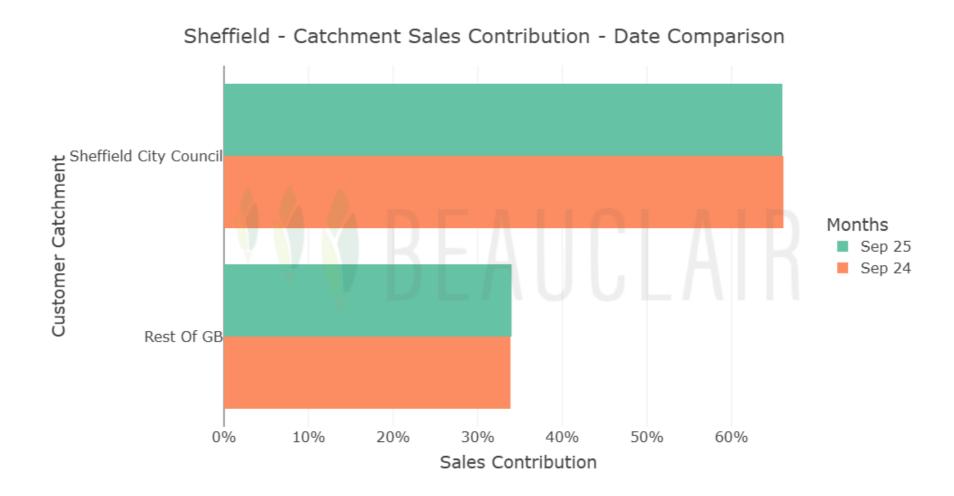
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Sector sales – September 2025 v September 2024 (Sheffield city centre)



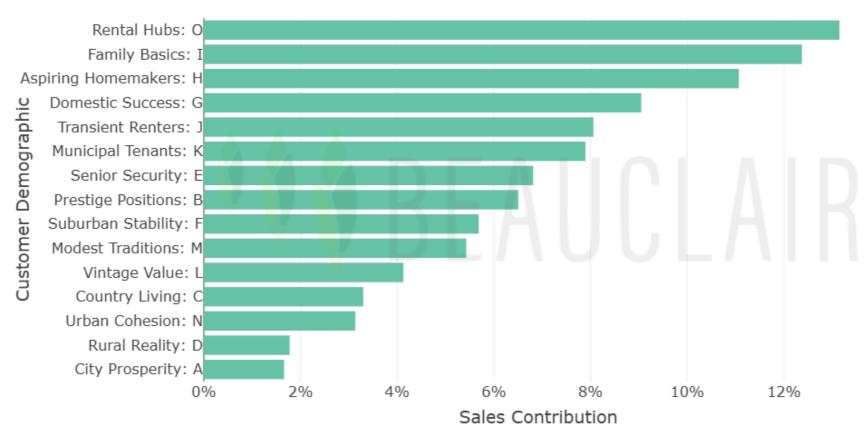
